

Ensure women's participation and leadership in decision-making




Eliminate all harmful practices such as child marriage

Women's empowerment for livestock dev.

Women represent the majority of poor livestock keepers (FAO 2011)

Women have limited control over livestock and farm resources

WHY MEASURE THE EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN IN LIVESTOCK

Why measure empowerment?

Measure women's empowerment to:

- Include it as a goal of interventions

- Show progress of interventions

- Improve approaches to enhance empowerment



Why an empowerment index for livestock?

Measure changes in women's empowerment related to livestock

- If livestock interventions can support women's empowerment
- What livestock activities can support women's empowerment
- What livestock activities in diff. species supports women's empowerment
