

7. Describe military or other events that resulted in your POW status? SEE & about. FOUR OF CREW OF 10 MANAGED TO BAIL OUT, CIVILIANS WERE SHEETING AT WIS ON THE WAY DOWN. ONE HILLED BY THESE GUNSHETS LEAVING ONLY 3 OF 10 ALIVE. CIVILIANS TREATED WS HARSHLY AND PROBEDLY WENCD HAVE KILLED IS BUT SERMAN SOLDIERS ARRIVED AND TOUT WS.

WE WERE PLACED ON REAR OF TRUCH AND POT ON DISPLAY IN BELGRADE FOR A PERIOD, OUR DEAD CREW MEMBER WAS IN TRUCK WITH WS, I SUPPOSE ABOUT TO CIVILIANS AND IO MILITARY WERE ENVOLVED. WE WERE TAHEN TO AN A BIULDING, WERE FUNCTOD SOLITING ROOMS IN BELGRADE OR MEAR BELGRADE

HE SEENED TO BE SMILLED AND MINEW MY COMPLETE BACK-GROUND PRACTICALLY FROM BIRTH WNTIL I WAS SHOT DOWN (SEE ITEMII), THEY WANTED TO TOWOW MY OUT FIT, WHEN WE TOOM OF AND FROM WHERE, ETC. HOWEVER, THEY SEEMED TO MAKE THE ANSWERS ALREADY I WAS THERE ABOUT 24 HRS, THEN ONTO TRAINS TO STALAG ITT IN GERMANY NAD SAGAN.

I FELT THE ALLIES HAD IT WON AND FULLY EXPERTAD IT TO END WITHIN IOR 2 YEARS I KINGU THE LOFTWARK WAS PRACTICALLY DICININATED 24. Did you think you would eventually get home?

GERMANS GAVE POTATOES AND BREAD AND SCUP FARLY ROUTINLY, WEATHER TOLERABLE. WE HAD MANY GUARDS BUT I'M NOT SURE HOW MANY. STACAG II MUST HAVE HAD SEVERAL THOUSAND POW'S
