What are Scholarly Communications?

In 2003, ACRL (the Association of College and Research Libraries) defined scholarly communication as:

"the system through which research and other scholarly writings are created, evaluated for quality, disseminated to the scholarly community, and preserved for future use. The system includes both formal means of communication, such as publication in peer-reviewed journals, and informal channels, such as electronic listservs." Scholarly communication is frequently defined or depicted as a lifecycle documenting the steps involved in the creation, publication, dissemination and discovery of a piece of scholarly research.

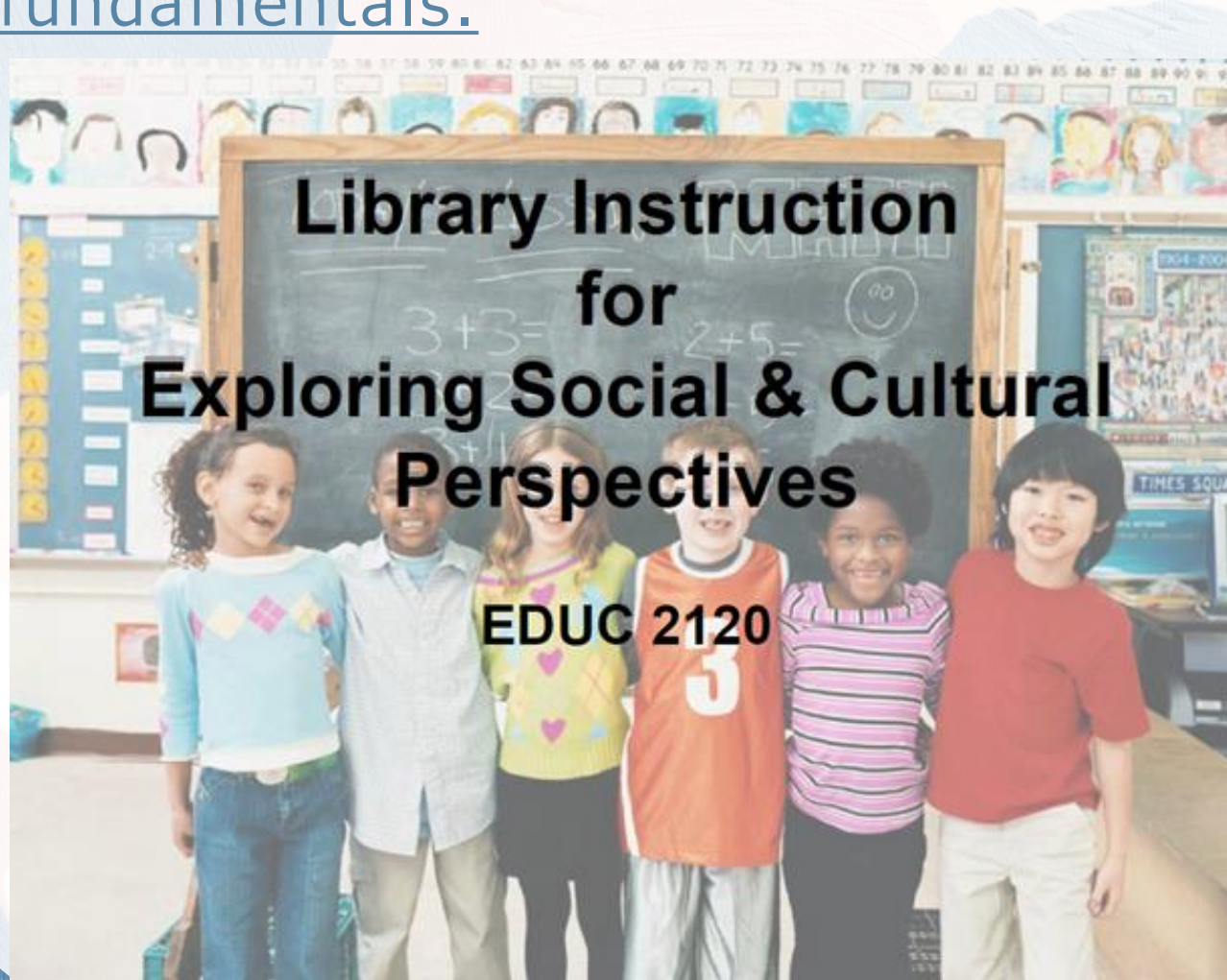

Why Cite?

Failing to cite your sources equates to plagiarism. Plagiarism is a serious thing that is totally, completely, 100% preventable. You just need to give credit where credit is due. - [Quora.com](#)

- Citations ensure that proper credit is given to the original creator
- In-text Citations help distinguish between your own thoughts and those of the original.
- Citing your sources ensures the prevention of plagiarism

Citing Sources

There are several different styles/formats for citing sources in a paper. Your instructor will generally have a preferred style to use in your paper, and will tell you which one he/she is requiring for your assignment. Common citation styles include:

- ASA (American Sociological Association)
- APA (American Psychological Association)
- Chicago/Turabian
- CSE (Council of Science Editors)
- Engineering Styles (ASCE, ASME, IEEE)
- MLA (Modern Language Association)

Note: Properly cited material will contain both an in-text citation (or footnote), as well as the full citation in the references section. An in-text citation is an abbreviated citation immediately following the quotation or paraphrase of the original source. Generally, anything cited in your text must also show up on your reference page and vice versa! [Image Credit]

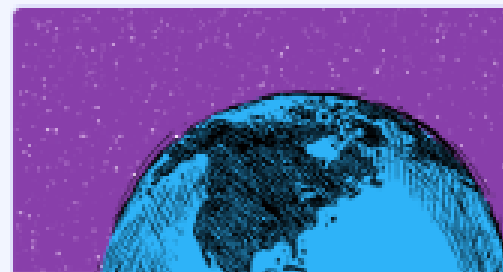

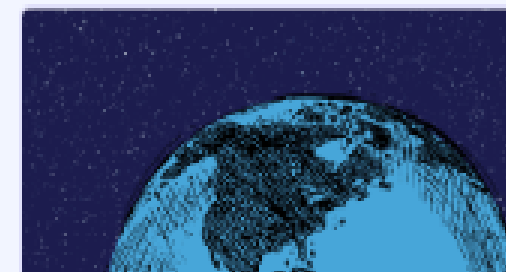

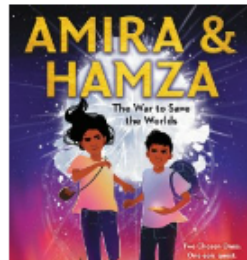
