# Significance

There is a growing interest in providing arts programming for women within and outside prison walls as a tool for rehabilitation and transformation.

This project explores why and how do arts organizations use arts programming to help formerly incarcerated women transition from prison back into society?

### **Goals of Study**

- Provide prison activists, artists interested in prison work, as well as those specifically with an interest in reentry with an opportunity to see what existing programs are available.
- **Increase communication and collaboration** among those individuals and organizations.
- Serve as a catalyst for establishing future models, initiatives, and public attention on this work.
