Message From the Chair

Dear Colleagues,

Last week the Center for Women and Child Health hosted the 3rd International Conference on Nutrition and Early Human Development. The keynote speakers, including Dr. Franceso Branca and Dr. Zulfiqar Bhutta, highlighted the role of nutrition and how unhealthy diets are now the major risk factor for the global burden of disease.

These discussions underscore "lifespan" approaches to disease understanding and mechanisms. Children struggling with malnutrition and stunting are more likely to become unhealthy adults. Many non-communicable diseases find their roots in childhood and are grounded in initial life experiences. South Asians suffer from very high childhood illness rates and also demonstrate advanced disease phenotypes in adulthood such as premature coronary artery disease etc.

Greater research cross-collaboration between Medicine and Pediatrics is necessary to allow lifespan perspectives to our understanding of the florid disease phenotypes that we find in our part of the world and discover ways to mitigate them with early interventions.

I would encourage you all to participate in such conferences in the future. One such conference of particular interest to Medicine and other specialties is the upcoming Cardio-metabolic health themed First Annual Cardiovascular Conference scheduled for early Jan 2020 #pulse2020. These interdisciplinary conferences provide a great learning experience and serve as valuable networking opportunities to ignite collaborations. Zainab

As an invited speaker, Professor Saeed Hamid gave a talk on Chronic hepatitis B and presented WGO guidelines on NASH and NAFLD.




