Biography

Sara R. Massey had a long career in education, including working in administrative, curriculum development and teaching positions in New England, Arizona and Texas. Ms. Massey earned a doctorate degree in humanistic education from the University of Northern Colorado. She edited two books, *Black Cowboys of Texas* and *Texas Women on the Cattle Trails*. She co-edited *Turnof-the-Century Photographs from San Diego, Texas* with Dr. Carolina Castillo Crimm. Her book on Black cowboys won the T.R. Fehrenbach Book Award in 2000 from the Texas Historical Commission.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of Dr. Massey's research on various female figures in Texas and U.S. history, along with photographs and interview transcripts from her project documenting the history of Vietnamese immigrants along the Texas Gulf Coast for the Victoria College/University of Houston-Victoria Library in 2008.
