Dear Colleagues,





Medicine at National and International Forums









The Section of Cardiology, Department of Medicine, at The Aga Khan University, hosted the second annual cardiovascular

conference, **PULSE 2021**, which was held virtually **21st January to 24th January 2021**. This year's theme for the conference was "Gender Matters in Cardiovascular Disease". True to its theme, the virtual cardiovascular conference touched upon a number of issues that stem from gender differences in presentation of the patient, treatment modalities and outcomes.

The conference was co-convened by Dr. Zainab Samad and Dr Osman Faheem. Dr. Saira Bukhari and Dr. Javed Tai cochaired the Scientific Committee. The highlight of inaugural ceremony were talks by Chief guest, Dr. Zafar Mirza, Former State Minister of Health in Pakistan & Former Director Health System of WHO, Dr Alexandra Lansky from Yale University, Dr Jamil Tajik from Mayo Clinic and St. Luke's Medical Center, Dr. Javed Butler from University of Mississippi, and Dr. Khalida Soomro from Scientific Council of Women with Heart Diseases in PCS Pakistan. Dr Lansky informed participants on how to build a successful research career as an Interventional Cardiologist. Dr Tajik talked about our evolving understanding of Mitral valve prolapse syndrome, a condition more often seen in women. Dr Butler updated attendees with the latest in the management of heart failure and Dr Soomro gave her insight on CVD in women in Pakistan. Besides keynote talks, the inaugural event also included speeches by the Dean of the Medical College, Dr Adil Haider and the CEO of the Aga Khan University Hospital, Dr Shahid Shafi.

Many prominent national and International speakers shed light on various cardiovascular topics including imaging, building new programs in cardiology, heart failure, structural heart disease, electrophysiology and interventional cardiology. Drs Saira Bokhari, Osman Faheem, Farhala Baloch, Aamir Hameed and Yawer Saeed expertly moderated these sessions. Hands on practice in Electrophysiology and Intervention workshops that were conducted in-person in CIME was also a major component that gave a unique learning exposure to cardiology practitioners while following strict COVID19 SOPs. The last day was energized through innovative Fellows-in-Training (FIT) Jeopardy Competition between three cardiac training hospitals in Karachi which were, the Aga Khan University, National Institute of Cardiovascular Diseases and Tabba Heart Institute.

The overall conference was well put together with speakers and audience applauding the efforts of the organizers in making this event successful. In-depth- featuring Dr Sadia Masood By Maha Inam

During the era of the pandemic COVID-19, almost all aspects of communication, including education, have undergone a virtual shift. We recently spoke to Dr. Sadia Masood, Assistant Professor and Section Head of Dermatology at the Aga Khan



University Hospital (AKUH), who has a remarkable experience in academia and has dedicated her time and focus towards introducing advanced teaching strategies to innovate education.

After joining, as the first full-time Dermatology faculty at AKUH in 2008, Dr. Masood took up the initiative of revamping the Dermatology section with a keen focus towards academics and training. She played an integral part in the development of the Dermatology residency program, which was established in 2013, and cites the success of her graduating residents as one of her greatest accomplishments thus far. The residency program has progressed exceptionally well, specifically in the quality of teaching, resident training, and professional development.

Dr. Masood completed her Masters in Health Professional Education from AKUH in 2016 and went on to pursue her fellowship from the Foundation for Advancement of International Medical Education and Research (FAIMER, ECFMG) in Philadelphia. She is currently part of a one-year-long distanced learning assessment program at Keel University-UK. She is also actively involved in postgraduate medical education at AKUH and has various positions of leadership with respect to curriculum and examination procedures. She serves as the PGME Committee Chair of the Department of Medicine and Co-Supervisor of Masters in Health Professional Education at AKUH, as well as FCPS Supervisor and Examiner of CPSP.

Speaking about the recent switch to online education, Dr. Masood emphasized on the significance of adopting a blended learning approach to overcome the physical limitations of recent times without compromising on the quality of teaching. Earlier this year, she led two workshops that explored effective techniques for online training, as well as interactive workshops by AKU's Network of Quality, Teaching, and Learning (QTL Net) for conducting online quizzes. She is currently working on a project on simulated and virtual patients which aims to revolutionize hands-on training for the dermatology under and postgraduates students and refine their critical thinking and clinical reasoning skills. During her time at AKUH, Dr. Sadia Masood has successfully transformed the section of Dermatology and her commendable achievements are truly a source of pride for all of us at the Department of Medicine!

What made you pick Medicine as your calling in life? Any experience to be specific.

When I was little, my brother had an unfortunate accident when he fell from the roof of our house. We rushed him to the emergency room. I recall going many times to the hospital with my mother to attend his post-surgery physiotherapy. That incident left a big impression on me. Ever since then, I have wanted to become a doctor.

What are your hobbies/interests?

I enjoy traveling and exploring new countries and locations. I enjoy cooking up experimental dishes in the kitchen and eating out. I also have an interest in water sports.

What made you choose AKU?

When I completed my MBBS, AKUH was in its infancy, and we, fresh graduates, were enthusiastic about joining its ranks. I cleared FCPS 1 and applied for an interview, after which I was selected.

Had you not been a doctor, what would you have done?

I always wished to become a doctor since I was little. It was an inescapable calling, so I would not have done anything else!

What advice would you like to give to your juniors?

In general, I would advise my juniors to be perseverant and work hard to achieve their goals. Concretely, I would advise them to take an interest in research, which is important for building their career and try to publish papers in reputable journals. Additionally, they should strive to excel in a particular field rather than pursuing too many goals, so that the world may recognize them as authorities in their field.

What lessons have you learned from your seniors?

I am blessed to have had good mentors throughout my career who have imparted perseverance and patience in the face of adversity. They have inspired me to convey it forward to my juniors.

What in your opinion is your biggest accomplishment; 1 personal and 1 professional?

My personal accomplishment is my family; my caring wife, and my children who have received a world-class education from reputable institutions, MashaAllah. My professional accomplishment is my presidency at the Pakistan Society for the Study of Liver Diseases (PSSLD). Last month, we hosted a successful conference with 35 leading, international experts who presented their papers.

Tell us about 1 challenge/failure that taught you a lot in life.

Many years ago, we endeavoured to start liver transplants at AKU. I was part of the committee to evaluate its feasibility but we, unfortunately, did not embark on this program. However, I was part of the team that conducted Pakistan's first liver transplant at SIUT.

Any interesting/memorable encounter

As doctors, we are surprised by our patients constantly. In our country of many social taboos, it is amusing and paradoxical to see patients flouting them openly. Recently I met a patient on my rounds who was recovering from acute chronic liver failure. His first question was to ask when he could resume drinking.

Who/what do you draw your inspiration from (your muse if you may) and why?

I am inspired by bright, young residents. When I teach them, I am always struck by their curiosity and feel as if I am learning from them as well.

What are your thoughts about the current pandemic COVID-19?

The pandemic has affected millions of people and resulted in hundreds of thousands of deaths. It is a sad situation. The pandemic provides us an opportunity to reflect on new means of sanitization, socialization, and communication that can help drive our work forward while keeping everyone safe. It has also resulted in a sea-change in our societal customs; for instance with many restaurants resorting to outdoor seating, who would've imagined that Karachiites would be dining out like the Europeans!

What are your future goals?

I have a special interest in Fatty Liver Disease and wish to establish a centre for its study. The goal is to conduct advanced

translational research not conducted anywhere else in the country. Secondly, though a few centres are now performing occasional liver transplants in Karachi, it is not as routine as in few other centres of the country. My wish is to help establish a liver transplant program on a firm footing in Karachi.
