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INTRODUCTION

I am proud to introduce the fifth annual Southwestern Oklahoma State University *Fact Book*. Last year's publication was met with positive review, and I intend to continue this historical record of data. It provides a ready source of information to answer frequently asked questions about the University and its operations.

The *Fact Book* is made up of three sections: (1) general information from both campuses, (2) data from the Weatherford campus, and (3) data from the Sayre campus. When space is available, the *Fact Book* reflects data from a six or seven year period. If information is needed for prior years, please contact my office. However, it is almost impossible to accurately compare data prior to the fall of 1989. This is because the merger with Sayre Junior College began in July 1987, and for two years all university data was compiled for both campuses collectively. Because the two campuses are so unique, it was determined that data should be collected for each campus separately beginning in the fall of 1989.

Unless otherwise noted, the information in this Fact Book came from computer-generated reports that are printed following the tenth class day of each fall semester. Because of student fluctuations during the semester, numbers will not match other published enrollment numbers that may be based on enrollment at the end of a semester. Also, adding Weatherford's and Sayre's campus enrollment numbers will not equal the total student count for Southwestern Oklahoma State University; this is due to the fact that many students are enrolled in interactive video classes, or attend classes at both sites.

This information is public, and hopefully will prove helpful in meeting the general needs of people on this campus. I would like to caution the reader, however, to carefully read footnotes and headings. For example, if one needs to know the number of full-time faculty on campus, please note that the data on page 35 excludes coaches and deans, while the numbers on page 36 exclude faculty on 12-month contracts. The different formats are used because they conform to survey definitions set up by the State Regents or the United States Department of Education. As another example, if an accurate count of departmental majors is wanted, the reader should be aware that departments within the school of arts and sciences play a large role in educating many of the education majors. To illustrate, music and music therapy majors are included with arts and sciences totals, and music education majors are part of the School of Education. If there are any questions about the proper interpretation of *Fact Book* data, please call this office for information.

The reader should also note that student data is only as accurate as the students maintain it. To illustrate, at times major codes are not updated or admission forms contain inaccurate information. The burden lies on the student to inform the university of any changes or modifications; if no communication occurs, the university cannot calculate data that is free from error.

This *Fact Book* was compiled and developed by the Office of Institutional Research. I wish to thank my student employee, Ms. Melissa Smith. I also appreciate the comments and suggestions I received from last year's publication. I hope the reader will find this fifth annual Fact Book helpful, and I again ask for your input to help make future documents more useful.

HISTORY OF SOUTHWESTERN OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY

Southwestern Oklahoma State University, a member of the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, has two campuses. One is located in Weatherford, Oklahoma (60 miles west of Oklahoma City on Interstate 40). The second campus is in Sayre, Oklahoma (60 miles west of Southwestern's Weatherford campus).

The university was established by an act of the Oklahoma Territorial Legislature in 1901 as the Southwestern Normal School. The Normal School was authorized to offer two years of training and four years of preparatory work for students who were not qualified for college admission. The first classes met in 1903.

In 1920 the preparatory, or academy, courses were eliminated and two additional years of college work were added. The state legislature approved a change of name to Southwestern State Teachers College. The first baccalaureate degrees were awarded in May, 1921.

Other major changes in name and purposes occurred in 1939 when the institution was designated as Southwestern State College of Diversified Occupations. In 1941, it became Southwestern Institute of Technology when the college added a School of Pharmacy, degree work in the arts and sciences, and trade schools to its original function as a teacher-training institution.

The Oklahoma State Legislature in 1949 again changed the name, this time to Southwestern State College, without altering the broad scope of its purposes and educational objectives. Since that time there has been full accreditation by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. In addition, the university is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education; the Oklahoma State Board of Education; the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education; the American Chemical Society; the American Medical Association Committee on Allied Health Education and Accreditation, in cooperation with the American Health Information Management Association; the Oklahoma Board of Nurse Registration and Nursing Education; the National Association of Schools of Music; the National Association for Music Therapy; and the National League for Nursing.

In 1953, Southwestern inaugurated an advanced professional program leading to the Master of Teaching degree, now called the Master of Education degree. In addition to the M.Ed. degree in 15 different fields of specialization, Southwestern also offers the M.S. degree in Applied Psychology, the Master of Business Administration degree, and the Master of Music degree.

In 1974, the Oklahoma State Legislature changed the name of the institution to Southwestern Oklahoma State University. On July 1, 1987, by an act of the Oklahoma Legislature, Sayre Junior College was merged with Southwestern Oklahoma State University as a branch campus designated as Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Sayre.

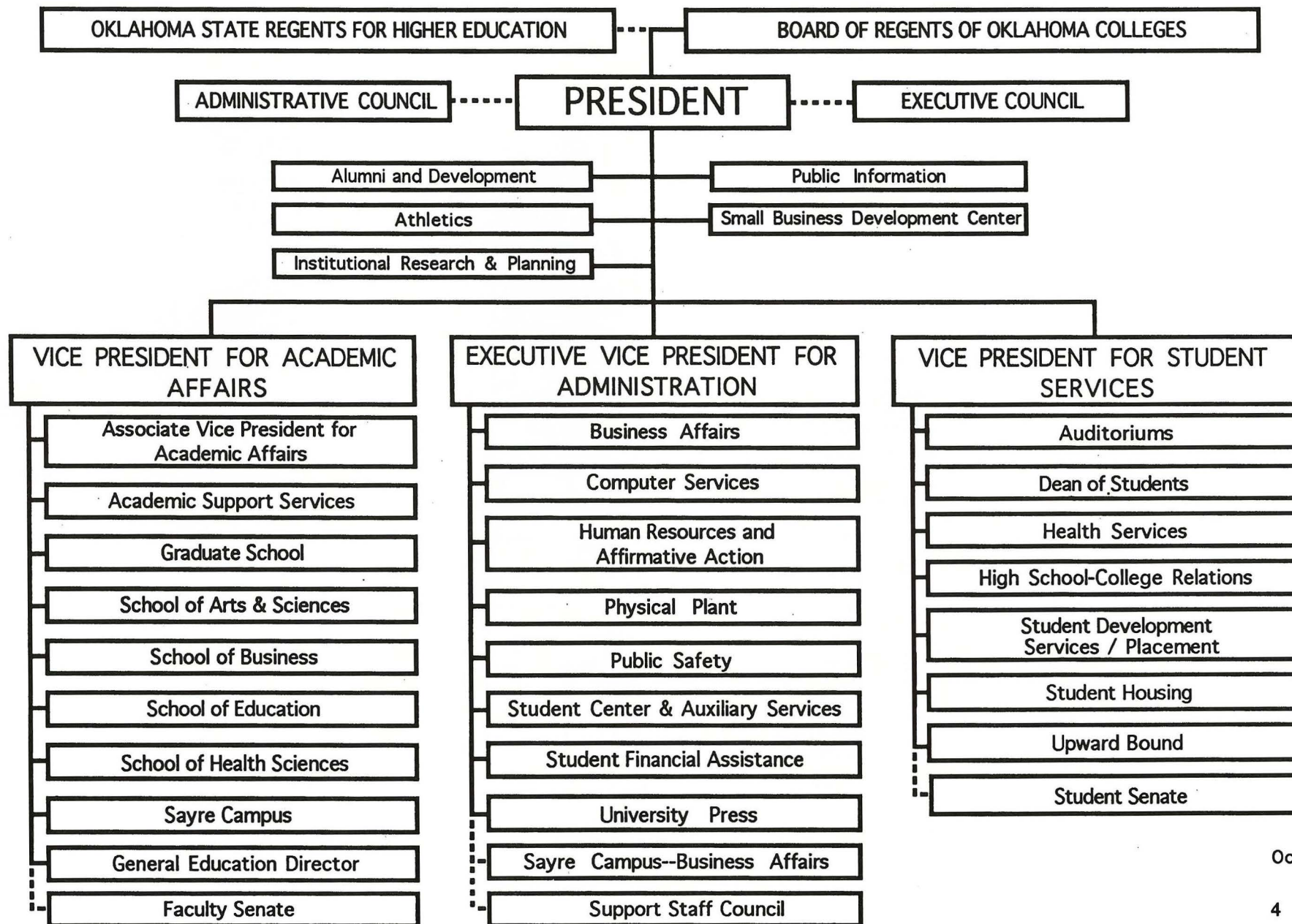

REGENTS OF OKLAHOMA COLLEGES

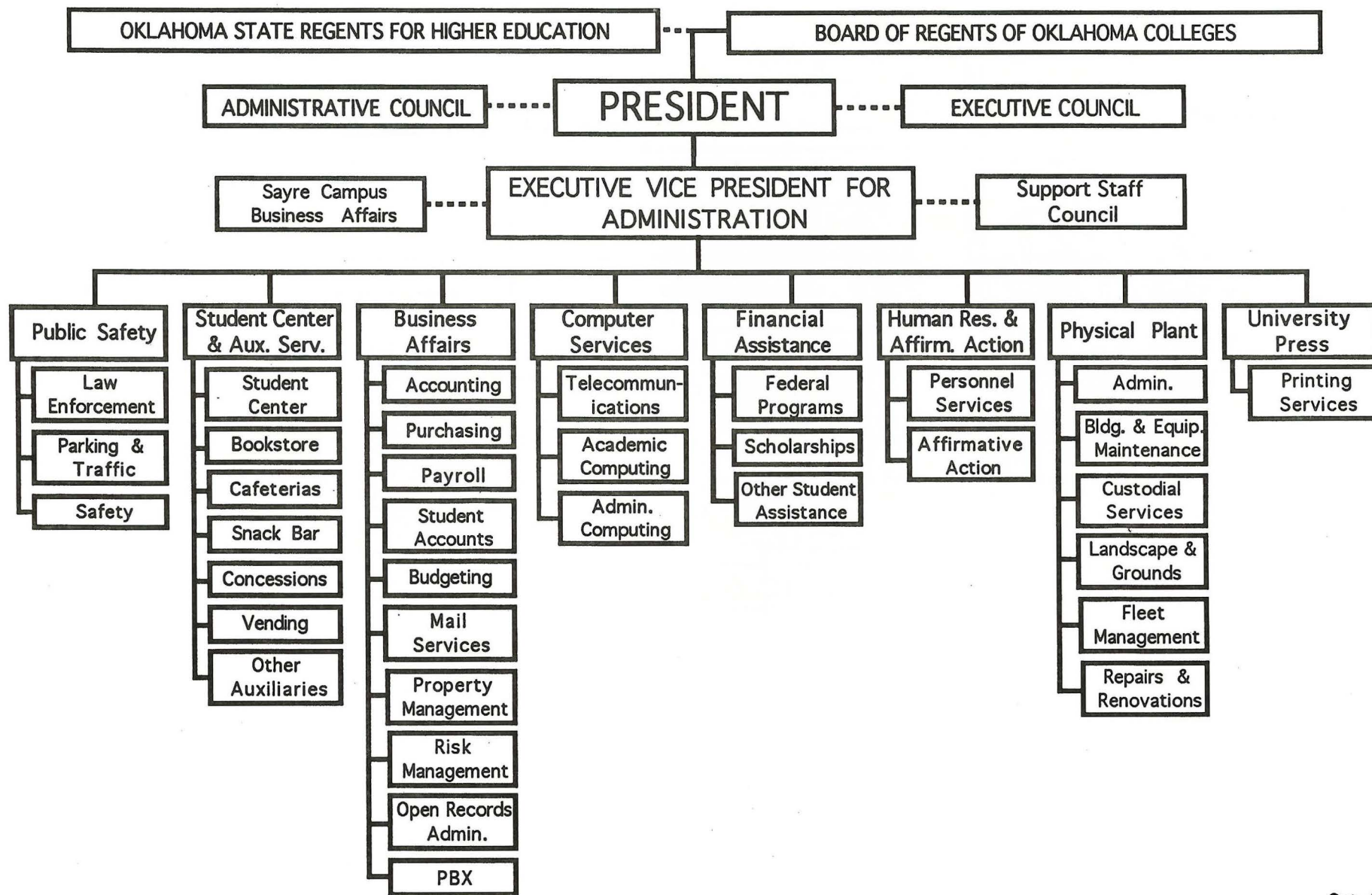
The Board of Regents was created by Article XIII-B, Oklahoma Constitution, July 6, 1948, to govern the six regional universities: East Central University, Northeastern State University, Northwestern Oklahoma State University, Southeastern Oklahoma State University, Southwestern Oklahoma State University, and the University of Central Oklahoma. The Board consists of nine (9) members, eight (8) appointed by the Governor by and with the consent of the Senate, for nine-year staggered terms which expire on the 10th day of June. The ninth member is the elected State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

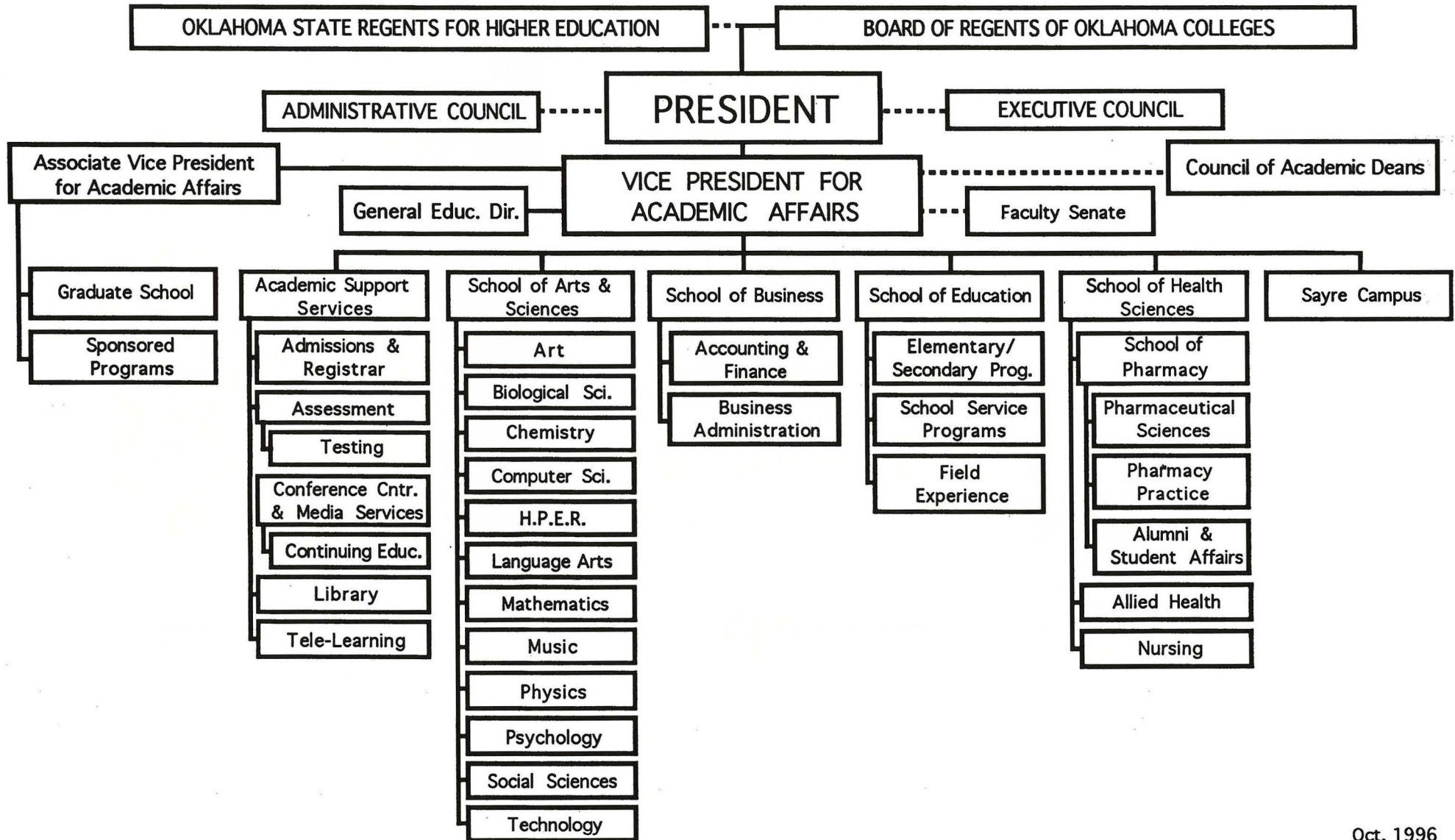
SOUTHWESTERN OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY ORGANIZATION CHART



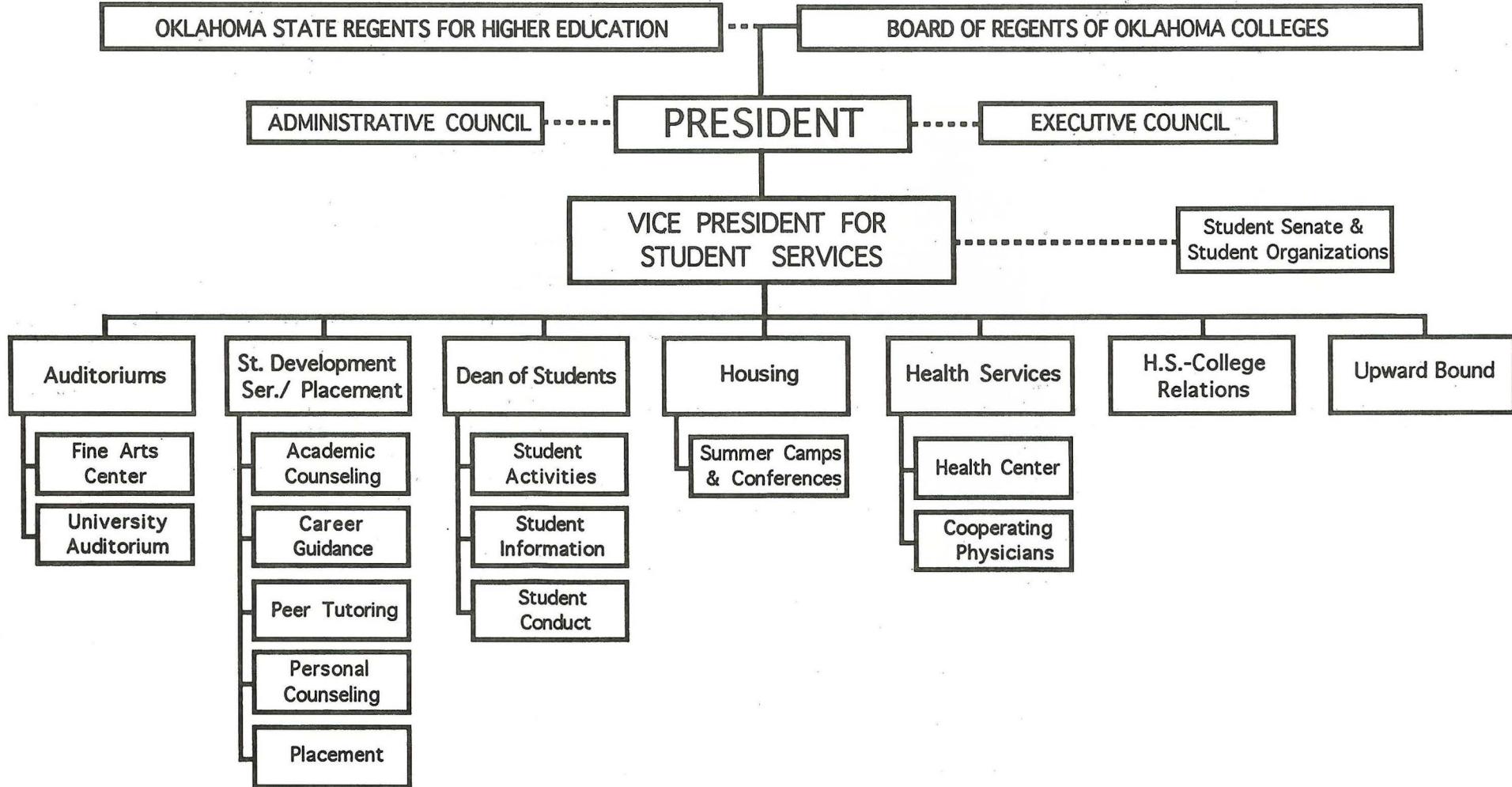
SOUTHWESTERN OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY ORGANIZATION CHART



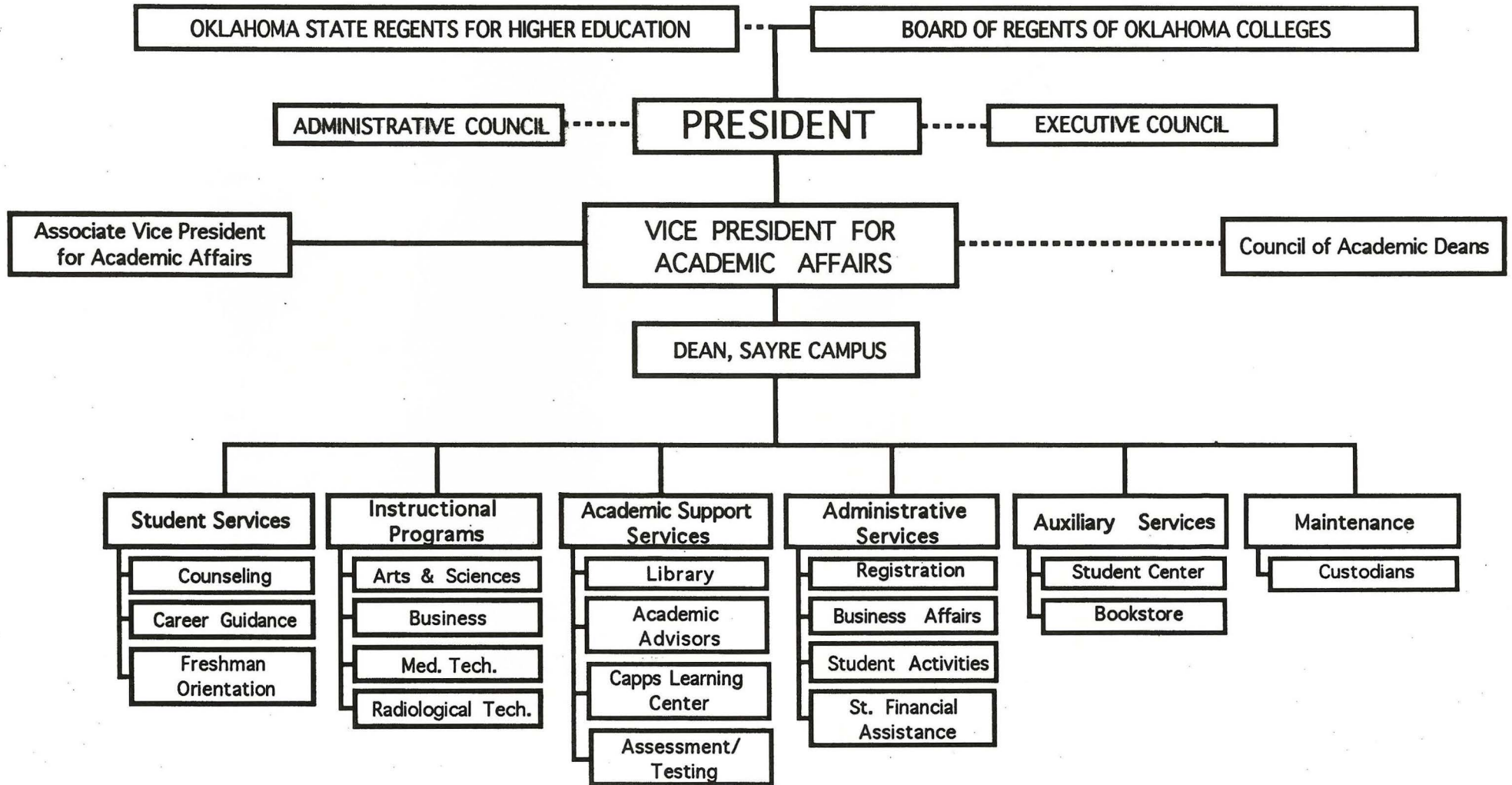
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SOUTHWESTERN OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY ORGANIZATION CHART

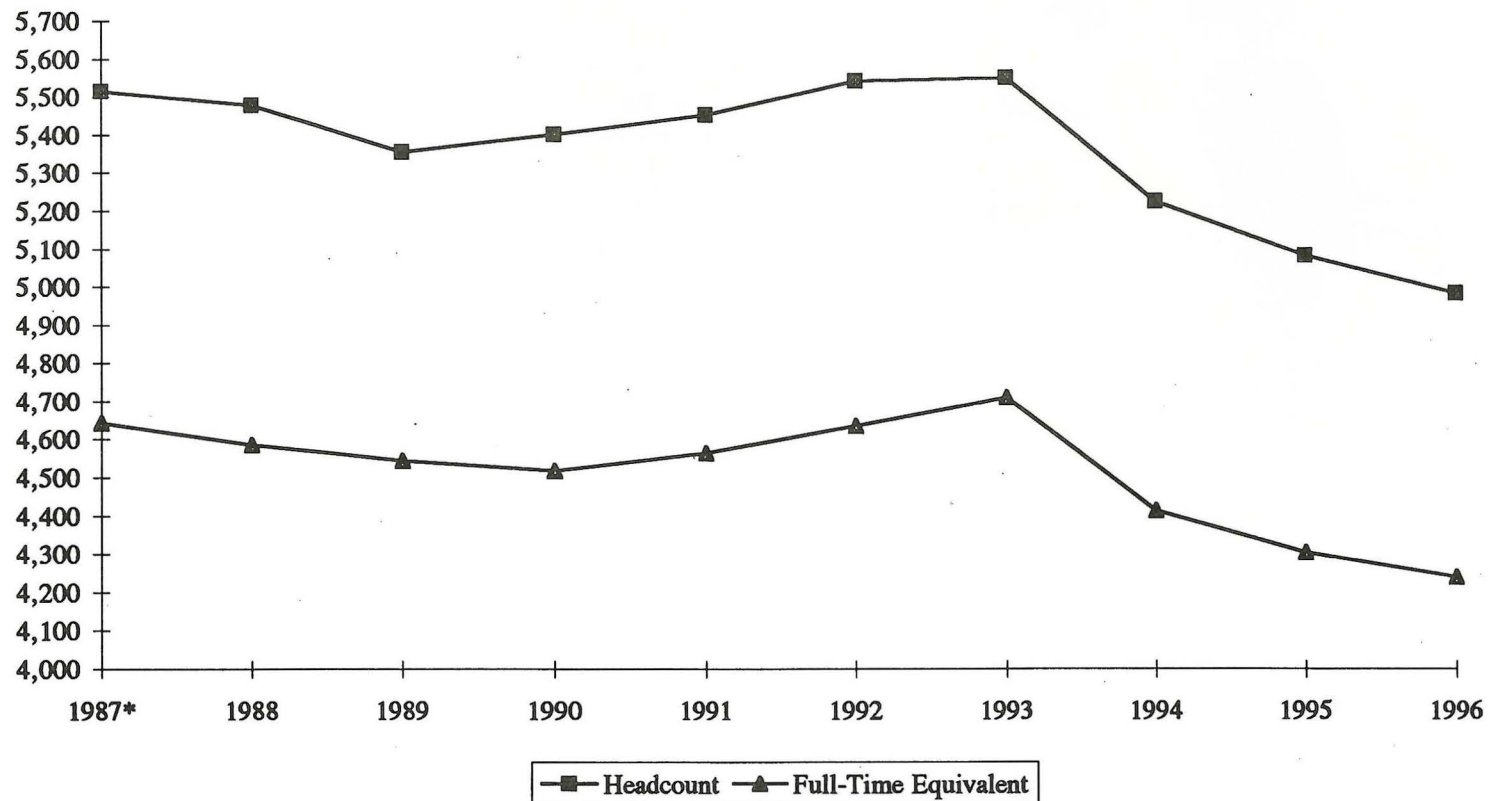


SOUTHWESTERN OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY ORGANIZATION CHART

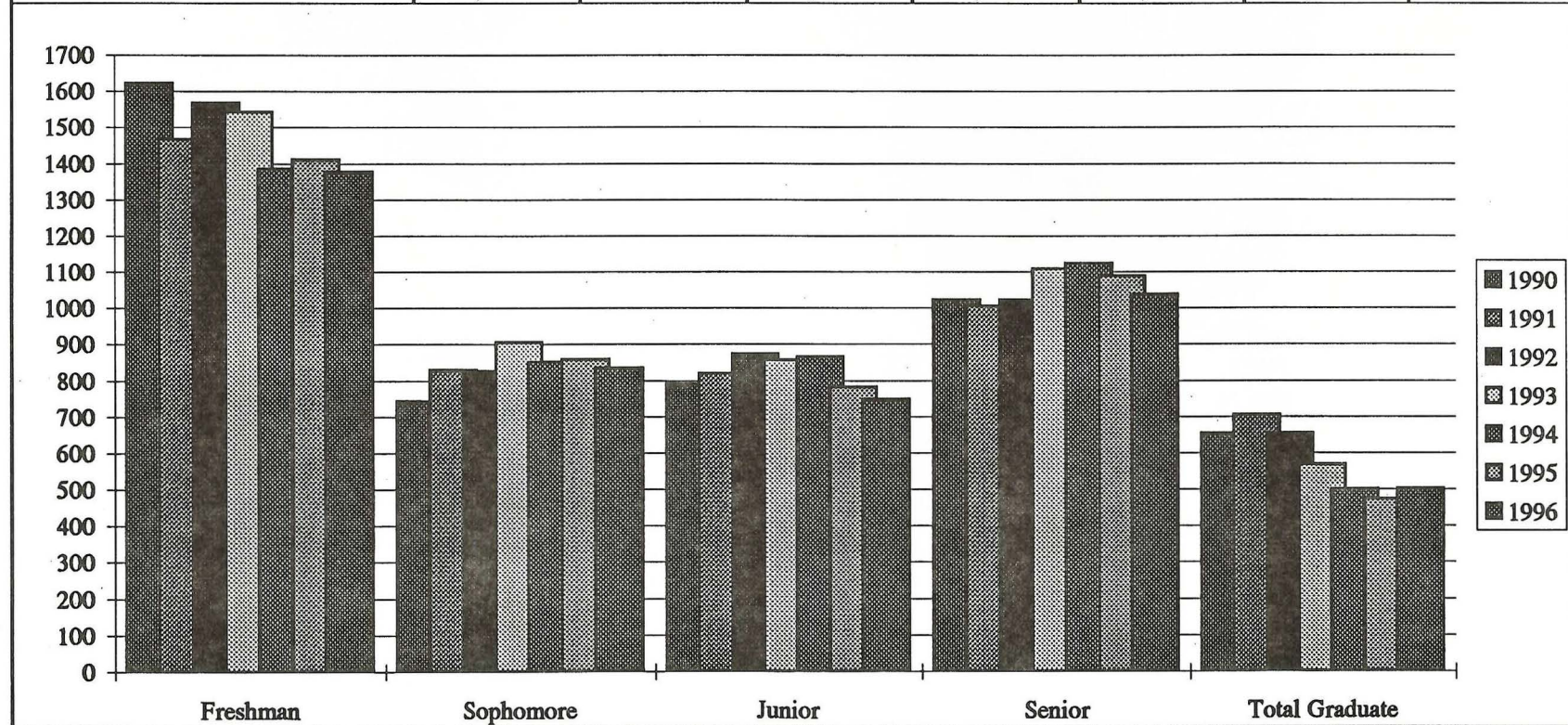

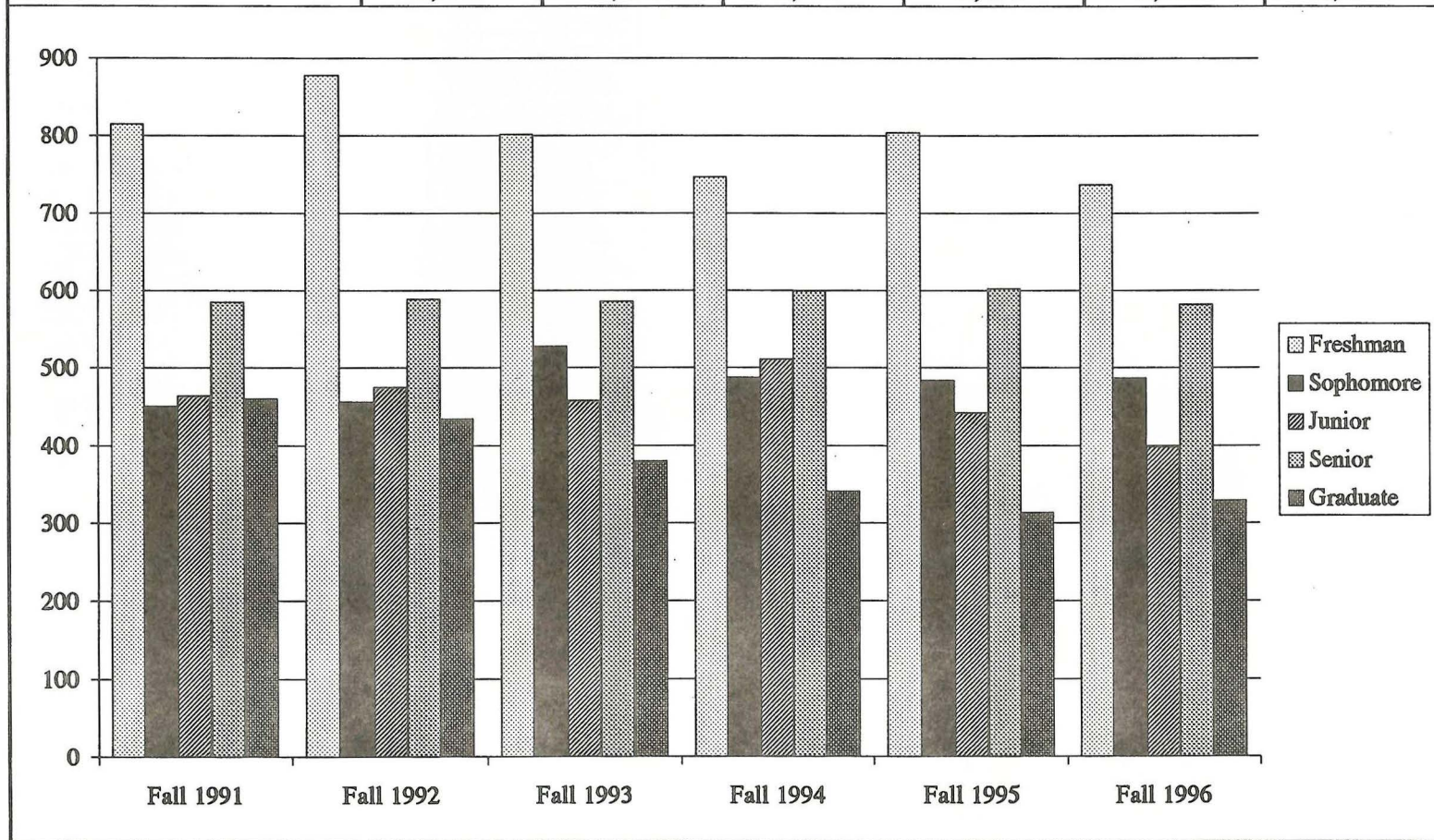

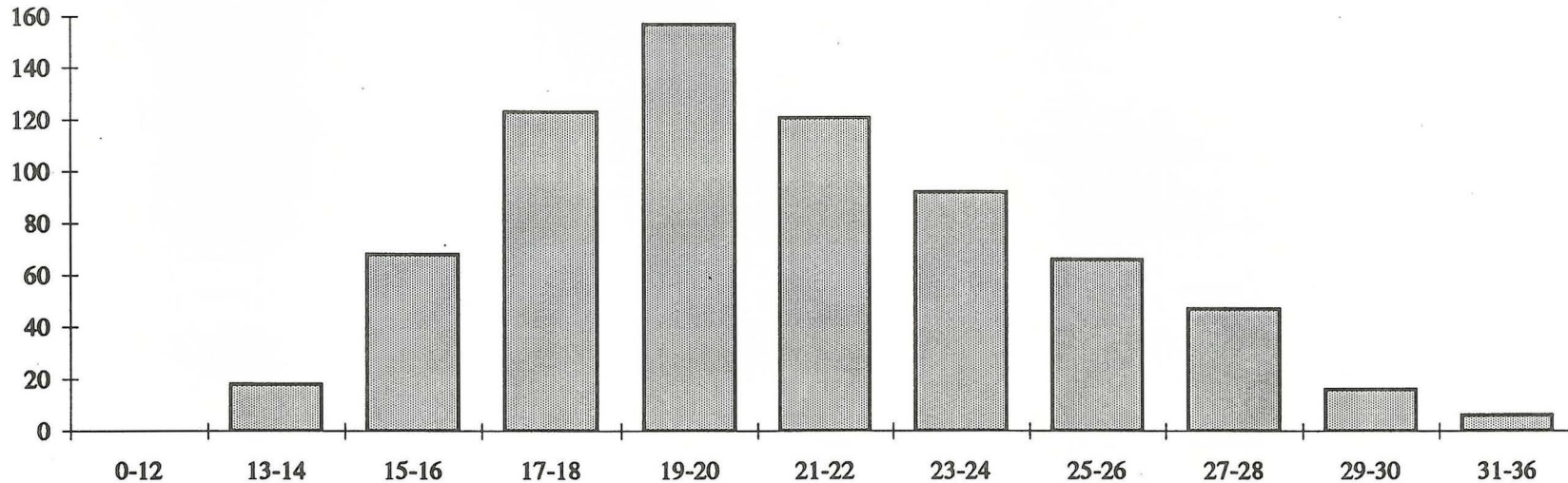

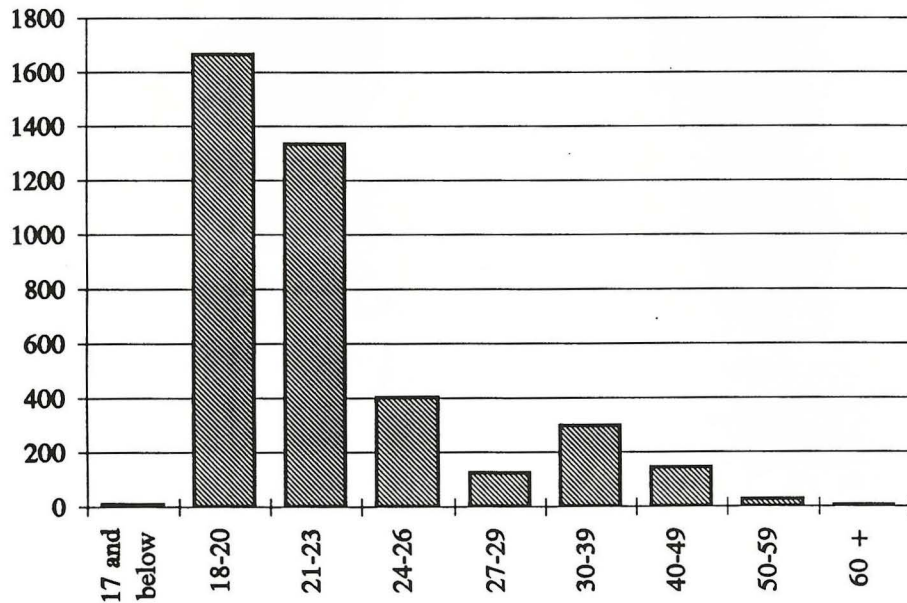

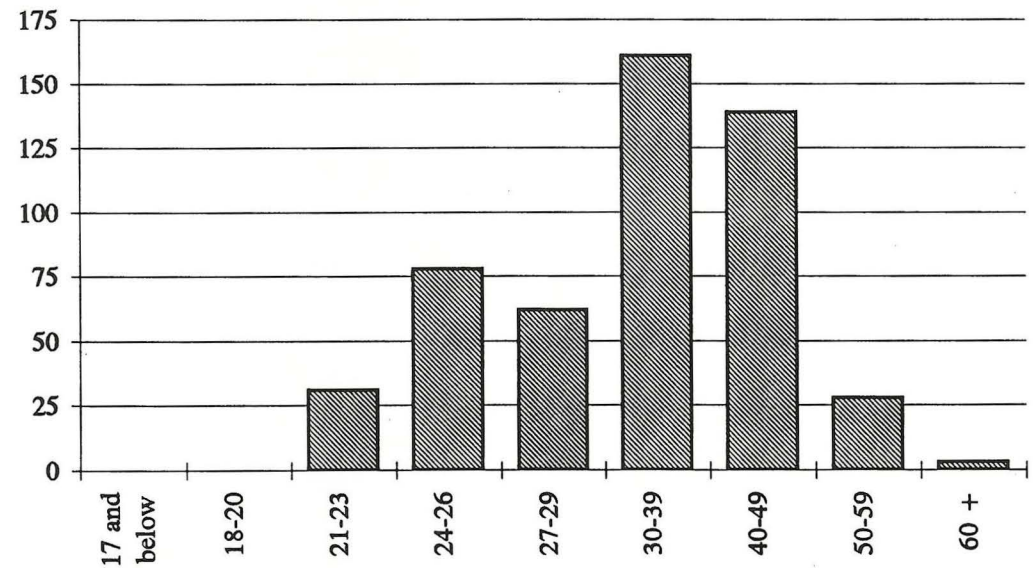

1996 FALL GRADUATE ENROLLMENT BY AGE

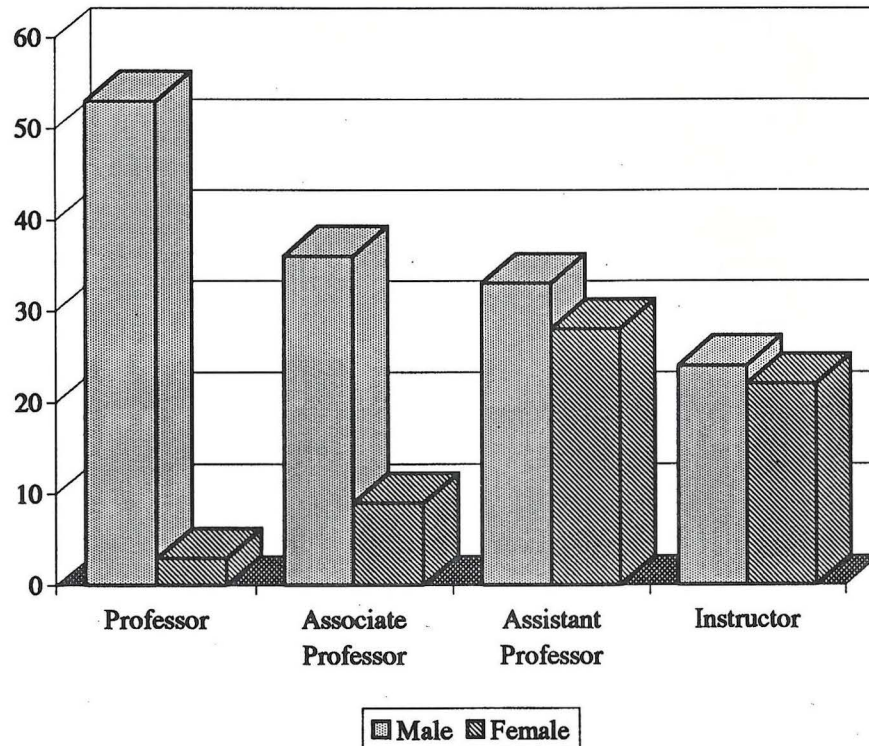

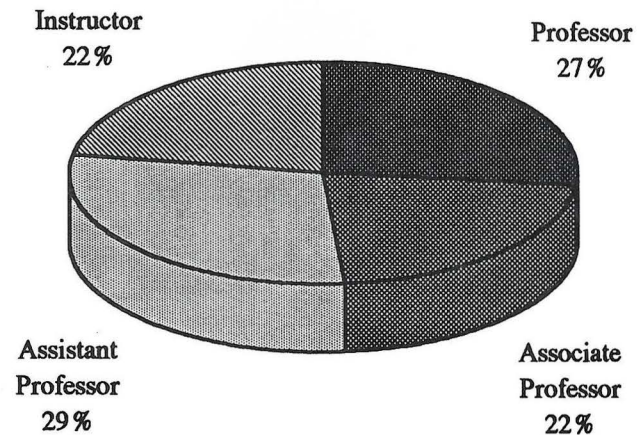

PERCENTAGES OF FULL-TIME FACULTY BY RANK

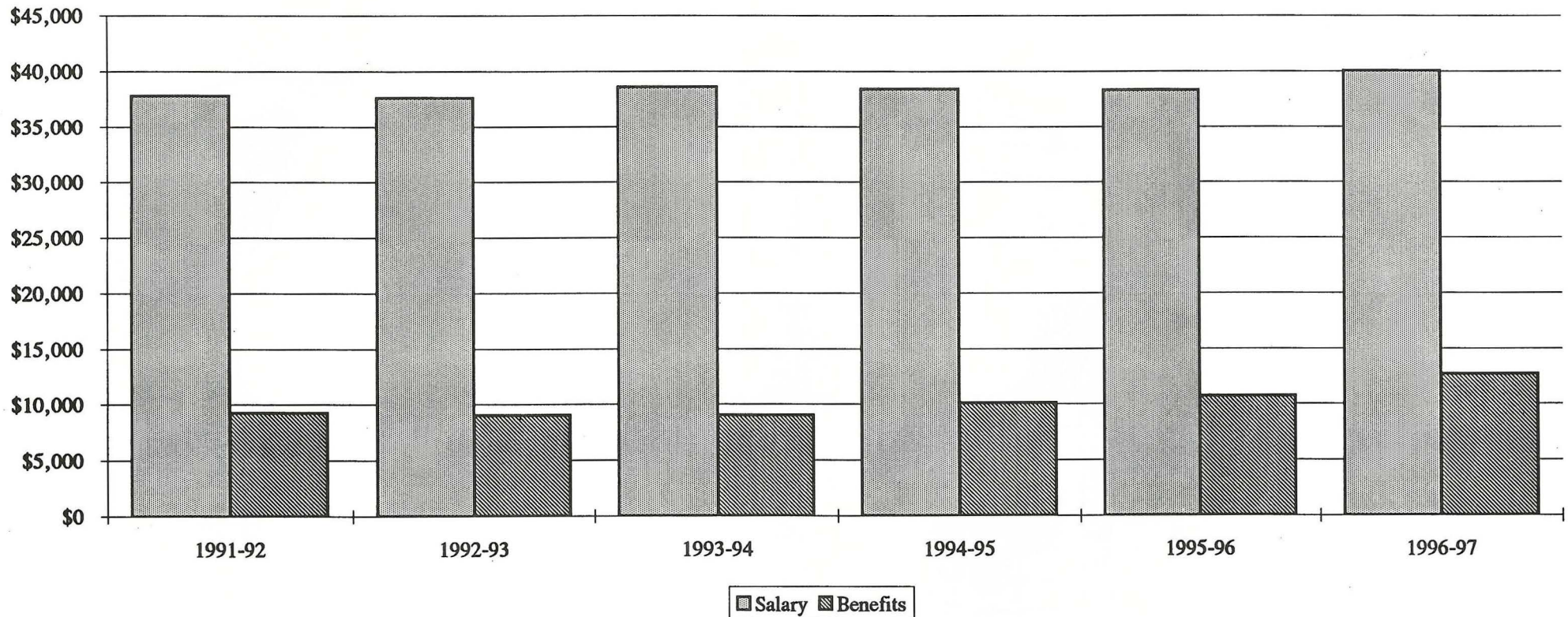

FACULTY AVERAGE SALARY AND BENEFITS



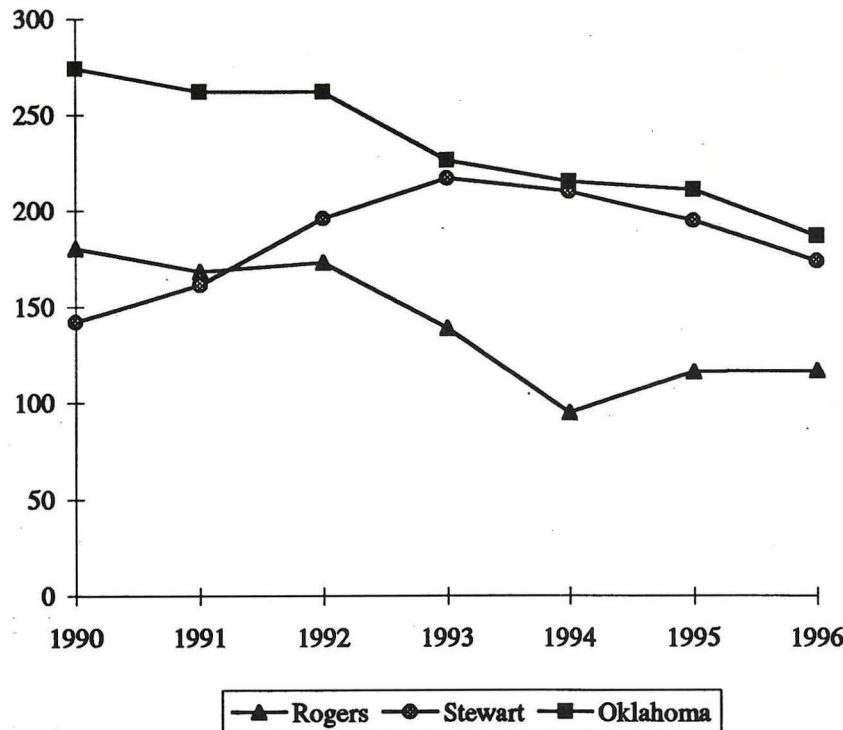

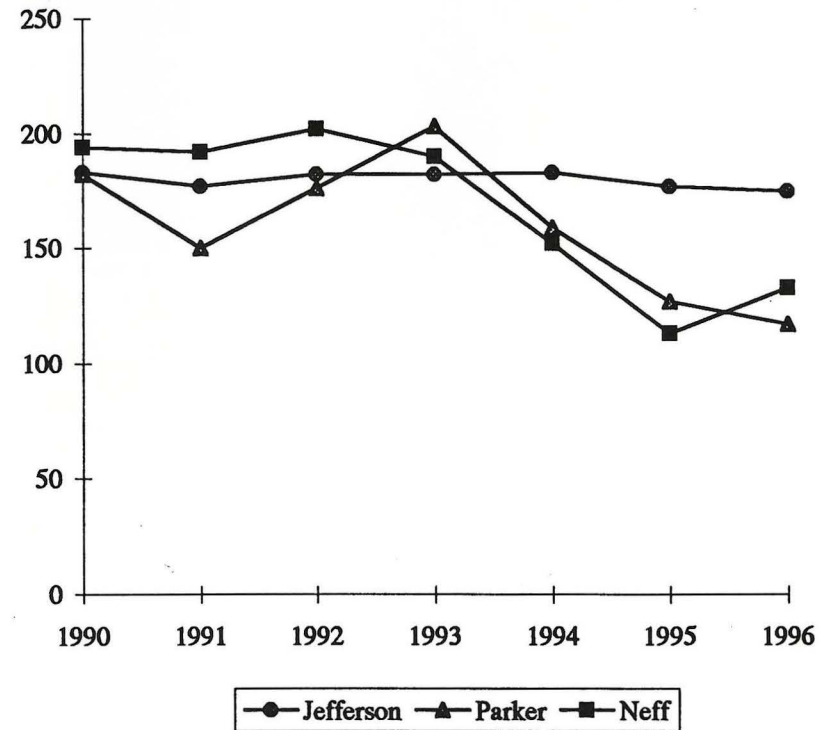

MEN'S DORMITORIES

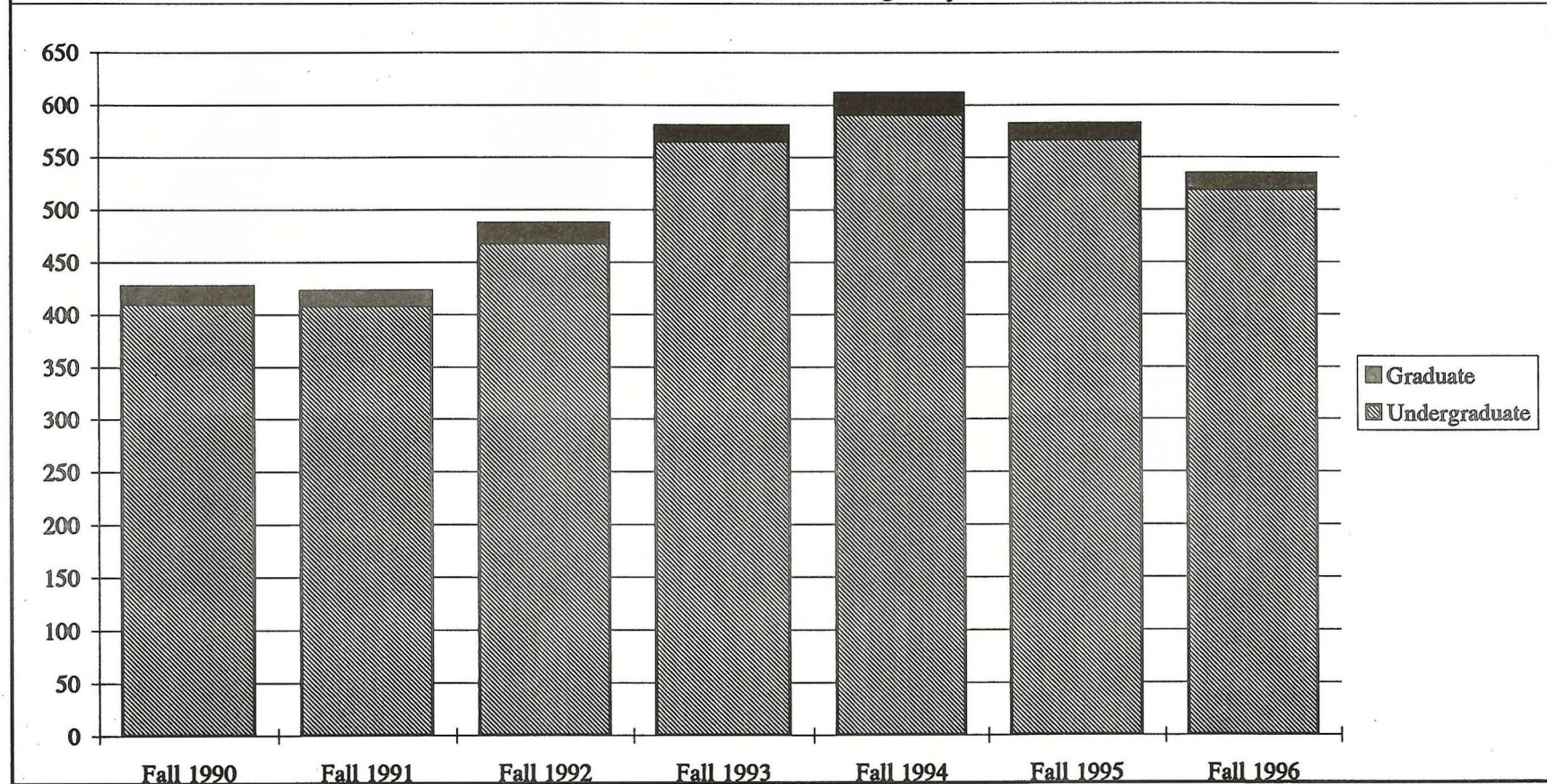

HISTORY OF SOUTHWESTERN OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY AT SAYRE

Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Sayre was founded as Sayre Junior College in 1938 under legislative authorization which permitted public high schools to add a 13th and 14th year of study to their curricula. In 1940 the college name was changed to Oklahoma Western Junior College; however, the original name was soon adopted again and in May 1940 the first degrees were conferred.

America's entry into World War II decimated the ranks of both faculty and students. Consequently, the college closed during the war years, but reopened in 1946. In 1956 Sayre Junior College moved from facilities it had occupied jointly with Sayre High School into separate facilities--a gymnasium and a classroom building--in the northeast corner of Sayre. In 1960 two additional classroom building were added, and in 1968 the Mackey Hall dormitory was opened. Changes in the physical plant have continued with expansion of the main classroom building; the addition of new classrooms, conference room, and student services facilities; and the conversion of Mackey Hall to a classroom space and library facilities.

In July 1987 by act of the Oklahoma legislature, Sayre Junior College was merged with Southwestern Oklahoma State University. The campus serves western Oklahoma and the Texas panhandle within a 60 mile radius of Sayre. It offers open admission to high school graduates as well as to students who do not hold a high school diploma. Fully accredited, SWOSU at Sayre offers Associate of Science and Associate of Applied Science degrees in both general and specialized areas of study.

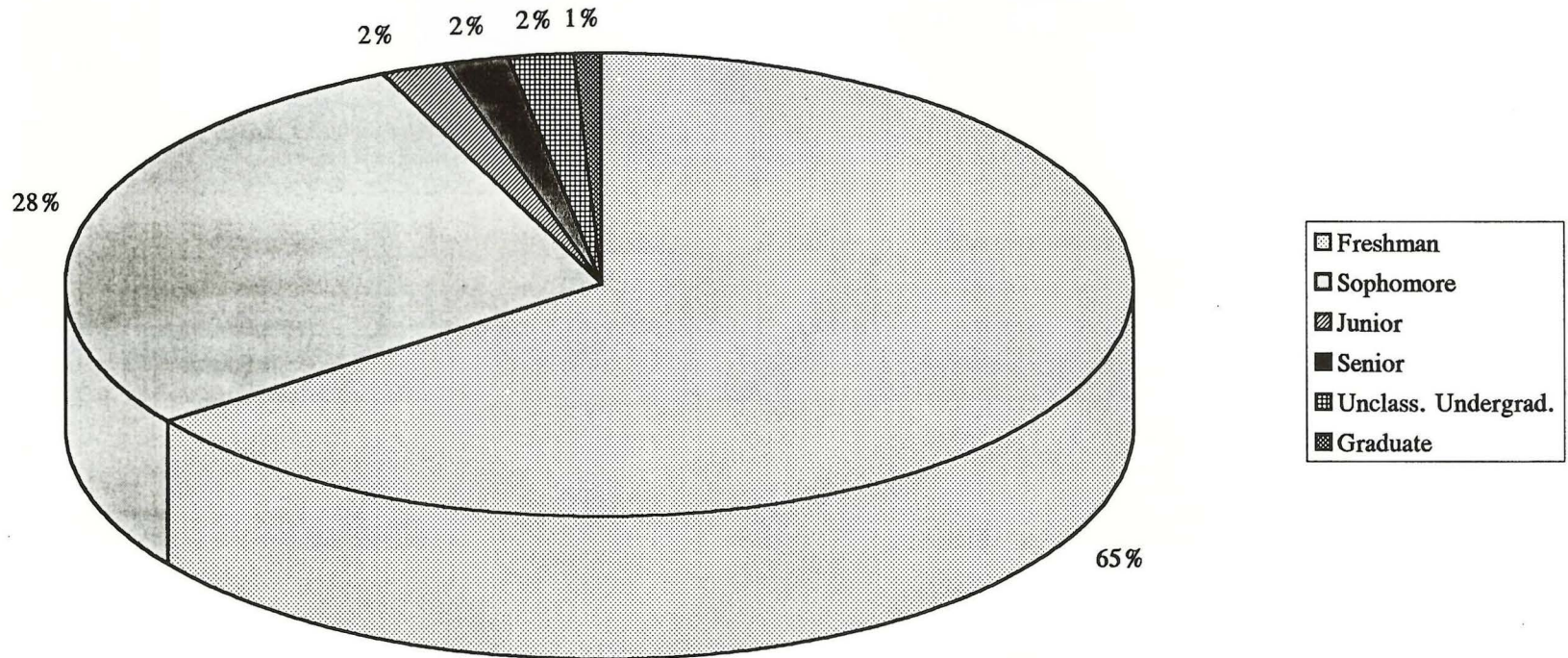

FALL 1996 ENROLLMENT BY CLASSIFICATION - SAYRE CAMPUS

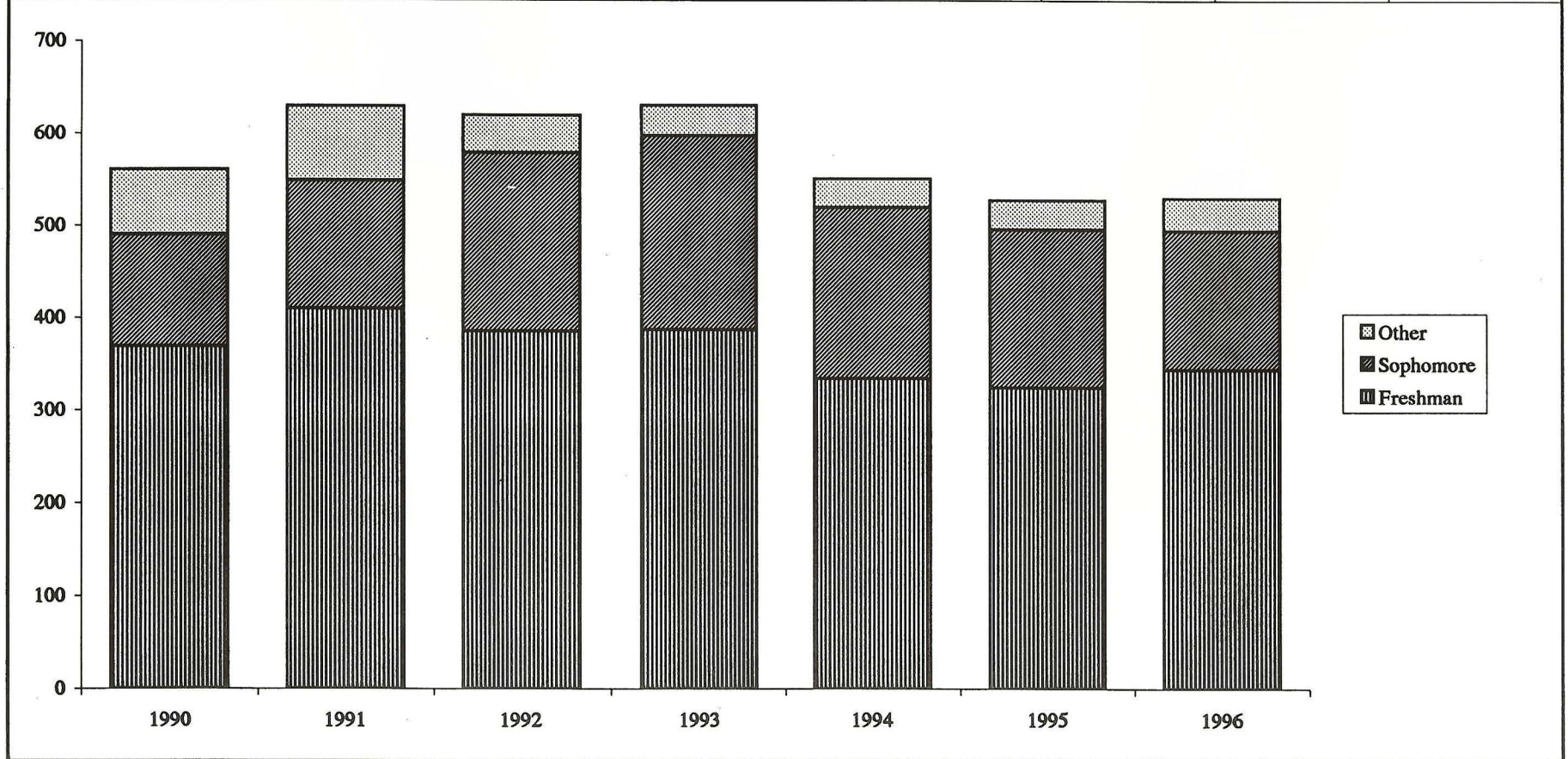

TOTAL ENROLLMENT PERCENTAGES BY CLASSIFICATION



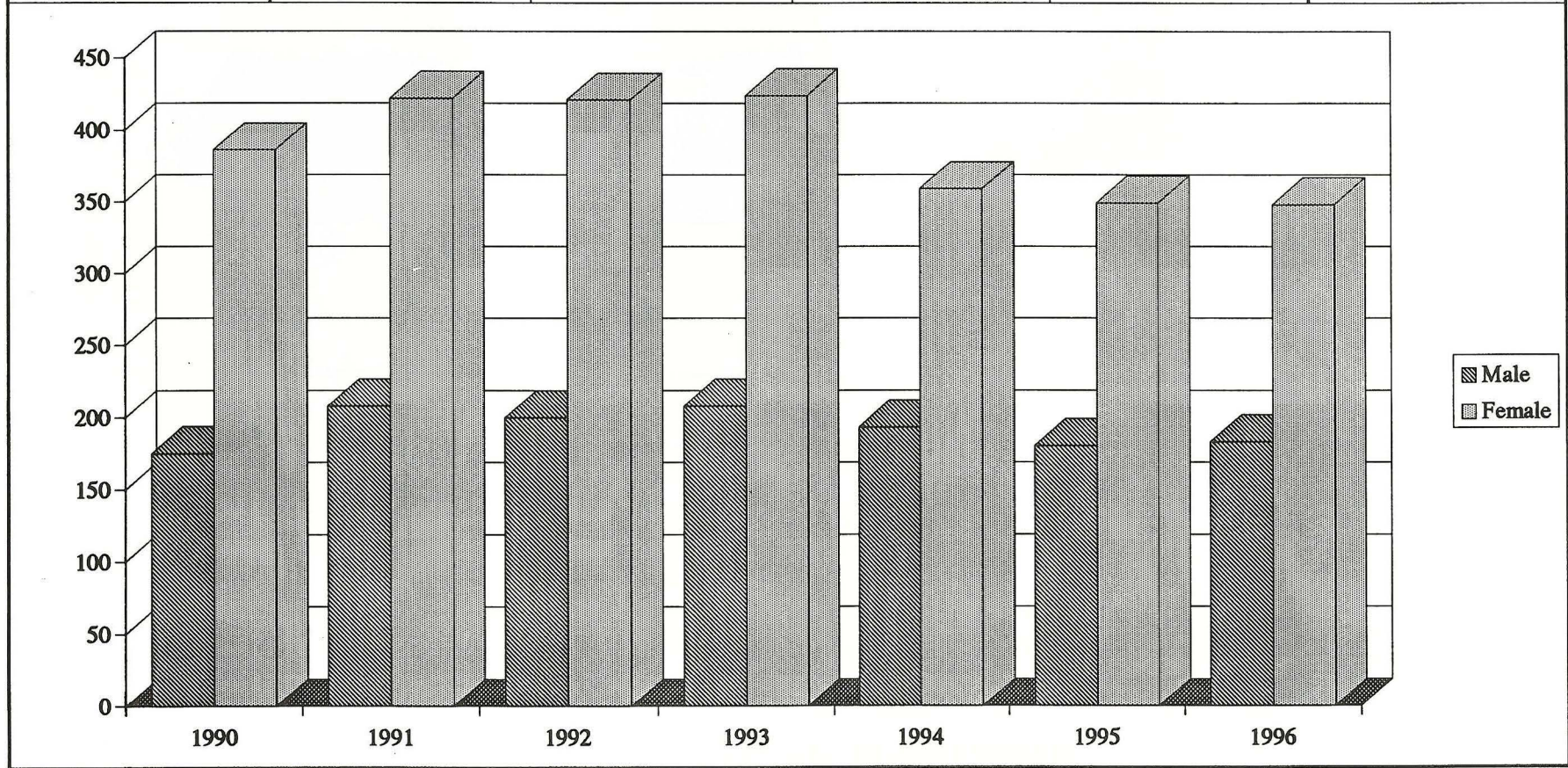

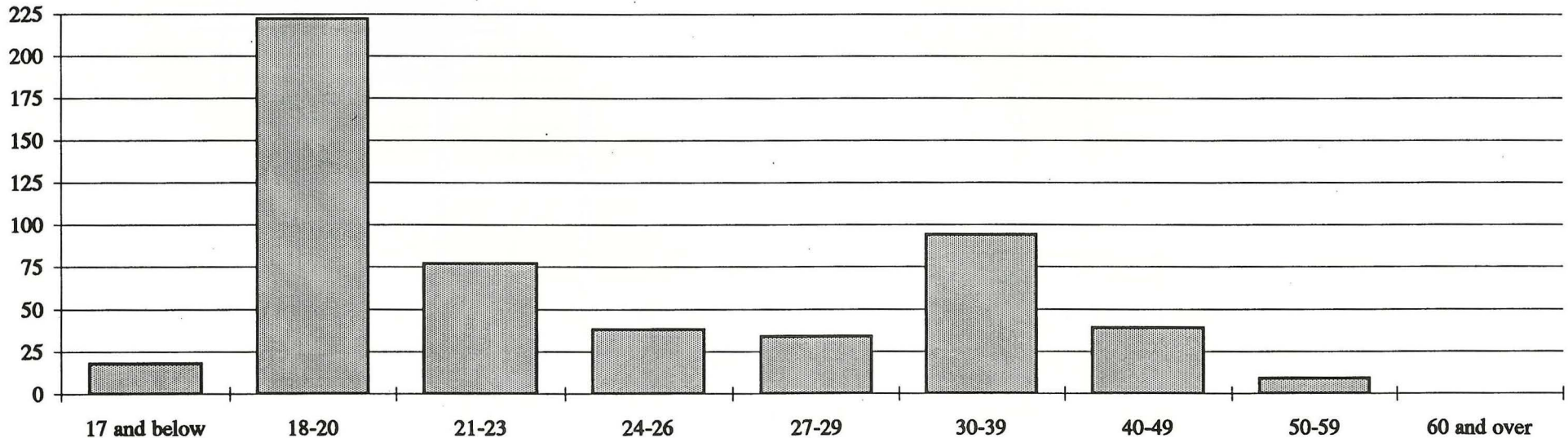

FALL 1996 ENROLLMENT BY AGE



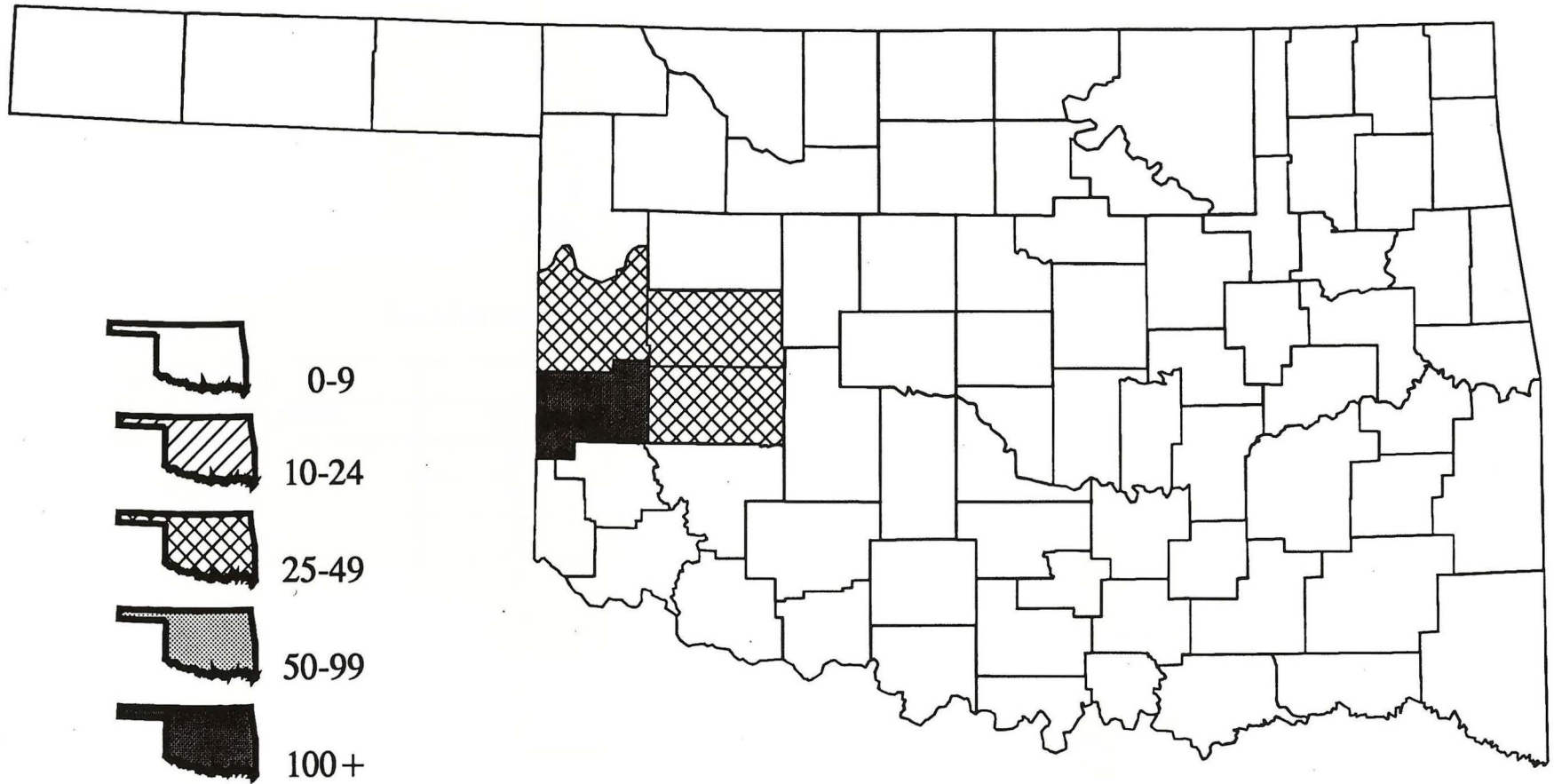

FALL 1996 ENROLLMENT BY COUNTY - SAYRE CAMPUS

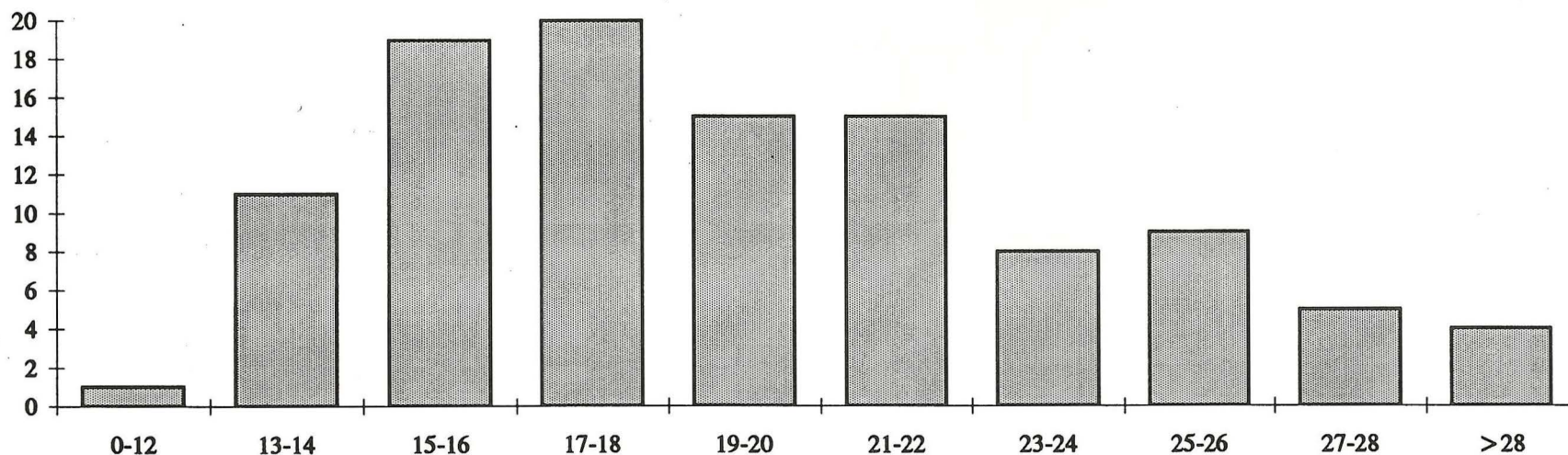

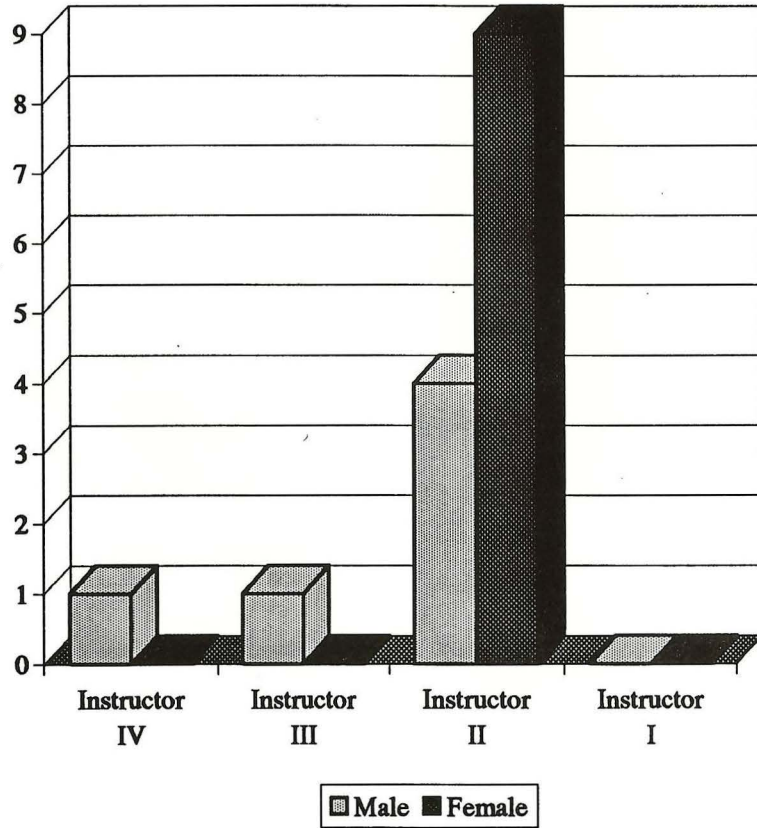

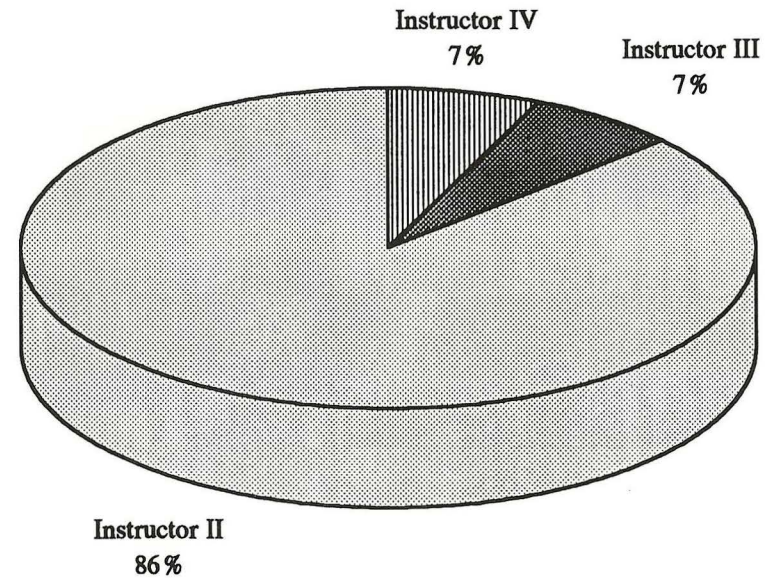
