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INTRODUCTION

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I am pleased to introduce the second annual Southwestern Oklahoma State University *Fact Book*. Last year's publication was met with positive review, and I intend to continue this historical record of data. It provides a ready source of information to answer frequently asked questions about the University and its operations.

The *Fact Book* is made up of three sections: (1) general information from both campuses, (2) data from the Weatherford campus, and (3) data from the Sayre campus. In most catagories, the *Fact Book* reflects data from a five-year period. The Fall 1989 semester was chosen as a starting point for several reasons. The most important reason is that the merger with Sayre Junior College began in July 1987, and for two years all university data was compiled for both campuses collectively. Because the two campuses are so unique, it was determined that data should be collected for each campus separately beginning in the fall of 1989. It is almost impossible to accurately compare the data prior to the fall of 1989.

Unless otherwise noted, the information in this *Fact Book* came from computer-generated reports that are printed following the tenth class day of each fall semester. Because of student fluctuations during the semester, numbers will not match other published enrollment numbers that may be based on enrollment at the end of a semester. Also, adding Weatherford's and Sayre's campus enrollment numbers will not equal the total student count for Southwestern Oklahoma State University; this is because many students attend classes at both sites.

This *Fact Book* was compiled and developed by the Office of Institutional Research. I wish to thank my student employee, Mr. Brad Church, for his expertise in computer graphics and design. I also appreciate the comments and suggestions that were received after last year's publication. It is hoped that the reader will find this second annual *Fact Book* helpful, and I again ask for any input to help make future documents more useful.

HISTORY OF SOUTHWESTERN OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY

Southwestern Oklahoma State University, a member of the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, has two campuses. One is located in Weatherford, Oklahoma (60 miles west of Oklahoma City on Interstate 40). The second campus is in Sayre, Oklahoma (60 miles west of Southwestern's Weatherford campus). The university is accredited and authorized to offer curricula in teacher education, pharmacy, nursing, business, and the arts and sciences.

The university was established by an act of the Oklahoma Territorial Legislature in 1901 as the Southwestern Normal School, authorized to offer two years training for public school teachers. The first classes met in 1903. In the beginning, four years of preparatory work for students not yet qualified to enter college were set up.

In 1920 the preparatory, or academy, courses were eliminated and two additional years of college work were added. The state legislature approved a change of name to Southwestern State Teachers College. The first baccalaureate degrees were awarded in May, 1921.

Other major changes in name and purposes occurred in 1939 when the institution was designated as Southwestern State College of Diversified Occupations. In 1941, it became Southwestern Institute of Technology when the college added a School of Pharmacy, degree work in the arts and sciences, and trade schools to its original function as a teacher-training institution.

The Oklahoma State Legislature in 1949 again changed the name, this time to Southwestern State College, without altering the broad scope of its purposes and educational objectives. Since that time there has been full accreditation by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. In addition, the university is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education; the Oklahoma State Board of Education; the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education; the American Chemical Society; the American Medical Association Committee on Allied Health Education and Accreditation, in cooperation with the American Medical Record Association; the Oklahoma Board of Nurse Registration and Nursing Education; the National Association of Music; the National Association of Music Therapy; and the National League for Nursing.

In 1953, Southwestern inaugurated an advanced professional program leading to the Master of Teaching degree, now called the Master of Education degree, which is fully accredited. It is designed primarily for education majors preparing for public school personnel positions. Under an optional plan, however, the degree is offered to non-education majors who are not interested in public school certification. In addition to the M.Ed. degree in 22 different fields of specialization, Southwestern also offers the M.S. degree in Applied Psychology, the Master of Business Administration degree, and the Master of Music degree.

In 1974, the Oklahoma State Legislature changed the name of the institution to Southwestern Oklahoma State University. On July 1, 1987, by an act of the Oklahoma Legislature, Sayre Junior College was merged with Southwestern Oklahoma State University as a branch campus designated as Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Sayre.





REGENTS OF OKLAHOMA COLLEGES


The Board of Regents was created by Article XIII-B, Oklahoma Constitution, July 6, 1948, to govern the six regional universities: East Central University, Northeastern State University, Northwestern Oklahoma State University, Southwestern Oklahoma State University, Southwestern Oklahoma State University, and the University of Central Oklahoma. The Board consists of nine (9) members, eight (8) appointed by the Governor by and with the consent of the Senate, for nine-year staggered terms which expire on the 10th day of June. The ninth member is the elected State Superintendent of Public Instruction.





ENROLLMENT BY GENDER - WEATHERFORD CAMPUS




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MALE ENROLLMENT - WEATHERFORD CAMPUS



FRESHMAN ACT COMPOSITE SCORES








UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE ENROLLMENT BY AGE - WEATHERFORD CAMPUS




FULL-TIME FACULTY BY GENDER AND RANK




PERCENTAGES OF FULL-TIME FACULTY BY RANK




AVERAGE SALARY AND BENEFITS BY RANK FOR 9-MONTH FACULTY

HISTORY OF SOUTHWESTERN OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY AT SAYRE

Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Sayre is a member of the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. The institution was established in the fall of 1938 as Sayre Junior College. From 1938 until 1942 and from 1946 until 1956, the college shared facilities with Sayre High School. The college was closed from 1942 until 1946 because of World War II. In 1956, the college was separated from the high school and moved to its present location on old State Highway 66. Sayre Junior College and Southwestern Oklahoma State University were merged on July 1, 1987, by an act of the Oklahoma Legislature.

Sayre, a city of approximately 3,000 population, is the county seat of Beckham County. It is located 125 miles west of Oklahoma City on Interstate 40 and 60 miles west of Southwestern's Weatherford campus. The city has a hospital, an airport, a municipal swimming pool, a golf course, parks, churches of various denominations, an active Chamber of Commerce, and five civic clubs. Nearby are museums, historic sites, and recreational facilities at Quartz Mountain State Park and Foss Reservoir.





FALL 1993 ENROLLMENT BY CLASSIFICATION - SAYRE CAMPUS




FALL ENROLLMENT BY CLASSIFICATION - SAYRE CAMPUS




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ENROLLMENT BY GENDER - SAYRE CAMPUS





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MALE ENROLLMENT - SAYRE CAMPUS




FEMALE ENROLLMENT - SAYRE CAMPUS

TOTAL ENROLLMENT BY AGE - SAYRE CAMPUS






