



How to Choose: Compare Features

EndNote, F1000 Workspace, Mendeley, and Zotero are tools that serve the same purpose. They all allow you to create a database of references that you can use to keep track of your reading and to create references when you write. So how do you choose which one to use?

- Break into smaller jobs or export/import by folder

Pay close attention to step-by-step instructions

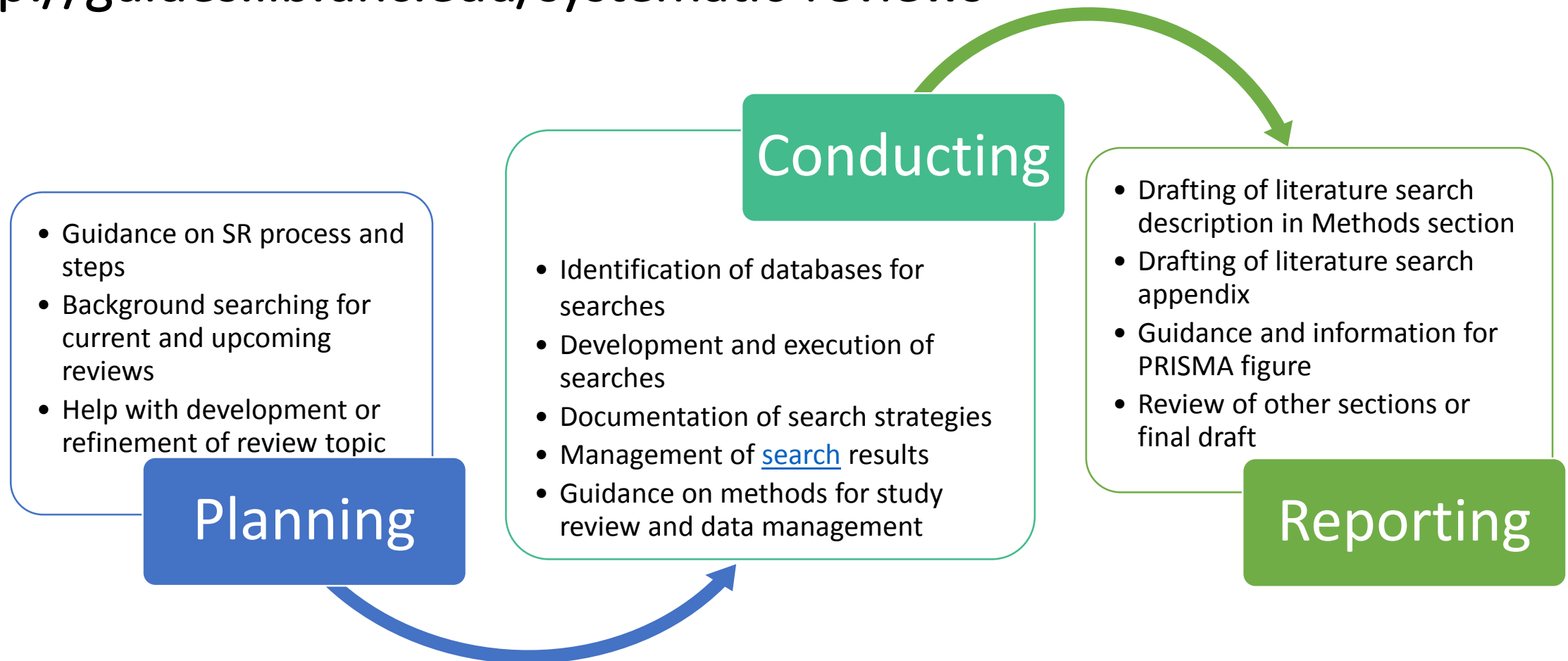

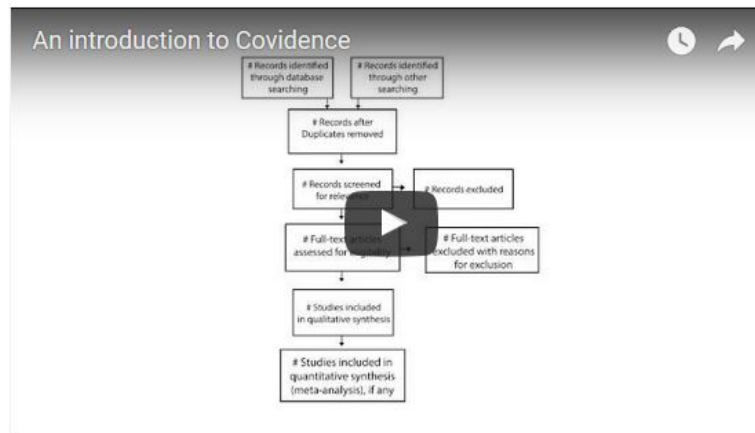

What is ORCID

- ▶ Open Researcher and Contributor ID (=ORCID) 
- ▶ Unique identifier for scholars; open science movement; address name ambiguity and changes over time;
- ▶ Common names, names changes (women), different versions of names used on different publications (e.g., first, middle initial versions of names)
- ▶ Not a vendor id like Scopus ID or Researcher ID (TR); ORCID can be linked to these.

► Some advantages to researchers

- Unique researcher identifier despite name changes and versions
- In the future, databases will incorporate searching by ORCID, making author searching easier
- Journals and Funders (e.g., Autism Speaks) are beginning to require ORCID's
- Researcher ID systems (e.g., ORCID, Scopus Author ID, WOS ResearcherID) and NCBI My Bibliography, SciENcv (can be used to create NIH biosketches) are beginning to “speak” to one another

What is Research Impact?

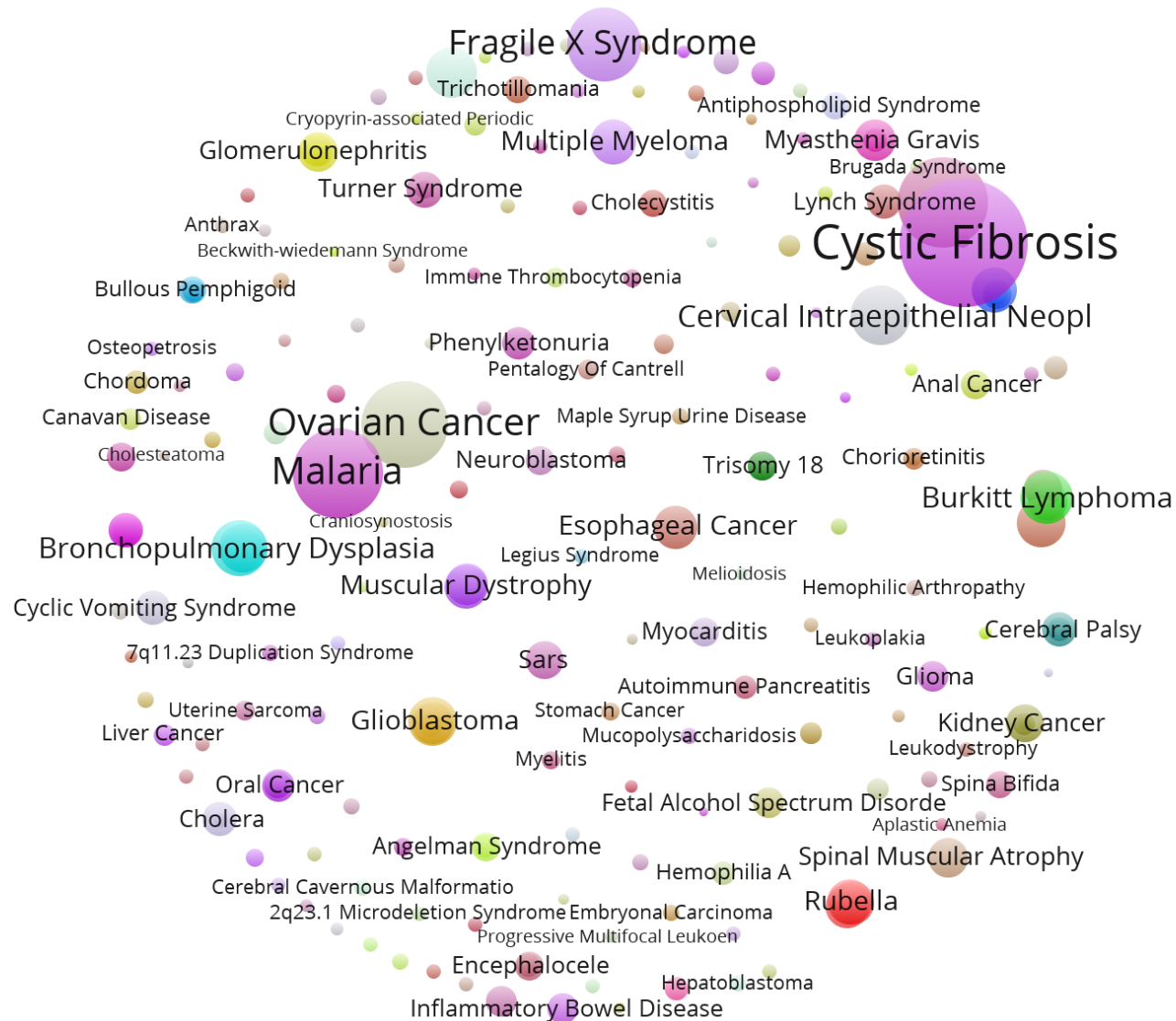
Research impact is the demonstrable contribution that excellent research makes to academia, society and the economy:

- Academic impact**: Contribution to academic advances, across and within disciplines, in understanding, methods, theory and application
- Societal impact**: Benefit to individuals, organizations and nations by enhancing quality of life, health and creative output, and increasing the effectiveness of public services and policy
- Economic impact**: Attracting investment, wealth creation, enhanced national and global competitiveness
