INTRODUCTION

The objective was to create an internship course complete with academic content and resources designed specifically for students who elect to serve as student leaders on the recently proposed BAS/IPS Student Advisory Committee.

The internship course will equip the student committee members with the information, techniques, and strategies necessary for them to successfully accomplish their assigned tasks on behalf of BAS/IPS program initiatives.

PROJECT PURPOSE & COMMUNITY NEED

Student committee members provide unique perspectives and insights that allow faculty and staff to better identify and attend to any gaps, needs, and desires pertaining to the program, while giving students an opportunity to apply program-specific concepts such as creative problem solving, integrative thinking, strategic networking, and purposeful reflection in an experiential learning environment.

The overall success of the BAS/IPS Student Advisory Committee is dependent upon students being equipped with the tools and knowledge necessary for the roles and responsibilities they assume, which gives purpose and direction for the development of the supplemental BAS/IPS Student Advisory Committee Internship Course.

The instructional material guides the students through the collaborative process and prepares them to navigate challenges they may encounter while working as a group. It helps bridge the gap between the students' various starting points, develops a common language, invites shared understanding, expands networks, and creates meaningful experiences for the students.



COURSE CONCEPTS & METHODS
