Due to controlling images that frame the way police interact with all women of color, they are seen as emotional and mentally unstable which can escalate to gender-based oppression and violence.

More than half of disabled African Americans have been arrested by the time they turn 28

50% of people killed by law enforcement were disabled.

The stereotype of superhuman strength during the slavery period has endured and caused police to use excessive force on Black women.

Police often view gender non-conforming folks and all women of color in general as mentally ill and erratic which can lead to gender-based violent encounters.

Controlling images such as the Angry Black Woman lead police to believe that Black Women possess superhuman strength which can increase the chance of being abused by the police.

When police are called as first responders to a mental health crisis involving Black Women, they often escalate the situation and increase the likelihood that the person will experience violence or be murdered.

Drapetomania: a supposed mental illness that enslaved people were diagnosed with to explain why they ran away



Multiple jeopardy: the compounding discrimination that minority groups face.
