TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Meredith qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the fourteenth day of March, 1933, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, Treasurer, two Auditors, Collector of Taxes, Police Officer, Traffic Officer, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, two Library Trustees for three years, Road Agent and Prosecuting Agent.

2. To choose all other necessary town officers.

3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the amounts of money for the support of the Town, for the ensuing year, as determined by the Town Budget Committee in its report.

5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of Highways and Bridges.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate toward the extension of the Meredith-New Hampton road the sum of \$3,000.00 provided the State will appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00.

7. To see what action is to be taken relative to adopting a Town Planning system.

8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise toward defraying the expenses of the Town Library.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$800.00 for the support of Firemen and the protection of property in the Meredith Village Fire District.

10. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid and appropriate the amount of \$2,982.38.

11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise toward the support of the District Nurse.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$250.00 for the benefit of the Laconia Hospital. By request.

13. To see if the Town will construct a Cement Walk from a point near the residence of A. G. Considine to the residence of L. G. Burnell, on Elm Street, and raise the money therefor. By petition.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for a cement sidewalk from the corner of Main and Waukewan Streets (west side) to house of Clough & Avery, now occupied by J. P. Valliere, or some part of said distance. By petition.

15. To see what disposition the Town will vote to make of the \$300.00 appropriated to repair the highway in said town leading from the Crockett place, so called, to the Cilley place, so called, near the shore of Lake Winnisquam.

16. To see if the Town will vote to accept the lot of land, with equipment and attractions pertaining thereto, known as "Clough Park," left to the town of Meredith by the will of the late Edward H. Clough of Meredith and Manchester, N. H., to be used as a public park and cared for by the town.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select-

men to offer a discount on taxes, at the rate of five (5) per cent per annum, that are paid on or before December 1, 1933.

18. To see what action the Town will take in regard to refunding a certain Town note due January 31, 1933.

19. To see if the Town will vote to have the Selectmen pay the \$5,000 note due January 1, 1934, by applying an appropriation of \$1,500.00 and the appropriation to cover the "over-run" on the Meredith Neck Road.

20. To see what action the Town will take relative to the use of the Town Hall.

21. And to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF LIBRARIAN MEREDITH PUBLIC LIBRARY

Business may be bad generally, but not so at the public library, for the depression has increased the work there. Never before have libraries in this country had so many people to serve and this has been true in our own library. Our last report gave a circulation of 17,645 books. The past year we let out 20,958 books and magazines, a large record for the number of hours the library is open.

Gifts of books are always welcome and we have had a goodly number given us which have helped out greatly in supplying the demand of readers. Sixty books out of a larger number donated were suitable for circulation.

Mr. F. W. Cheney remembered us with a large box of books as did Mrs. John Downs. Others who have given books are Mr. T. L. McCarthy, Mr. Walter Badger, Mr. Pancoast, Mrs. Albert Tufts, Mrs. T. H. Briggs.

Fifteen magazines and papers are contributed for our reading tables. We have had one gift of money from a summer guest and Mrs. M. A. Ward presented us with a carpet sweeper for our new rugs. Other friends have brought flowers which add so much to our library in the summer time.

It was necessary to install a new furnace which adds much to the comfort of patrons.

People appreciate having access to more books and

While we have not much to report that is different from other years we would stress once more the fact that we have many interesting and valuable books of non-fiction on world affairs and topics of the day. New readers are always welcome.

During the year thirty-eight patients have been taken to the Laconia Hospital and fifteen taken to physicians for examinations and treatment, six to the orthopedic clinic in Laconia and three to the pre-natal clinic.

All the school children up to and including the eighth grade, as well as the three rural schools, have been weighed and examined and many defects corrected. Between May 6th and October 4th thirty school and pre-school children found in need of tonsilectomy have been taken care of at the Laconia Hospital at special rates. The usual fee for this amount of work is \$1,158.00, but through the courtesy and co-operation of Miss Lillian Williams, Superintendent, and Dr. J. R. Perley, the cost was only \$300.00, \$210.00 of which was donated by the following organizations and individuals, and for which we are very grateful.

There is still a great deal of corrective work to be done in families who are unable to meet even a small part of the expense, and if there are any who feel they could contribute further, we would appreciate it so much.

We are very grateful for the many donations of clothing of all kinds, and eighteen families, including father and mother, have been made comfortable because of it.

Food has also been purchased and delivered to sixteen families. This was made possible by the cash donations of one who chooses to be called "A Friend," and one family had a real Thanksgiving through the generosity of another "Friend."

On September 15th a pre-school health clinic was held at the Grange Hall. Forty-four children were weighed and measured and forty-two were given a complete examination by Dr. R. J. Turley, assisted by Miss Vivian Jennings, R. N., State Field Worker, and the local health nurse, and the few defects found are practically all under treatment.

On November 21st a chest clinic was held at the Lang Street School. Forty-two were examined by Dr. Kerr, assisted by Miss Marion Garland, County Tuberculosis Nurse, and the local health nurse. One new case was found and is under supervision.

One school child has been taken to the State School in Laconia and seven children placed in foster homes.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER

Meredith, N. H., February 20, 1933.

To the Superintendent of Schools, Board of Education,
and Citizens of Meredith:

One of the results of the present difficult economic times is an increase in the enrollment in our public high schools. Young people who would not be in school during normal times are continuing their education; either because they cannot find employment or because they realize now, as never before, that adequate and careful preparation is necessary for future success. To meet these conditions schools have been compelled to reorganize their physical resources and to adjust their standards of education to a broader service.

The registration in Meredith Senior High School for the current year is seven greater than at any time in the school's history. It is also twenty-seven greater than the average of the past thirteen years. This abnormal and crowded condition in the last four years of our school organization has been happily taken care of without any sacrifice in school efficiency. This has been possible because the teaching staff has received the active cooperation of the pupils. Few schools enjoy as helpful and as cooperating a relationship between staff and student body as does ours. This fact should be placed high in the asset column of any school.

The average registration of non-resident pupils since 1920-21 is 25.6. The highest registration was 32 in 1926-27, and the lowest was 21 in 1924-25 and 1930-31.

Our non-resident pupils add annually between two and three thousand dollars in tuition money.

The school day consists of eight periods. The larger enrollment this year made it advisable to form two or three divisions in several classes. This has increased the teaching load from 38 periods in 1931-32 to 45 periods per day in the current year.

The following table gives the number of periods each teacher spends daily in teaching. The three spare periods are devoted to supervision of study rooms, organization details, and individual help to pupils.

The permanent teachers' committees for the present year are:

Class Drives, Library, Assemblies, Athletics, Teachers' Meetings, School Exhibit, School Calendar, Testing Program, Prize Speaking, National Educational Week, Armistice Day Program, and Economy.

Teachers' meetings are held monthly at which time a program is given. Inter-school meetings of teachers from Ashland, Andover, Bristol, Belmont, Meredith, and Penacook High Schools are in their third year of existence. At these gatherings, held in each town in turn, a program is given followed by a round table discussion of school problems.

Miscellaneous Statistics for 1931-32

Statistics for Meredith Senior High School for the year 1931-32 are arranged in the following table. These statistics are taken from the Annual Statistical Report previously mentioned. The average of all secondary schools of the state is also given for the purpose of comparison.

In the above comparison the following conclusions may be drawn.

1. Meredith High School has nearly the average percentage of distribution of boys and girls.

2. More of our pupils than the average failed one course, but fewer failed more than one course. Considering all failures Meredith High School has a few less than the average.

3. Our classes are larger than the average class.

4. A large percentage of our pupils leave school between the freshman and senior years.

5. Our school year is between four and five days longer than the average school year.

In addition to the above statistics the 1931-32 state report previously quoted commends Meredith High School for:

Economies in keeping with the times have been made in our school paper, but the high standard of its fifteen years of existence has not been lowered, and "The Pinnacle" of today stands as an example of steady progress in the school paper world.

The Student Council

For ten years the council has received the deserving praise of all who came in contact with it, and at this time, in its eleventh year, it has become a student organization of service which has few if any equals.

Miscellaneous Activities

Prize Speaking:

The third annual Prize Speaking Contest took place on April 22, 1932. The Meredith High School Prize speaking pin was awarded to the winners: Hortense Hayward '32 and Gretchen Swain '32. The fourth contest will be held on April 14, 1933. This annual event, one of the pleasantest of the school year, is sponsored by one of our citizens, Mr. Stewart Bosson.

School assemblies are held each Thursday afternoon at 3:20 o'clock at the Town Hall. It is with pleasure that we find more and more of the parents and townspeople attending these exercises.

Memorial Exercises:

Few towns can boast of as loyal a group of school pupils. Memorial Day and Armistice Day find our pupils in full cooperation in all exercises of these holidays.

The Class As the Unit:

The class in both the senior and the junior high schools is emphasized and is an organized and self-governing unit which functions in an orderly manner under its chosen officers. It is the class that is the unit in all drives and activities in interest of the school as a whole, and to a great extent the success of our school functions and activities depends directly upon this class unit plan.

For the first time this year a plan for permanent recognition of class achievement has been adopted. The total registration of different pupils for the year 1931-32 was 407. Thirteen of these had been previously registered elsewhere.

There were 7 non-resident pupils in the elementary schools and 24 in the high school.

Thirty pupils had perfect attendance for the year.

There were 250 cases of tardiness or .6 per pupil, this is but two-thirds the average of the state.

Schools were in session 364 half days with a percentage of attendance of 95 plus.

State Comparison

According to the latest report Meredith ranks 106 out of the 243 districts of the state in cost of public education per \$1,000 of equalized valuation. That is 137 spend more in proportion to their wealth.

The median cost per pupil in the elementary schools for the state was \$82.11. Meredith per pupil was \$82.12.

The state median high school per pupil cost was \$118.15. For Meredith it was but \$89.55. The net per pupil cost, that is making allowance for tuition receipts, was but \$72.50 or less than the elementary cost by almost \$10.00 per pupil.
