COVID-19 Policies

Per new guidance from the University of Maine System, there is no longer a requirement for physical distancing, face coverings, or proof of vaccination/negative test to attend indoor non-instructional events.

Collins Center and Bangor Symphony Orchestra COVID-19 Guidance:

- Face coverings are no longer required, however, face coverings continue to be welcomed when individuals choose to wear them as a matter of personal choice.
- At this time, there is no longer a requirement for proof of vaccination or a negative COVID test to attend indoor non-instructional events.
- All individuals are **strongly** encouraged to obtain COVID-19 vaccination booster doses when eligible.
- Wash hands often.
- Stay home if experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19.
