☐ Scale aims to provide a universal screening tool for mental health issues


METHODS


- ☐ Focus groups of 3-5 students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade
- ☐ First focus group
- Look at existing tool
- Asked "When you see this picture, what feelings do you think of?" & "Is there a better picture to show this feeling?"
- Second focus group
- Review tool and see if we accurately conveyed their opinions from the first meeting.





CHALLENGES WITH VIRTUAL FOCUS GROUPS

- ☐ Time management; Consent and assent forms online; coordinating schedules
- ☐ Isolation within zoom rooms causing discomfort
- ☐ Exposure to others in the home may sway answers
- ☐ Possible power dynamic biases
- ☐ Technological difficulties with communication
- Removal of some social cues due to virtual environments inhibiting exposure of data points

- ☐ Face Validity
- ☐ Content Validity
- ☐ Inter-rater Reliability
- ☐ Test-Retest Reliability

CONCLUSION

- There are many challenges that arise when doing virtual focus groups, especially during a pandemic.
- ☐ Flexibility in dealing with such changes is paramount.
- ☐ Focus going forward is testing validity and revising tool as necessary.
