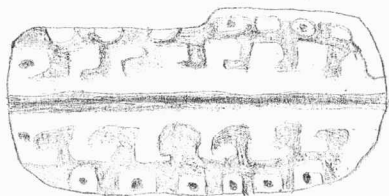

VERBAL DESCRIPTION:

This is a solid, trapezoidal stamp. It is nearly (93%) complete, with just the upper edge of the decorated surface broken away. The back of the stamp (underside) is trapezoidal in cross-section. The back of the trapezoidal section seems to have been used as a handle - there is no evidence of a separate, conical handle as seen for many stamps. The paste is fine with large, gritty inclusions (including quartzite). A few inclusions erode thru to the surface. The color is 10YR 6/4. There is slight discoloration on the upper right surface of the decorated surface. Design includes a horizontal groove down the center, with scrolls rising from each side. The design also includes punctated rectangles above/below the scrolls along the edge. Symmetrical. No trace of paint, slip, or other decoration.

VERBAL DESCRIPTION:

This is a small, fine potted, brown (melano/serlo-like) paste ceramic earflange. There are very fine traces of slip or possibly a self-slip (orange) on the exterior surface of the earflange. The surface is very smooth & it was likely smoothed or burnished. No visible firing cones, no visible incision or carving. 7.5 YR 4/2 color

VERBAL DESCRIPTION:

This is a very small earspool. It is made of ceramic (fine paste but a little coarser than Suro/melano paste). The paste is fine but there are larger inclusions. The surface is very smooth (no cord, part, or incision). The color ranges from light brown/buff (7.5YR 5/2) to dark brown - almost black (10YR 4/1).

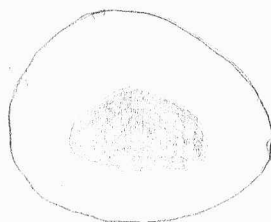
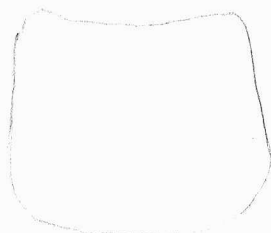

The shape itself is unusual - it doesn't seem to have been an handle as the unbroken end is large, bulbous & includes use wear on the base. The ends are also slightly bulbous on the sides. The slightly narrower end is broken. No carving, incision, slip, or paint.

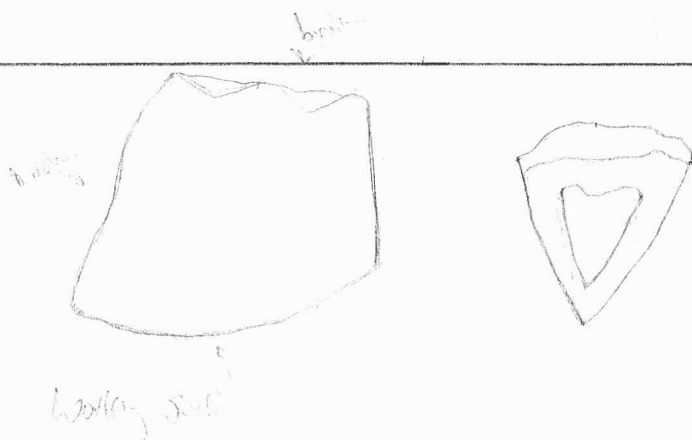

This is a greenstone hacha fragment. The fragment includes the rounded thin, wavy edge of the hacha. The piece is fractured along both its horizontal + vertical axis, so that approximately 25% is present. The edge (wavy) is very smooth + still quite sharp. The edges are faceted in the classic way associated with hachas in this area. No additional smoothing. The wavy surface does show a few chips in places.

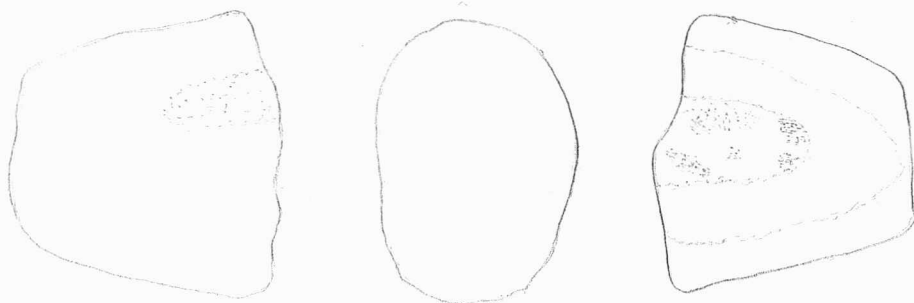

This is a small greenstone (most likely serpentine) hand grinding stone. This small greenstone mano is broken in the middle & tapers to the complete end. It is oval in cross-section & shows extensive use wear on one side & a small amount of polish & use wear on the opposite side. The stone is much darker color ~~in~~ in the area where it was used, & this area is, of course, much more polished. No conc. min or pyrit.

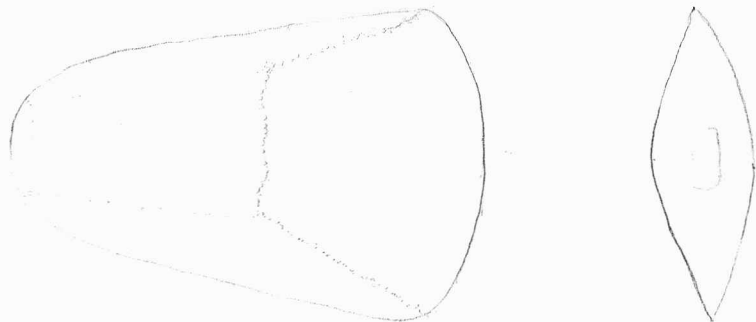

This is a complete (ie intact) Greenstone hacha. It includes a very highly polished working surface which is a darker green than the unpolished portion, which includes cortex deposits. The worked edge is very sharp & includes chips that indicate light use.

This is a small discoid jade bead that is very similar to the 9000+ found in the Margarita Tomb + other deposits in the Copan Acropolis. The jade itself is mottled with white + 2 shades of light green. The central hole is basically drilled + narrows significantly at the center. This does diff from the more cleanly drilled beads at Copan. No carving, slip, incision or other decoration.

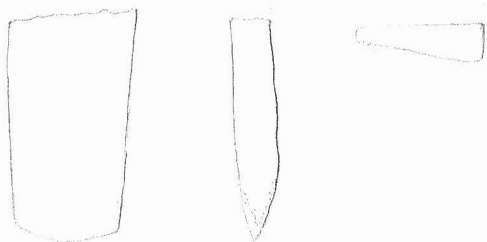

This is a very thin, fibre handle or (more likely) celt made of greenstone/serpentine. The celt is slightly thicker on one side than the other, so that the thick side is more squared off than the thin side. The celt tapers to a very thin, sharp cutting edge. The cutting edge is beveled on one side & it is this side that shows use wear on it. The top of the celt is also slightly undulated. There are striations of different colored material. No conch marks or other decoration.

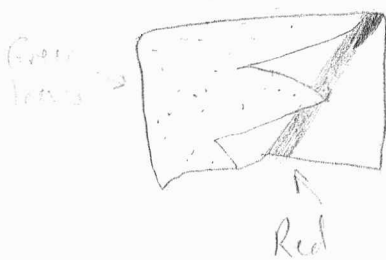

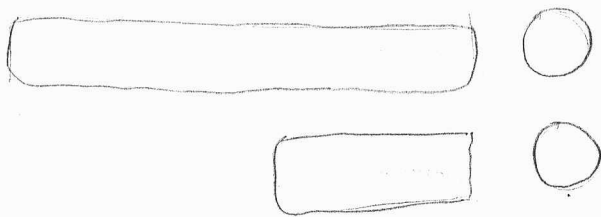

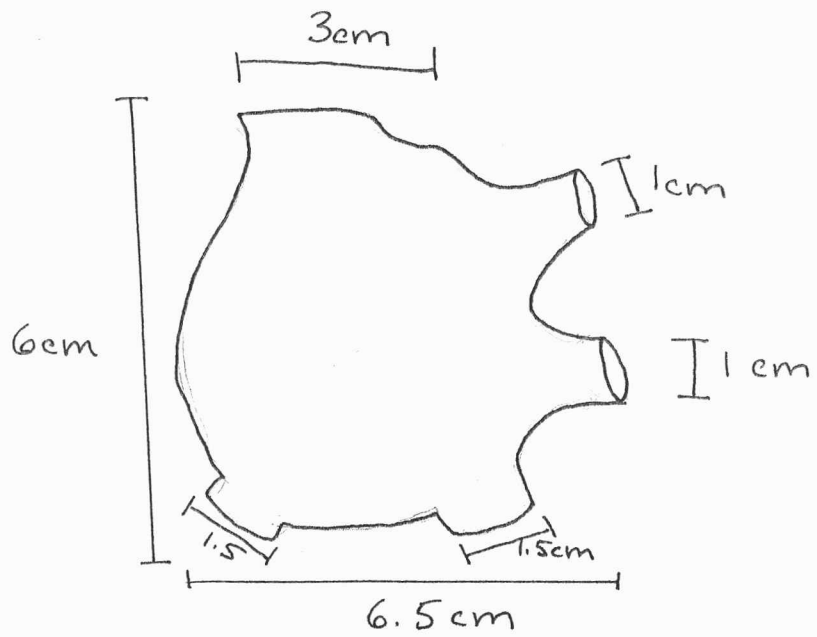
VERBAL DESCRIPTION:

This object is a small ceramic pitcher. It has a round body with three cylindrical legs. The legs are preserved to various lengths. Leg 1 = 1cm; Leg 2 = 0.8cm; leg 3 = 0.5cm. A 2.5cm long & 2cm wide spout rises up from ~~the~~ on side of the round body. The spout is very distinct and has a 0.4cm deep channel for liquid to travel down. On the opposite side of the body from the spout, a vertical handle was attached. The top attachment is 0.5cm below the rim of the pitcher. The bottom attachment is 1cm below the base of the top attachment, 3cm below the rim, and 1.5cm above the base. Each handle is oval 1cm (vertical) by 1.5cm (horizontal). The base of the pitcher is rounded.
