

Happy New Year!

As the new year arrives, we are already busy planning our 2023 season. Mark your calendars for the Fifth Maine-sponsored house tour on Saturday, July 22nd. It's been quite a few years since we've been able to have the tour, and we are looking forward to being able to visit our neighbors that have generously invited us into their homes.

This winter we are having the Fifth Maine's original second floor windows restored by Bagala Window Works, a preeminent historic window preservation firm in New England. In launching this project, our goal was to continue to seal the envelope of the building. Now that the windows have been removed and completely inspected, we've discovered that this work is even more critical than we suspected. Much of the rot on the windows and window sashes was not visible, and we are so relieved to be tackling this preservation project before it is too late! This kind of work continuously improves the structural integrity of the Fifth Maine and preserves our island's history. We are grateful to all the granting organizations and community members who have supported this important work.



Happy New Year, Peaks Islanders! We were so fortunate to celebrate the close of 2022 with an extraordinary author and illustrator visit in December from the island's own Jamie Hogan. Timing her visit to coincide with the Winter Solstice, Jamie featured her inspirations and techniques used for her gorgeous book Skywatcher throughout her presentations with each of our classes. To prepare for Jamie's visit and to welcome her, students created exquisite murals of evening scenes inspired by her book, as well as stars upon twinkling stars that are featured throughout the school.

During her day with us, Jamie provided each of our classes with a lens into her creative world beginning as a young artist in elementary school (her 2nd grade photo was particularly adorable). Students loved learning that many children on Peaks Island have served as models for her books throughout the years - with many students volunteering to be featured in her future books!

Jamie showed her many "dummy" or mockup books that were part of her process for creating Skywatcher. Following her presentations with each class, Jamie provided authentic opportunities for students to do their own creating with her interacting with them throughout the process. Students used a variety of art media to experiment and create. Their own creations included masks of nocturnal animals, observational drawings of items from nature and "zines" - mini eight-page illustrative narratives on topics of their choice.
