



THE ORONO CAMPUS

The University of Maine at Orono, with its seven colleges and four schools, is the largest campus in the statewide university system. There is plenty of elbow room on its 1,200 acres, where the student is offered the diversity and challenge of a large university in the invigorating atmosphere of a small college. Close personal contact among students, and among students and faculty, is a tradition at Orono, where one knows one's neighbors and teachers.

Prior to 1968, the campus was known as the University of Maine. In 1968, the State Legislature created a new system of public higher education for Maine. This action unified the University and the five state colleges into one "cohesive structure of public education in the State of Maine." It was at this time that the University adopted its present name.

Orono is a cosmopolitan campus in a classic New England setting. Last year, students from 45 states and 25 countries studied here. More than 20 percent of the total enrollment of over 11,000 students is ad-



mitted from outside the state of Maine.

There is ample opportunity for students to enrich themselves academically and socially outside the classroom. There are seven scholastic honor societies, four nonscholastic honor societies, 22 departmental and professional honor societies, 56 associations, clubs and organizations, and six religious groups. Nineteen fraternities and 10 sororities have chapters at Orono.

The campus is located one mile from the center of Orono, an attractive town of about 10,000 population, and 10 miles

from Bangor, the state's third largest city. It is in the center of the state's year-round outdoor recreation area, with ski slopes, scores of ponds, lakes, streams, and the beautiful Maine coast within easy driving distance.

Interstate Route 95, a scenic four-lane highway that bisects the state north to south to the New Hampshire state line, passes within a mile of the campus. Air travelers land at Bangor International Airport.

The University of Maine at Orono offers programs in physical education, intercollegiate athletics, intramural sports, recreation and related club activities. These programs are recognized as an integral part of the educational process which the university controls and supports within the limitations of budget, staff, equipment, and facilities. These programs are to promote educational leadership, physical fitness, opportunity for recreational pursuits, and athletic excellence through instruction and competition.

STU HASKELL

UMO's Director of Physical Education and Athletics is Stuart Haskell, Jr. Stu, who is the first UMO graduate and Maine native (Lincoln) to hold the Director's position, succeeded Harold Westerman on June 1, 1982. Stu has been a member of the UMO staff for nearly 25 years, serving as Assistant Director of Publicity between 1957 and 1965 and as Business Manager of Athletics between 1966 and 1983. He served as Director of Informational Services for the public schools of Evanston, III. in 1965 and early 1966. Stu is a journalism graduate of Maine and was employed for three years as a sportswriter for the Bangor Daily News and one year as Editor of The Republican Journal in Belfast in the mid-1950's. He and his wife, Gloria, are the parents of four children.



FOOTBALL AT MAINE

It all started in 1878 when an unidentified junior attempted to kick a round ball over Brice Hall (now Oak Hall) in his leisure time. History doesn't record whether or not he ever succeeded or how many panes of glass he broke in the process, but he sowed the seeds of a game which was officially launched at the University of Maine in 1892. That game was football.

The first few years were not fruitful ones for the UMO football team. From 1892 to 1900, the squad posted a 10-28 record with one tie. One important development occurred in 1896 when Jack Abbott, a Dartmouth graduate, was hired as Maine's first full-time football coach. It was also during this early period that systemized training was introduced and the use of a regular training table began.

The 1901 to 1920 period saw the first appearance of "Bananas," the black bear mascot, and the hiring of former Harvard star Jack Farley as head coach in 1901.

In 1921, "Foxy" Fred Brice began a 20-year coaching career at Maine which saw Black Bear teams win 79 games against only 58 losses and 15 ties. An innovative man, Brice specialized in trick plays and after a building year Maine went on to win State Series titles in seven of the next eight years. Tabbed as one of the finest periods in UMO football history, the years between 1925 and 1934 saw the Bears win unofficial New England titles in 1925, 1927, and 1928 and share one in 1926. From '31 to '34 Maine won 12 straight State Series games.

The years between 1941 and 1950 saw teams depleted of personnel by the war, several coaching changes, and a record of 26 wins, 28 losses and four ties. The most outstanding player of the period was Jack Zollo, a guard who suffered severe wounds in the war. He led Maine to a 6-1 record in '47 and was named to the All-America team.

In 1947, Maine along with the five other land-grant universities in New England formed the Yankee Conference, the first college football league of note in the east. UMO won its first Conference crown just two years later, in 1949, under a new coaching staff—one of the finest ever assembled in New England football history. Head Coach during 1949 and 1950 was Dave Nelson, who later became Delaware's most successful coach. His assistants were Harold "Westy" Westerman, who became Maine's winningest coach upon succeeding Nelson in 1951; Mike Lude, later head coach at Colorado State; and John Cuddeback.

The Westerman Era lasted from '51 to '66 and saw Maine teams win 80, lose only 38 and tie seven and chalk up 15 straight winning records. The '51 and '61 Bears were undefeated and the '65 team went to the Tangerine Bowl and won the Lambert Cup. Maine won Yankee Conference championships in 1951, 1952, 1961, and 1965. Two players, guard Tom Golden and linebacker John Huard, were named All-Americans during Westy's coaching career.


The year 1966 saw Westerman succeed Dr. Rome Rankin as Athletic Director and after the 1967 season he retired as head coach. He was succeeded by Walter Abbott, the popular line coach during the sixties under Westerman. After two seasons below .500, the 1969 Bears posted a 5-4 record.

Former Boston College assistant Jack Bicknell took over the Bears' helm in 1976 and immediately led Maine to a 6-5 record. In 1980, tailback Lorenzo Bouier earned All-America honors after setting UMO and New England records with 1,622 rushing yards on 349 carries.

Ron Rogerson took over the coaching duties in 1981 and reinstalled the Wing-T offense developed at Maine in early fifties. After a 3-7-1 first season, Rogerson molded a championship team in 1982 and captured a share of the Yankee Conference championship. The title was Maine's sixth. Rogerson was named 1982 Yankee Conference Coach of the Year. Halfback Lorenzo Bouier completed a sparkling career by breaking the then New England career rushing record with 3,828 yards. Along with Curt Warner of Penn State, Bouier was named Exemplary Player of the Year by Football Roundup Magazine and the Downtown Athletic Club of New York.

Following the championship season, Maine experienced two disappointing years in 1983 and 1984. Shortly after the end of the '84 season, Rogerson left Maine for a position at Princeton and was replaced by former All-Star Dartmouth quarterback Buddy Teevens. The hiring of Teevens, now the youngest coach in Division I football, sparked excitement. As offensive coordinator at Boston University, Teevens helped develop the offense that powered the Terriers to several appearances in the NCAA playoffs. The 1985 season promises to be an exciting one as the Multiple-I offense makes its debut at Maine.

Armed with a solid background, tradition and the current positive attitude, Maine football will strive to be exciting and competitive in one of the strongest football leagues in the country, the Yankee Conference.



1985 OUTLOOK

The 93rd season of Maine varsity football kicks off with a new look and a brand new coaching staff that promises to "fill the air with footballs." First year head coach Buddy Teevens, the youngest Division I football coach in the country, has installed a Multiple offense to replace the Wing-T. The new attack will feature plenty of passing as Teevens feels quarterback Bob Wilder has the ability to be a solid thrower.

The Bears are coming off a rebuilding season that saw them go 5-6-0 overall and 2-3-0 in the Yankee Conference (2-5-0 including non-counting games with YC members Delaware and Richmond). Maine started the season with four straight losses but finished strongly with a 4-1-0 mark down the stretch.

"One of my top priorities will be to make a smooth transition from the Wing-T to the Multiple pro-style offense," Teevens says. "On defense, we have to make our players more comfortable with multiple looks and frontal movement. We plan to emphasize the mental aspect of football as much as the physical side because I believe having a workable game plan is as important as actually executing it."


The coach also explains that he plans to continue some experimentation during the pre-season.

"We'll be looking at all our players and determining each one's strengths and weaknesses. Some of the players will be tried out at new positions to see how well they adjust. Because our staff is new, we really don't have a great deal of information to go by, although we did learn a great deal during the Blue-White game in April. Still, it's difficult to completely evaluate a player until you actually see him on the field in different situations. By the end of pre-season, we'll know the capabilities of each player and the team as a whole."

Overall, Teevens looks to establish a winning attitude for Maine football beginning with the 1985 season.

THE BLACK BEAR OFFENSE

Highlighted by the return of quarterback Bob Wilder, the Black Bear offense will feature 10 lettermen from last year's 5-6-0 team. However, the road will not be completely smooth for the offensive 11. Gone are 10 talented athletes including quarterback/punter Rich Labonte and kicker Jack Leone who holds almost every PAT and field goal mark at the University. Also graduated are last year's captain, full-



back Gary Hufnagle, and halfback Paul Phelan. With the conversion to a Multiple-I offense, the burden of the change will fall heavily on the offensive side of the line.

Up front on the line, six veterans return. Paul Buckley is the top letterman at left guard with John Colasacco returning at the right guard spot. Senior Tim Cahill and junior Dan Reilly alternate at center and both will challenge for the starting assignment this fall. Joe McDonald won his letter at right tackle and should figure to be the top player at the position going into the regular season. The left tackle spot is up for grabs but Tom Dioszeghy and Chuck Kasmer appear to be the early favorites to fight it out for the starting spot.

Although no lettermen return at tight end, two players look strong in the position. Junior Chris Peucker, at 6'3" and 220 pounds, has good size and strength. The other potential starter is sophomore Tony Lanza who also has good skills at 6'3" and 222.

Sophomore Dan Gordon is the leading returning receiver. Last year, he caught 16 passes for 277 yards which was just two behind Paul Phelan. His yardage led the team. Sergio Hebra caught six passes in eight games for 61 yards and should figure more prominently this year. The third returning letterman is Chris Gsell. The senior has been a reserve for most of his Maine football career but, like Hebra, figures to be more active this year. He caught two passes in five games for eight yards.

With one year of experience behind him, quarterback Bob Wilder is ready to take charge. Teevens feels that Wilder has the skills to become a strong passing quarterback and will work with the sophomore to complete his adjustment to the pro-style offense. Last year, Wilder threw 200 passes, completing 89 for 1,232 yards. His 1984 total of five touchdown passes should increase this year.

Two players return in the backfield but only one of them, Todd McAniff, was a regular. McAniff carried the ball 28 times in nine games, gaining 163 yards. He also scored one touchdown. The other returnee is Kurt Barnes who has seen only limited action in his first three years with the Bears.

One potentially weak area is Maine's kicking game. With the graduation of Jack Leone, three newcomers will be attempting to nail down the position. Jeff Topliff, who for the past few seasons has played on the Maine basketball team, is one of the candidates. Another is sophomore Pete Borjestedt and the third is Steve Ingram. All three will get plenty of practice during the spring with the hope that one emerges as the regular kicker.

THE BLACK BEAR DEFENSE

The Maine defense is expected to be the strongest it's been in quite some time thanks to the return of 15 lettermen from last year's team. In addition to the talent factor, the large number of returning defensive players will give the Bears the needed depth they lacked in previous years. A veteran returns at every position and at many positions, two or three returnees are in the depth chart.

Five players are back on the defensive line. Senior Skip Foley returns at left end


while on the right side, senior Steve Donahue and junior Chris Gillmann will be on patrol. Foley finished second last year in tackles with 69, including 43 solo efforts. Donahue posted 38 tackles and Gillmann was in on 33.

Left tackle will feature senior Ron Doody who, at 6'5" and 271, is one of the biggest players Maine has ever had. Doody recorded 62 tackles in 1984. Duane Ellis, another big player (6'1", 278), had 13 tackles and should improve in that department. The projected starter at right tackle is junior Ray Paquette. He had 61 tackles last year. The nose guard spot will be held by freshman Scott Nason (6'4", 235) and junior Steve Violette (6'1", 252).


Cornerback should be especially strong with the return of four players. On the left side, senior Gary Groves and junior Tom Digeronimo figure to be the key players. Groves recorded 56 tackles while Digeronimo had eight. At the right corner, look for junior Jay Davenport who had 50 tackles last year.

Another position where Maine is strong is linebacker. This group is led by team captain and senior Mark Coutts. Last year, he made 82 solo and 69 assisted tackles for a total of 151, the best on the team. Also returning is Jamie Keefe, a former CBS Chevrolet Player of the Game (against Rhode Island in 1983), who made 65 tackles. Senior Steve Root had 49 tackles and figures to do even better this year.

Senior Steve Costello leads the group returning at safety. Last year, he finished second on the team in tackles with 69. Other returning players are senior Jim Hinds, who had 27 tackles, and senior Rick Ouellette, who had 26.



COACHES



BUDDY TEEVENS — HEAD COACH Maine's new head football coach is Eugene "Buddy" Teevens who in early March became the University's 30th football coach in the 93-year history of the program. He succeeded Ron Rogerson who had resigned in December, 1984, to become the head coach at Princeton. At 28, Teevens is the youngest head coach in Division I football.

Teevens comes to Maine from Boston University, one of the most successful football programs in the Yankee Conference. While with the Terriers, he served as offensive coordinator and also coached the BU quarterbacks and receivers. Teevens was an integral part of building three consecutive NCAA playoff teams (1982, 1983 and 1984) that featured such Yankee Conference standouts as quarterback Jim English and flanker Bill Brooks.


Teevens is a 1978 graduate of Dartmouth where he completed an outstanding football career. He was the Ivy League's Most Valuable Player in 1978 and captained his senior year team. That season, he completed 154 of 259 passes for 1,808 yards and nine touchdowns to earn All-ECAC and All-America honors. He also quarterbacked the Blue squad in the 1979 Blue-Grey Football Classic. A multi-sport athlete at Dartmouth, Teevens also earned three letters playing on the Big Green hockey team.

After graduation, Teevens pursued a Master's Degree at Depauw University in Indiana where he also was a graduate assistant football coach. He left Depauw in 1980 to become an assistant at BU.

Teevens is a strong believer in the pass-

ing attack and has promised to completely reorient the Maine offense towards a passing game. After a successful spring practice, the team is well on its way to successfully implementing the plan.

Buddy and his wife, Kirsten, live in Orono, just down the street from Memorial Gym and Alumni Field.


TIM MURPHY - OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/OFFENSIVE LINE Tim Murphy (Springfield '78) comes to Maine after serving as the offensive line and tight end coach at Boston University for the past three seasons. During that period, the Terriers made three consecutive trips to the NCAA playoffs and won three Yankee Conference titles. Murphy was a four-year starter at linebacker and defensive end at Springfield where he won the College's Most Courageous Football Player Award twice and Most Courageous Athlete Award in his senior year. In 1977, he was named to the UPI All-New England team. After graduation, he spent two seasons at Brown where he first was a scout for the varsity team and offensive line coach for the freshman squad, and then served as varsity offensive line coach and JV head coach. In 1981, he moved on to Lafayette where he coached the defensive line for a season. Murphy is single and lives in Orono.

BRUD BICKNELL — RUNNING BACKS

Harrison "Brud" Bicknell (Ohio Wesleyan '81) will coach Maine's running backs this fall after having served as a graduate assistant at Wake Forest last year. While at the Winston-Salem, NC campus, Bicknell coached the Demon Deacon tight ends. Bicknell began his college playing career at Harvard where he put in two years before transferring to Ohio Wesleyan in 1978. While at Ohio Wesleyan, he was actively involved with the school's athletic




program, serving as President of the Physical Education Club and on the Committee on Intercollegiate Athletics. After exhausting his eligibility, Bicknell served as a student assistant, coaching the receivers. In 1981, following graduation, he went to Dublin High School in Ohio to teach math and coach football and softball. In 1983, he moved on to Wake Forest. Bicknell, who was married during the summer, lives in Orono.



JOHN LOVETT - DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR/DEFENSIVE BACKS

Maine's new defensive coordinator is John Lovett (C.W. Post '73) who begins his tenure at Orono after a season as an assistant coach with the New York Jets of the National Football League. While with the Jets, Lovett was responsible for the statistical breakdown of game films using an IBM PC AT computer, assisting with the defensive note book and game plan and running the scouting team. A four-year player at C.W. Post, Lovett captained his senior team. After graduation he received his Master's of Education from the University of Denver and then went on to assistant coaching positions at St. Joseph's Regional High School in Montvale, NJ, Union College and Brown before joining the N.Y. Jets in 1984. In addition to football, he also has coaching experience in basketball, track, skiing, wrestling and baseball. Lovett is single and lives in Orono.




STEVE ROBICHAUD — DEFENSIVE LINE

Steve Robichaud (Springfield '78) returns to Maine as the Black Bears' defensive line coach after four and a half years as the offensive line coach at Worcester Polytechnic Institute. He was also responsible for the WPI specialty teams and supervised the team's weight training program. Prior to his stint at WPI, Robichaud was a graduate assistant at UMO under current Boston College coach Jack Bicknell. During this period, Robichaud coached the defensive ends and was the defensive coordinator for the JV team. In college, he

was a four-year regular at linebacker and co-captained his freshman squad. During his senior year, he also coached Springfield's freshman basketball team. After graduation, he received his Master's of Education from Maine. Steve and his wife, Becky, live in Orono.




MIKE HUTCHINS — DEFENSIVE ENDS Mike Hutchins (Maine '76) will be Maine's


defensive ends coach this fall. The only coach returning from last year's staff, this will be Hutchins' first full-time college position. Last year, he served as a part-time coach assisting in the development and evaluation of the offensive backs. Following last year's departure of Ron Rogerson and his staff, Hutchins became a full-time coach, responsible for recruiting and academic counseling. He began his college career at Dean Junior College in 1973 and then transferred to Maine. He played both football and baseball at Orono. From 1977 to 1980, he served as assistant football coach at Brewer High and head baseball coach at Brewer Junior High. In 1981, he became head football coach at Orono High where he compiled a 25-5-0 record in three years, winning one State Class B title and finishing second once. Mike and his wife, Carol, live in Orrington.

TIM FITZGERALD - LINEBACKERS


Tim Fitzgerald (Mount Union '80) is Maine's new linebacker coach and comes to Orono after three successful seasons as a parttime assistant coach at Boston College. While at BC, Fitzgerald handled a wide variety of duties including working with the Eagle tight ends, offensive tackles, wide receivers and the defensive secondary. Fitzgerald played four years at linebacker at Mount Union in Canton, Ohio, earning



Junior Year: Mark was a defensive machine last year as he was far and away the star of the defensive unit. He registered 82 solo tackles and assisted on 69 others for a total of 151, more than twice as many as the second best mark on the team. In addition, he recovered two fumbles, sacked the opposing quarterback four times, broke up two passes and intercepted two passes. He was named to the ECAC Honor Roll three times during the season and was picked as the Yankee Conference Defensive Player of the Week once. He was a second team All-Yankee Conference pick at linebacker and an honorable mention pick on the Associated Press' All-New England team.

Sophomore Year: Mark was a reserve linebacker and was in on 41 tackles including 24 solo efforts.

Freshman Year: Mark played on the specialty team in his first Maine season. He returned one kickoff for 14 yards in the five games he played. In addition, he also competed on the baseball team.

High School: Mark was named the MVP of his Edward Little High football team in senior year. Coached by Robert Fallon and Lawrence Hersom, he was chosen as the school's best male athlete. He also competed on the basketball and baseball teams.

Family: Mark is the son of Carole Coutts. He has a sister, Kathy, and two brothers, Mike and John. Mike is a former football and baseball Black Bear.




