"Three American Revolutions" — Keynote to the entire summer

"The Age of Violence" — The love of God, love of neighbor, and love of self as taught by Jesus can resolve our age of violence, reduce the crime rate, and restore inner peace.

"Are We Worshipping a Criminal God?"— The God of love and infinite mercy, who forgives even the worst of criminals who repent, will be presented.

"Hate Thy Neighbor"— We have lost the sense of love of neighbor, esteeming our needs higher than his.

"The Crimes We Commit Against Ourselves"— The problems of drugs, mental illness, loss of identity, alcoholism are crimes against ourselves. When we recover a healthy regard for our own selves, our own souls, our natures as created by God and bearing His image, we no longer commit these crimes.

"Hatred Is Only Skin Deep"—Race problems, even though they manifest themselves on many levels, in schools, jobs, housing, can be solved by the love of God, neighbor, and self.

"Is Jehovah God a Racist?"— God's nature as Creator of all men and

as the Sovereign One who reveals His same will for all men will be presented.

"Some of My Best Friends"— What love of neighbor means in the everyday world.

"Are You a Respecter of Persons?"—How "love thy neighbor as thyself" implies a respect for self that has no need to feel superior to other individuals or groups.

"The New Religion of Pleasure"— The threefold principles of love of God, neighbor, and self are presented as the answers of the "new morality."

"The Ancient God 'Eros' Resurrected"— The Biblical meaning of love (agape) expressed in Christ, contrasted to physical desire (eros).

"Male and Female He Created"— Man and woman are not intended to be complete without each other. The Biblical example of husband and wife is shown.

"After Sexual Freedom, What Then?"— The need for a proper understanding of oneself in order to live a life properly related to others and to God.
