Registration Fee Reduction

Registration fees at Cal State, San Bernardino are being reduced for the 1989-90 academic year as a result of improved revenue allotments for the California State University system in the newly adopted state budget.

Students who will be taking six units or less this fall will pay \$187, which is \$10 less than the previous fee schedule. Students taking more than six units will save \$14 and pay \$287 per quarter, said Don Sapronecchi, accounting officer. The new fee schedule reflects some costs for student services, but does not include parking and assessments for special courses such as art.

"Students who have already registered through our advance computerized system and paid their fees in full will receive a difference refund by check in the first week of November," Sapronecchi said. "That affects about 1600 people."

An additional 4400 students who chose to defer their fees during advance registration will receive a bill that is payable by Aug. 4 and reflects the new rate, he added.

Those students who register throughout August and September will be assessed fees at the adjusted rate.

The new fee schedule for 1989-90 reflects a 3.6 percent increase in course fees over last year as approved by the CSU Board of Trustees in October 1988. A maximum 10 percent increase was proposed by the Governor and approved by the Trustees in March when revenue projections for the state were bleak. Since then, state economic indicators have improved and the fee increase has been restored to 3.6 percent.
