ART WORKSHOP

Lesson plan #3 May 13th 2015

Student Learning Outcomes:

- Student will create original art using different media such as colored pencils; water colors markers, and crayons.
- Students will create, reflect, and question why this is art.
- Students will be able to identify various artistic patterns such as; cross hatching, hatching, paisley, and illuminated text.

Age Level: Adult

Introduction: Then teachers will give a small presentation on the history drawing and doodling and how Zen principles apply to this particular project and open a discussion with the students on the topic.

- Project: Zen doodle
 - > Students will use various media to draw or doodle multiple designs on to a piece of card stock.
 - > When finished the students will place the art on a colored piece of construction paper.
 - > Teachers will provide examples of various patterns that the students can choose to execute.

Materials: Construction paper, card stock, colored pencils, water colors, crayons, glue sticks.

Essential Question: What is art?

Reflection: At the end of class the Teacher will ask students to reflect on why this exercise would be considered art.

Wrap-up: The last portion of class the Teacher will ask for feedback on the project and discuss the agenda for the next class as well as ask students to look for patterns in the world; this will wrap up the third class.
