

When giving feedback, think FAST Frequent, Appropriate, Specific Timely



Assess the resident's goal. Focus on specifics. **Don't generalize**





Limit amount of feedback to three or fewer observations


Collect your data and observation






Use descriptive, non-evaluative language and questions



Focus on remediable behaviors, feasible solutions





Encourage self reflection. Assess understanding and acceptance of feedback **Summarize and reinforce** positive behavior. Plan to follow up on progress
