# MLK 2010 ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

**2:00 - 2:50 Room 320** **Racialized Role Strain in the Academy: Tensions, Tribulations, Triumphs"**  
 Learn about and discuss campus racial climate, including strategies to navigate and manage tensions. The concept of Racial Battle Fatigue will be highlighted, along with methods for successfully reducing tensions within the work environment.

**2:00 - 2:50 Room 330** **The meeting (Malcolm X and MLK)**  
 This dramatic performance of Jeff Stetson's one-act play explores a fictional meeting between Martin Luther King Jr. and Malcolm X. The two leaders share their views about world events during the 1960s and their different approaches to resolve challenges.

**2:00-2:50 Room 352** **Lost Voices - Bayard Rustin**  
 Civil rights activist Bayard Rustin organized the 1963 March on Washington, one of the largest nonviolent protests ever held in the USA, using Gandhi's protest techniques. Film clips and discussions will highlight Bayard's activities, which include molding Martin Luther King Jr. into an international symbol of peace and nonviolence.

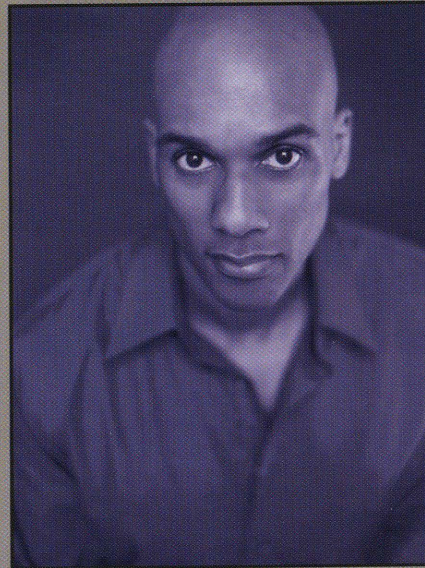


## TV HOST, AUTHOR TO SERVE AS EMU'S MLK JR. CELEBRATION KEYNOTE SPEAKER
