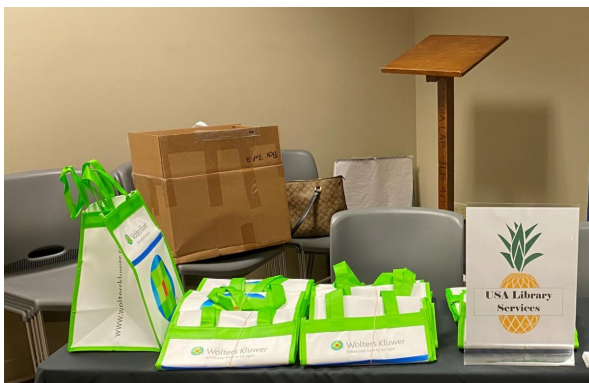
Digital Theater+ can be useful to faculty and students not only in the Department of Theatre & Dance but also to those in English and Music.

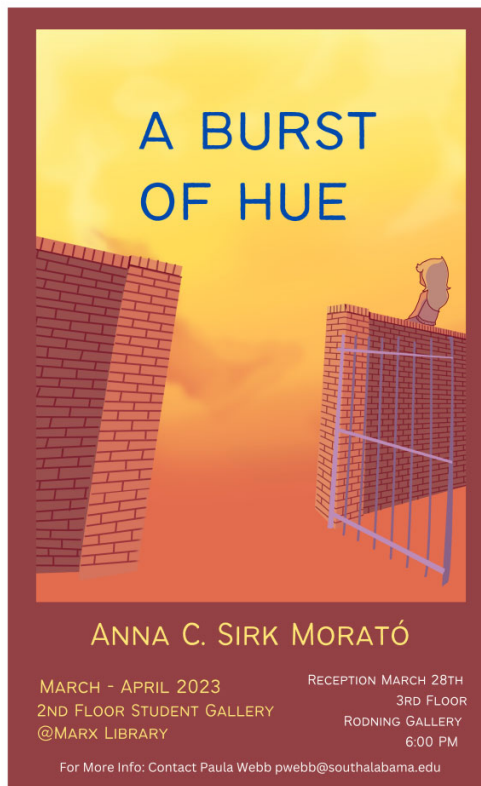
