The corn in question. there is every reason to believe, was left by

the rebels when they were compelled by our army to Evacuate Frederick Dung. It was a prize of war, and became the property of the United Funtes, and your claim to it, because it was lesh in your ware house, and the rebels livere judetted to you for feerwisking their army with hospital functure, cannot be admitted.
