8	Whereas, The Associated Students of the University of Montana ("ASUM") are the governing		
9	body of the University of Montana ("UM") students;

11	Whereas, ASUM currently has five core values: Accessibility, Advocacy, Inclusivity,		
12	Transparency, and Service ¹ ;		
13			
14	Whereas, Current sections of the ASUM Bylaws (the "Bylaws") pertaining to being		
15	unknowingly endorsed by a third-party are unclear;		
16			
17	Whereas, The Elections Committee and the ASUM Senate ("Senate") of 2021-2022 have		
18	expressed issues with the language in these two sections;		
19			
20	Whereas, Article V, Section 2(11) of the Bylaws currently states:		
21			
22	(11)	Candidates may only receive endorsements for their campaigns from	
23		individual members. Individuals endorsing candidates may not speak on	
24		behalf of any third-party organizations, including but not limited to,	
25		ASUM member organizations, fraternities and sororities, academic	
26		departments, University sports teams, social media pages or groups that	
27		do not clearly represent an individual member, non-profit organizations,	
28		and private companies; however, individuals endorsing candidates may	
29		mention their involvement in any of these groups without it being	
30		perceived as a group endorsement.;

32	Whereas, Art	icle V, Section 5(3) of the Bylaws currently states:	
33			
34	(3)	Any Candidate or Candidate Team seeking an office within ASUM, who	
35		claims to be unknowingly endorsed by a Member Organization or Third-	
36		party shall be brought before the Elections Committee, who shall then	
37		recommend a course of action, which the Senate must approve with a two-	
38		thirds (¾) majority vote.;

40	Therefore, Let It Be Resolved, That Article V, Section 2(11) of the Bylaws be amended to state:		
41			
42	(11)	Candidates may only receive endorsements for their campaigns from	
43		individual members. Individuals endorsing candidates may not speak on	
44		behalf of any third-party organizations, including but not limited to,	
45		ASUM member organizations, fraternities and sororities, academic

Candidates who are unknowingly endorsed by a third-party or member organization shall not receive a violation or sanctions if the Elections Committee determines that the endorsement was in fact done without the Candidate's or Candidate Team's knowledge.;
