7 Whereas, The Associated Students of the University of Montana (“ASUM”) is governed by its
8 Bylaws;

9
10 Whereas, Article IV, Section 14 currently reads:

11 ***Section 14. Sustainability Board***

12
13 (1) *The Board shall be composed of nine (9) voting members, of which three (3)*
14 *shall be Senators, three (3) shall be students-at-large, and three (3) shall be*
15 *either Senators or student-at-large receiving priority. The Director of the*
16 *ASUM Sustainability Center shall serve a non-voting member of the Board.*

17
18 (2) *A Senator and the Sustainability Coordinator shall co-chair the Board.*

19
20 (3) *The Board shall ensure that student interests are considered in the ASUM*
21 *Sustainability Center’s priorities, advocate for sustainability policies and*
22 *interests, and hold stakeholders on passed resolutions regarding*
23 *sustainability accountable by following up.*

25 (4) *Duties and functions of the Board shall include:*

26 (a) *Ensure that student interests are considered in creating policies and*
27 *projects within the ASUM Sustainability Center by helping the*
28 *Sustainability Coordinator decide on these matters;*

29 (b) *Act as a liaison between Senate and the ASUM Sustainability*
30 *Coordinator to communicate sustainability interests;*

31 (c) *Advocate for sustainability interests generated from the Committee to*
32 *the Senate where appropriate;*

33 (d) *Draft resolutions pertaining to sustainability needs and advocacy,*
34 *follow up on previously written resolutions, and hold stakeholders*
35 *accountable.;*

38 Whereas, Most ASUM committees are concerned with the internal administration of the
39 association;

40
41 Whereas, The Sustainability Board has been largely inactive for the past few years;

42
43 Whereas, The time Senators volunteer towards ASUM should be rewarding and fruitful;

44
45 Whereas, Senators may, and often do, pursue initiatives pertaining to sustainability without
46 needing to collaborate with a committee;

47
48 Whereas, On September 8, 2021 the Senate passed SB06-21/22 Resolution Striking Eight ASUM
49 Committees from the Bylaws and Repurposing the Sustainability Board¹;

51 Therefore, Let It Be Resolved, That Article IV, Section 14 of the Bylaws be struck;

53 Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That subsequent sections in Article IV be renumbered as
54 appropriate;

55
56 Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That all instances of the ASUM Sustainability Board be
57 removed from the ASUM Governing Documents;

59 Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That this Resolution be sent to Alex Berna, ASUM
60 Secretary; Gwen Coon, ASUM Office Manager.
