8 9 10	Whereas, The Associated Students of the University of Montana ("ASUM") is bound by its governing documents;	
10 11 12	Whereas, ASUM relies on the Bylaws in order to conduct fair and equitable elections;	
13 14	Whereas, The current Bylaws regarding elections can be confusing for Members running in an election, are repetitive, and contain dilatory language;	
15 16 17	Whereas, In an effort to ensure accessibility for Members running in elections, these Bylaws required immense restructuring, rewording, general clarification, and revision;	
18 19 20	Whereas, Section 6 in Article V currently outlines grievances and Elections Committee duties;	
21 22	Whereas, Article V, Section 6 of the Bylaws currently states:	
23 24 25 26 27 28 29	(1)	Any member who wishes to file a grievance concerning any action involved with campaigning or the election, including, but not limited to, rules violated by other candidates, voting discrepancies, and other procedures may submit a signed grievance to the Elections Committee no later than 9:00 a.m. of the second business day following the election results being published.
30 31 32 33 34	(2)	The Elections Committee shall examine the grievance in an executive session and decide what action, if any, is warranted. All rulings made by the Elections Committee shall be subject to Senate approval by a two-thirds $(\sqrt[2]{3})$ majority vote.
35 36 37 38 39	(3)	The Elections Committee may invalidate the results of any election and demand a new election, but the Committee must do so before the first Senate meeting following the election, and such a motion to invalidate must be approved by a two-thirds $(\frac{2}{3})$ majority vote of the Senate
40 41 42 43 44	(4)	Sanctions include, but are not limited to, censure, the withholding of ASUM campaign funding, manual removal of specific campaign materials, and disqualification, all of which must be approved by a two-thirds (¾) majority vote of the Senate.;
45 46 47	Whereas, Invalidating an Election is a significant and consequential decision that will affect ASUM greatly;	

48 Whereas, Because the invalidation of an Election is so sizeable, it is important the Elections 49 Committee be in near agreeance on their decision; 50 51 Whereas, Most votes regarding the overturning of a decision or other significant decisions 52 require a two-thirds (3) majority vote in Robert's Rules; 53 54 Therefore, Let It Be Resolved, Article V, Section 6 of the Bylaws be amended to state: 55 56 Any **Mm**ember who wishes to file a grievance concerning any action (1)involved with campaigning or the election, including, but not limited to, 57 rules violated by other Ceandidates or Candidate teams, voting 58 59 discrepancies, and other procedures may submit a signed grievance to the 60 Elections Committee no later than 9:00 a.m. of the second business day following the election results being published. 61 62 The Elections Committee shall examine the grievance in an executive 63 (2)64 session and decide what action, if any, is warranted. - the results of any election and demand a new election on the basis the Committee has determined that any actions have compromised the integrity of the election. but Tthe Committee must do so before the first Senate meeting following the election, and such a motion to invalidate must be approved by a two-thirds (%) majority vote of the Senate.
- Sanctions include, but are not limited to, censure, the withholding of (4)ASUM campaign reimbursement, manual removal or requests for removal of specific campaign materials, and/or disqualification. Sanctions must be approved by a two-thirds (%) majority vote of the Senate.;
