The Associated Students of the University of Montana 1 2 Resolution Encouraging Campus Dining to Implement a Round-Up Donation System to 3 **Mitigate Basic Needs Insecurity** 4 October 22, 2021 5 SB50-21/22 6 Authored by: Cassandra Williams, ASUM Senator; Kat Cowley, ASUM Bear Necessities 7 Director; 8 9 Whereas, The Associated Students of the University of Montana ("ASUM") has a duty to represent and serve the University of Montana ("UM") student body; 10 11 12 Whereas, The term "basic needs" refers to equitable access to "nutritious and sufficient food, safe/secure/adequate housing, healthcare to sustain mental and physical well-being, affordable 13 transportation, affordable technology, resources for personal hygiene care, and childcare related 14 needs"1; 15 16 17 Whereas, 63% of UM students who responded to the 2020 #RealCollege survey faced some form of Basic Needs Insecurity ("BNI"), an increase from the 58% reported in the 2019 survey²³; 18 19 20 Whereas. The rate of students experiencing BNI at UM was 10% higher than the average four-21 year institution in 2020⁴; 22 Whereas, Food insecurity disproportionately affects students who identify as BIPOC, 23 24 LGBTQIA+, disabled, veteran, and nontraditional; 25 26 Whereas, UM's mission statement reads: 27 28 The University of Montana transforms lives by providing a high-quality and accessible education and by generating world-class research and creative scholarship in an 29 30 exceptional place. We integrate the liberal arts and sciences into undergraduate, 31 graduate and professional studies to shape global citizens who are creative and agile learners committed to expanding the boundaries of knowledge and to building and 32 33 sustaining diverse communities⁵; 34 35 Whereas, Helping students to meet their basic needs is an important component of ensuring that 36 getting an education at UM is accessible; 37

38 Whereas, partnerships in support of UM's mission statement are one of Campus Dining's shared 39 values and guiding principles⁶; 40 41 Whereas, ASUM and Campus Dining are partners in ensuring food security on campus; 42 43 Whereas, ASUM's Basic Needs Committee advises and supports the Bear Necessities Agency 44 and UM Food Pantry; 45 46 Whereas, The UM Food Pantry's AmeriCorps VISTA is currently engaged in capacity building 47 to expand the Food Pantry's ability to serve students experiencing BNI; 48 49 Whereas, Community efforts to address BNI often rely on charitable donations; 50 51 Whereas, Rounding up to the nearest dollar for donations is a common charitable practice at 52 many stores and food chains; 53 54 Whereas, Campus Dining locations support BNI-related charitable giving by asking customers to 55 donate to the annual Can the Cats food drive; 56 57 Whereas, Campus Dining supports food access by accepting Supplemental Nutrition Assistance 58 Program ("SNAP") Electronic Benefit Cards at the Corner Store, UC Market, and its campus 59 workplace Community Supported Agriculture ("CSA") program⁷; 60 61 Therefore, Let It Be Resolved, That ASUM encourages Campus Dining to prompt its customers to voluntarily round up to the nearest dollar at checkout for the purpose of donating to BNI 62 63 programs and services on campus; 64 65 Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That such programs and services include the UM Food 66 Pantry, emergency aid funds, scholarships for counseling fees at Curry Health Center, and other 67 similar programs; 68 69 Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That the receiving program of these donations be rotated 70 on a semi-semesterly basis; 71 72 Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That ASUM encourages Campus Dining to prompt 73 customers donate to the student support programs listed above when placing orders through UM 74 Catering: 75 Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That the Executives, ASUM Bear Necessities Agency 76 77 Director and Campus Dining be charged with working to accomplish this task alongside all 78 necessary stakeholders; 79 80 Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That this Resolution be sent to Kat Cowley, ASUM Bear
