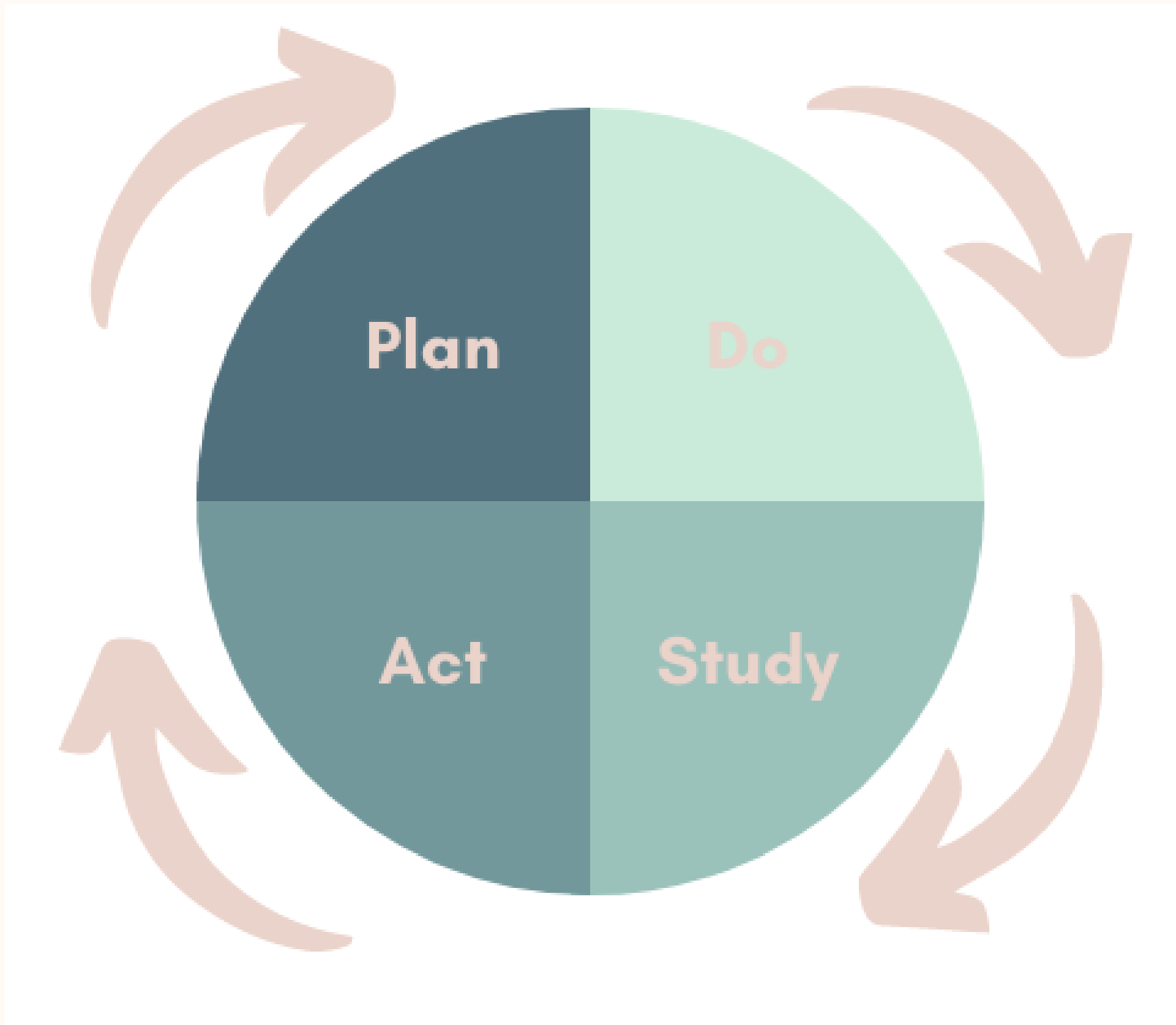

 - classroom components

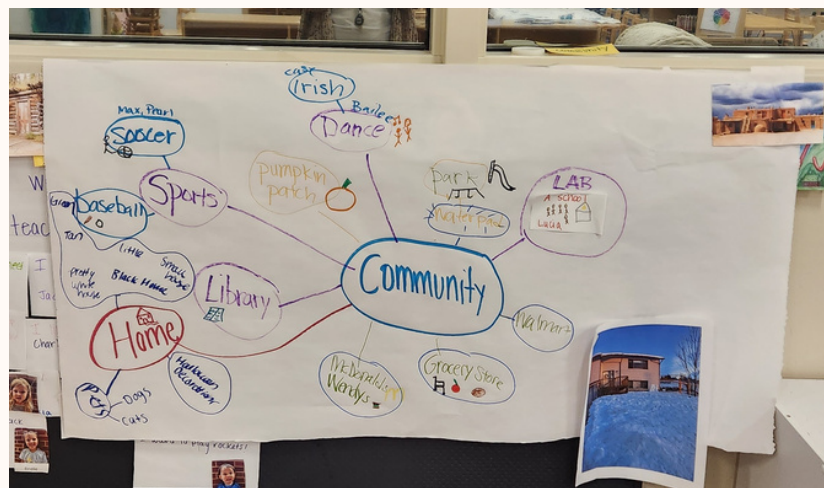

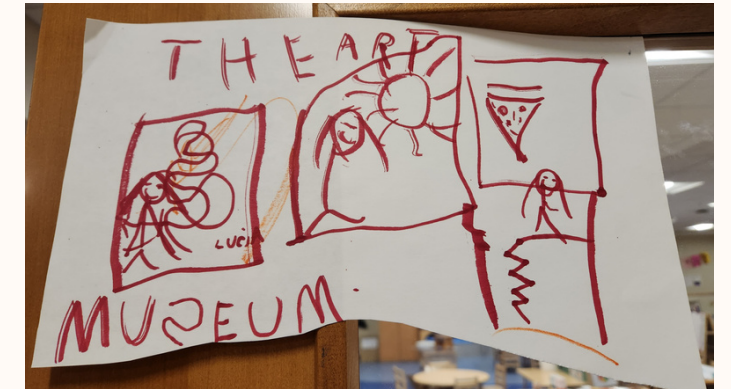

- set more specific goals for reflection

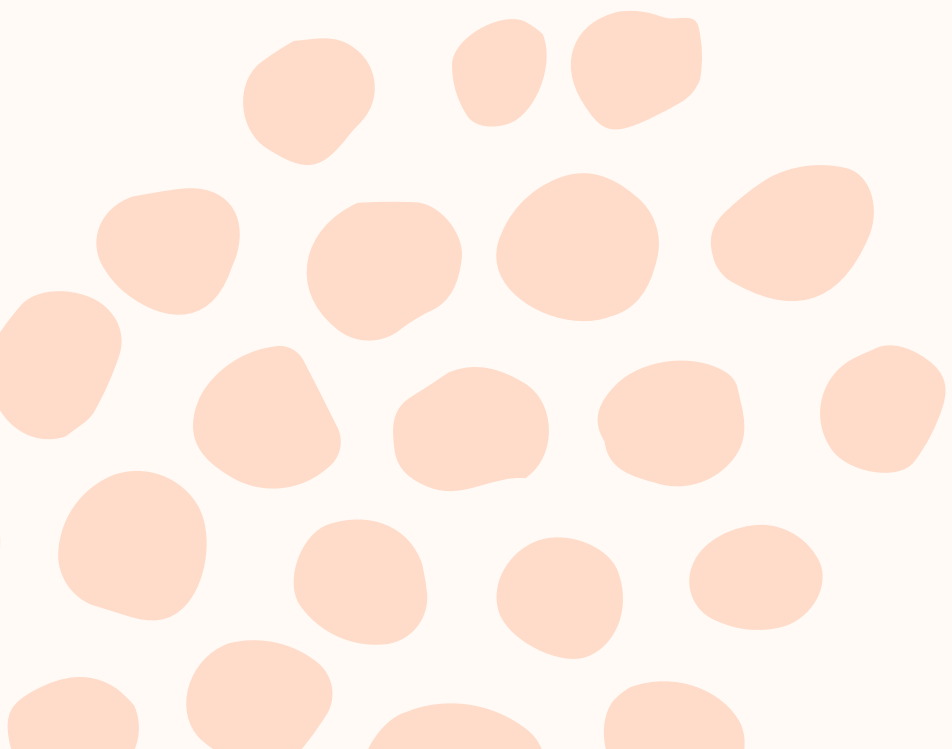


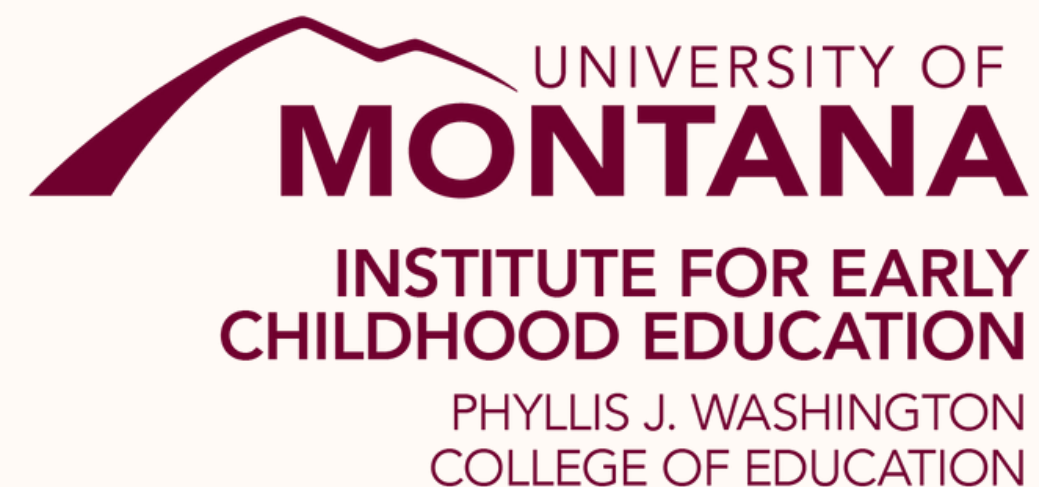
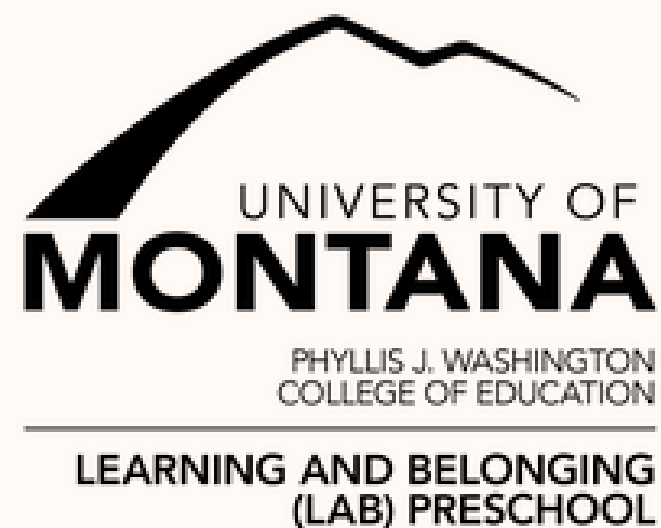
