## THE PROCESS:

WHEN MAKING THE MENORAH, I BEGAN WITH DESIGNING THE STRUCTURE ON THE TINKERCAD WEBSITE. I HAD BEEN WORKING WITH TINKERCAD THE ENTIRE SEMESTER, SO I WAS WELL VERSED ON HOW TO USE IT; FOLLOWING THE INITIAL DESIGNING PROCESS, SENT OVER THE DESIGN TO THE 3D PRINTER AND WAITED APPROXIMATELY 13 HOURS FO THE MENORAH TO PRINT. IN THE MEANTIME, I HEATED UP SOME WAX ON A STOVE AN GATHERED SOME CUT UP WICKS FROM SOME CANDLES THAT I HAD FOUND IN THE CLASSROOM. I DIPPED THE WICKS INTO THE HOT WAX, WHICH TOOK A BIT OF PRACTICE TO PERFECT, BUT AFTER WHILE, I WAS ABLE TO CREATE THE & CANDLES. I ALLOWED THEM TO DRY, AND ONCE THE MENORAH WAS READY, I MADE SURE THE CANDLES WERE THE PERFECT SIZE FOR THEIR PLACEHOLDERS.




FIGURE 1. CREATING THE MENORAH ON TINKERCAD

#### SOME FRRORS

ALTHOUGH THIS PROJECT TURNED OUT SUCCESSFUL, THERE WERE SOME ERRORS ALONG THE WAY. THE FIRST ERROR WAS THAT I INITIALLY PRINTED TOO SMALL OF A MENORAH, AND THE PLASTIC HOLDING THE CANDLES WAS TOO THIN AND BROKE EASILY, SO I HAI TO START FROM SCRATCH AND MAKE A NEW ONE. MY SECOND ERROWAS THAT I PRINTED THE WHOLE MENORAH AS ONE PIECE. I SHOULD HAVE PRINTED THE MENORAH IN SEPARATE PIECES BECAUSE IT WAS FRAGILE AND BROKE ALMOST INSTANTLY. TO FIX THIS, I HAD TO DRILL A HOLE INTO THE CENTER OF THE MENORAH, AND INSERT AND GLUE A DOWEL TO ALL THE PIECES IN ORDER TO MAKE SURE THAT THE STRUCTURE WAS SECURE. I USED A CLAMP TO TAKE EXTRA PREFCAUTION IN ENSURING THAT THE DOWEL WOULD HOLD
