There are twelve practicing D.O.s in the entire State. Only fifteen years ago there were twenty-six. There are many areas open for osteopathic general manipulative practices. I have enclosed a map with a description for your perusal, noting the areas which are fertile for osteopathic practices.

Dover is open as a costal region. There is no D.O. there now and formerly there were D.O.s in the area, therefore, it is philosophically osteopathic, and I am sure you could obtain hospital privileges in Sanford and Biddeford, Maine.

Any of these areas would be a spot for a successful practice, particularly in the manipulative realm, although hospital privileges are available in these areas, especially Claremont and Laconia. As one of three practicing D.O.s in the largest city in New Hampshire I have a full manipulative practice and do not at this time wish to have hospital privileges.

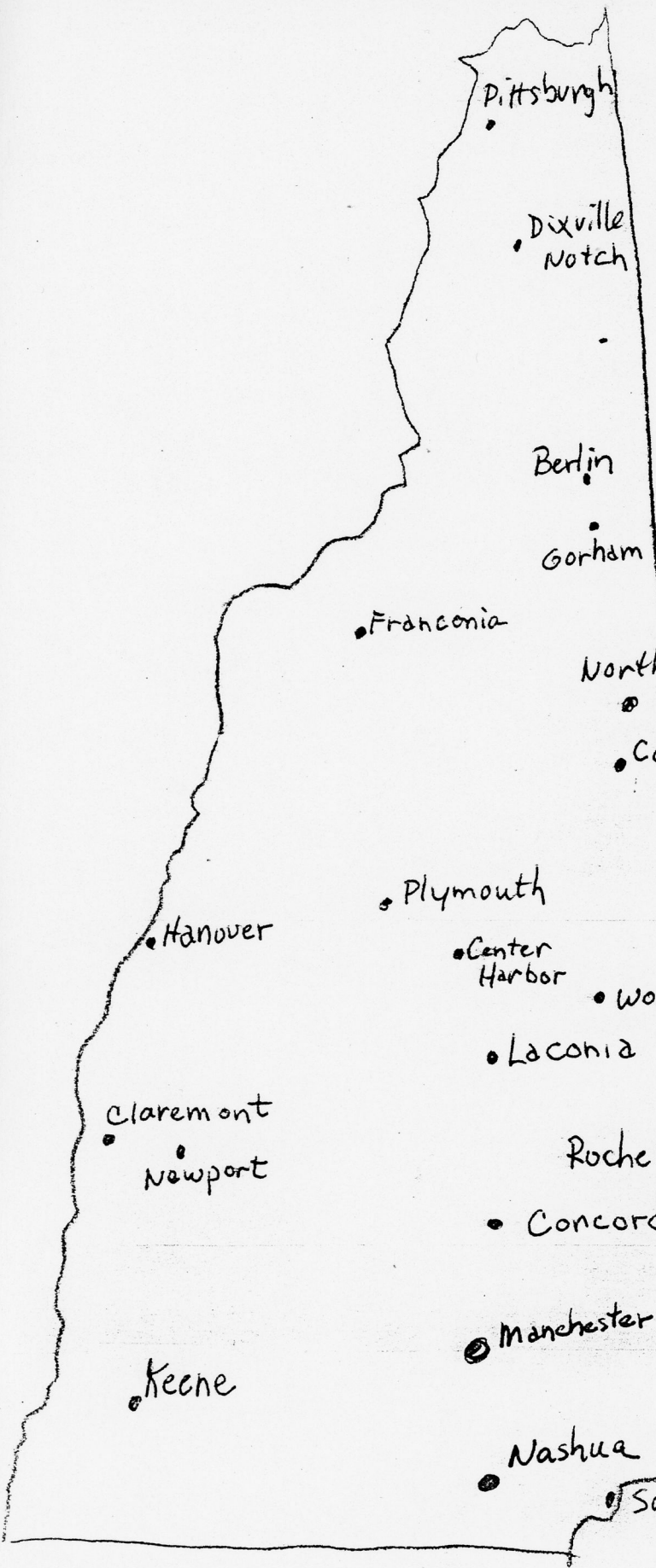
On behalf of the New Hampshire Osteopathic Association I extend a welcoming hand to you and hope you will join us in the beautiful State of New Hampshire.
