Dear Mother + Dad:

I suppose you have rested up from your trip by now and are settled again at home. I surely did enjoy seeing you up here, and wished I could have spent more time with you doing things. We are more rushed than ever at the office and they are dividing us into two shifts until the pressure is over. We have to get a thousand people for Baltimore within two weeks, and all leave in our division has been cancelled. No one can get the week-end off — only Thanksgiving day. They expect it to be less hectic by the middle of December, so I think I'll be able to come home for Christmas.

Tonight I went to the premiere

of Katherine Cornell's new play "Winged  
Victory" by Maxwell Anderson. It  
was the most fashionable first night  
I've seen here. The place was packed  
with flashlight cameras popping all  
over the place. I think one got me  
every place I moved — but only  
by accident. Marjorie W. Smith was  
there with her "young man".

Do Nellie home today? Give  
her my love. I'll miss having  
Thanksgiving dinner with you. I  
don't know where I'll have it  
or with whom. I got a very nice  
overcoat — dark gray, doublebreasted  
and thick. It still isn't cold enough  
for me but it won't be long be-  
fore I'll need it. The cake is  
gone — I cut it tonight and gave  
some to the boys next door. When  
you write again make some sug-  
gestions for Christmas presents. I don't  
know what anyone has. Love, Hubert
