We got your cable the
other day and were so glad to
hear from you and know you
had gotten the news. Mother

saving it to put in Elizabeth's

baby book. I think we will
call the cherub Elizabeth to
avoid confusion with Ruthie,
Britty and Betty etc. I wish
you could see her - she is a
little doll and mother is
about to eat her up! I guess
you have gotten the pictures
by now. Endora took them
and I thought they were
grand considering the film
(just the plain old kind)
lights etc. that she had.

there. Edward has been
transferred to Westover Field,
Mass. - about 90 mi. from

was that he was leaving

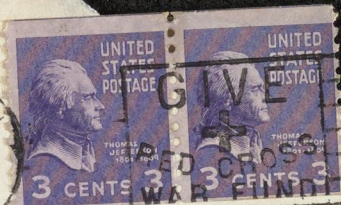
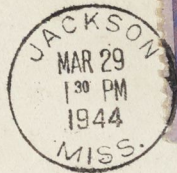
