
While we have so many to thank, there is always room for more peer reviewers. Some view peer review as a way of paying back to the research community for the work that others do in reviewing their manuscript submissions; others identify peer review as a necessary part of their role as a researcher.^{1,2} Many organizations expect peer review for academic advancement.^{1,3}

We should not lose sight of other benefits of peer reviewing. Being one of the first to read new information that is contributing to your field of expertise or the field of medicine in general is a significant motivating factor for peer reviewers.³ It may even stimulate your own ideas for performing research.¹ In addition, it is an opportunity to be recognized as having expertise in your field, to build a relationship with a journal, and to potentially become more involved in the editorial/medical publishing industry.^{1,2} Most importantly, however, it is just plain fun.
