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Secular/non-religious education has always been the standard. In a lot of cases those people who support secular education have the main reason that religion gives opportunity for contradictions among individuals. According to a study from 2012 the following is stated: "Religion may not consider the cultural diversity and beliefs of every individual (Kurtzleben, 2017). Currently about 1.5 million students are attending Christian colleges in the USA as it can be seen in the informative data box. One significant benefit of Christian education can be seen in the box of evidential figure. It shows that those students who attended Protestant Christian schools are later the most successful in their family lives. On the contrary, those students who attended public schools have the least successful family lives.
