Produced by the SC Department of Education and DHEC, this program was broadcast October 26, 2009 and is strongly recommended for **ALL school personnel**. Entitled **Novel H1N1 Flu Update for SC Schools (Oct. 2009)**, it provides an update on the flu, on availability of vaccine and on actions to slow spread as well as readiness for school closure if necessary.

Hosted by Cathy Young-Jones, SCDE State School Nurse Consultant who also works with DHEC, this program features DHEC professionals in areas of Public Health Nursing and Epidemiologic Response/Enhanced Surveillance Section providing key information that is important for all educators. Tick Tock Minutes – Includes Program about Germs!

Repeat block feed Jan. 11, 9:00–9:50 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights) SL

Perfect for use in school news programs for elementary grades, this series includes a program about germs. Program 6 is entitled *He's Called a Germ* and focuses on germ prevention. There are 35 one-minute programs in this series that provides concise messages for young students. The five categories are “Health and Safety” (programs 1–15), “Environmental Awareness” (programs 16–20), “Geography and Library Skills” (programs 21–25), “Manners” (programs 26–30), and “Science: Remote Sensing” (programs 31–35). If you have not accessed these, please do it now!

The Curious Mr. Catesby – Added to StreamlineSC!

In 1722, Mark Catesby, an English artist and naturalist, visited the American wilderness. For four years, he explored the natural world of the southeast colonies and the Bahamas. He returned to England and spent the next 20 years writing, engraving, coloring, and publishing his two-volume *Natural History of Carolina, Florida & the Bahama Islands*. It was the first fully illustrated study of the natural history of North America and the most comprehensive to date. Although first edition copies of the *Natural History* are extremely rare, two can be found in South Carolina. One is located at Middleton Place Plantation near Charleston and another at Thomas Cooper Library in Columbia. As South Carolinians, we are especially interested in Catesby's work in the Lowcountry and Piedmont areas of our state. He documented species in his drawings that we will never see again – the Carolina Parakeet, the Ivory-billed Woodpecker, and the Passenger Pigeon. As an artist, he was the first to draw sketches from life as opposed to dead, posed specimens. He also depicted plants and animals in the context of their natural habitats. As a scientist and acute observer, he proposed the theory of bird migration; and he was probably the first to recognize how natural and man-made destruction of a species' habitat leads to extinction. His influence can be seen in the works of Audubon and other noted naturalists who followed in his footsteps. Catesby realized a life-long goal when he was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society in London.

The documentary film, **The Curious Mr. Catesby**, tells the fascinating story of Mark Catesby and how his work changed the world of science and art. Dr. Alan Feduccia, a science professor at the University of North Carolina, describes this program as “... a treasure, extraordinarily scripted, artistically beautiful and well narrated.” **The Curious Mr. Catesby** will be posted on **StreamlineSC** beginning in January 2010 with rights for one year, which will allow teachers to incorporate the content into their spring and fall lesson plans. Carolina Stories *Pirates of the Carolinas...* Special Repeat

This special edition of ETV’s **Carolina Stories** entitled *Pirates of the Carolinas*, aired initially in 2007. It can be a good resource to use when studying South Carolina history. The program uncovers the adventures and myths about the pirates who terrorized the South and North Carolina coasts from 1690-1720, including Blackbeard, Stede Bonnet, Charles Vane, Edward Low, and “Calico” Jack Rackham. But, the men were not alone! Mary Read, Ann Mills and Charleston’s Anne Bonny, all female pirates, went after their share of the loot. Please remind teachers to preview before use.



Curriculum and Content Corner...a great new year with additional resources for educators... with *Dianne L. Gregory*

ReadyZone: Continuity of Learning is a new resource accessible on *StreamlineSC* to assist educators in ensuring continuous learning for students in the event of absence or school closure. **ITV** offers this assistive resource through *StreamlineSC*. Discovery Education has collected video resources across all grades, K–12, in the areas of English/Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. Programs in this collection feature teacher guides, blackline masters and quizzes that can serve as readily-available emergency lesson plans. **ReadyZone: Continuity of Learning** is available from the streaming home page under Teacher Center and under Teacher Center in Curriculum Resources. Additional resources such as a brochure from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Department, a Communication Toolkit for Schools entitled “Preparing for the Flu” as well as H1N1 information on rules to fight the flu are all accessible on this site. A local resource, **Wash Hands Song Video**, created by DHEC in partnership with ETV within the *StreamlineSC* site and **ITV**, encourages young students through song to prevent the spread of disease by washing hands, coughing into their sleeve, staying home when sick and telling family and friends about these health tips. **Flu Surveillance and Vaccination (Fall 2009)**, developed by the SC Department of Education with **ITV** and DHEC, and **Novel H1N1 Flu Update for SC Schools (Oct. 2009)** have both been uploaded to *StreamlineSC* for use with school administrators, school nurses and health educators. Take a look at these instructional resources as we approach flu season.

For the college bound student...**Finding Money for College**, a new two-hour program to assist students and parents in looking for ways to fund college tuition will broadcast live from ETV on January 31. Financial aid professionals from public and private colleges and universities in South Carolina and officials from the Commission on Higher Education will answer viewer questions via a toll-free number and provide assistance to navigate the process of scholarship and financial aid applications. Commemorations...Observed on the third Monday of January, the US holiday commemorating the birthday of Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr. is celebrated to honor his life’s work for equality and community service. A wealth of programming is offered on *StreamlineSC* and **ITV**. Presidents’ Day in February provides an opportunity to step back in history as we visit the impact former Presidents have on our lives today.

Cold weather is just around the corner. **Riverbanks Roundup Animals in Cold Weather** pays a visit to a variety of animals that are impacted by temperature at *Riverbanks Zoo*. Produced by the SC Department of Education **ITV** with ETV, this exciting program explores environmental temperatures and their effect on animal behavior. From the warmth of the classroom, students can experience the changes that cold temperatures cause in the zoo population.

January brings the opportunity for teachers to register for **ITV**’s new recertification course *Natural History In and Out of the Classroom with Rudy Mancke*. Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips 2009–10

January 14 Premiere Program about Westward Expansion

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies, making the subjects exciting and relevant to today's classrooms. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a dramatic and compelling learning experience for 4th and 5th grade students. Though schools may view the programs free and record them with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are definite advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate.

By paying the fee to participate, schools get the outstanding teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors and historians online and via a toll-free number. Schools pay approximately \$500 per school for all seven programs, but rights for individual programs can be purchased. - Jan. 14, 2010 ***Westward! (premiere)*** – Explore the story of the early days of American westward expansion. Daniel Boone recounts the exciting experiences and unexpected consequences associated with moving west. Learn about the risks and grueling personal hardships of creating new settlements.
- Feb. 11, 2010 ***The Slave Trade*** – Beginning with the American Revolution, this program explores the U.S. law of 1807 that abolished the trans-Atlantic slave trade. Meet the people who were involved in or influenced by this pivotal legislation: the slaves, plantation owners, slave-ship captains, common seamen, government officials, Navy officers, and anti-slavery activists.
- Mar. 11, 2010 ***The Rights of Youth (premiere)*** – Imprisonment, whipping, forced transportation, and even death were some of the punishments that courts sentenced children to in the eighteenth century. Witness how justice was administered at a time when criminal laws and sentencing guidelines made few or no exceptions for children.
- Apr. 22, 2010 ***Treasure Keepers*** – You have seen their work in every museum, but what do conservators really do? Learn how conservators prevent or slow the damage caused by “agents of destruction.” Explore how and why preserving history is important for future generations.

RIGHTS REMINDER: SC schools may view the programs with 10-day fair use rights. (Can record, but lesson must be used within ten days and then tape erased or destroyed within 45 days.) ONLY schools that receive a scholarship through ITV for one program OR schools that pay Colonial Williamsburg to participate either in single lessons or in the entire series can keep the copy of the program(s) for the life of the tape, receive the guides, get online access, and have phone interaction with the historians.

Coastal* visits the Penn Center in Beaufort County and historic Atlantic Beach. *The Road Trip! Upstate* goes to Clemson, Greenville and Greenwood to learn about the Rev. James Hall, Harvey Gantt and the Mt. Pisgah AME Church.

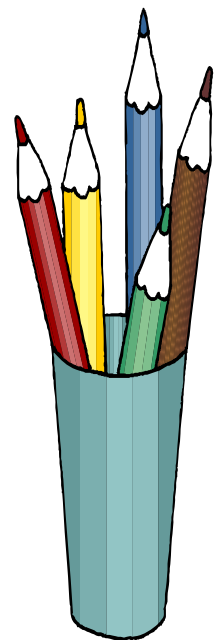

Your Day on the Road – National Park Treasures in SC

Jan. 8, 2:00–3:00 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

Your Day on the Road journeys through time with visits to the National Parks Service sites of South Carolina. Travel with host Bob Schuster to locations across the state for stories of Colonial days and Revolutionary War battles, of antebellum life and Civil War struggles. And along the way we'll explore the natural history of the region. Walk the Revolutionary War battlegrounds at Ninety Six National Historic Site in Greenwood County, Kings Mountain National Military Park in York County and Cowpens National Battlefield in Spartanburg County. Travel to the coast where the Revolutionary War meets the American Civil War at Fort Sumter National Monument. Trace the history of American seacoast defense at Fort Moultrie on Sullivan's Island, relive the first battle of the Civil War at Fort Sumter in Charleston Harbor, and learn the story of a principal author and signer of the United States Constitution at the Charles Pinckney National Historic Site in Mount Pleasant. And, witness a site undisturbed by war or settlement when we visit Congaree National Park near Columbia, which boasts the largest remnant of old-growth floodplain forest remaining on the continent. As **Your Day on the Road** delves into the human history of the state, naturalist Patrick McMillan will guide our study of its natural history and the relationship of the environment to the events that took place at these National Park Service sites. Produced by Clemson University in cooperation with ETV.

This course provides key information about single-gender education, focusing on six differences between boys and girls, the implications in the classroom, and strategies to meet the needs of individual students. Interviews with teachers from single-gender classes are also a part of the videos. Single-gender education is teaching boys and girls the same high standards within different classrooms. Federal regulations issued in October 2006 authorized the use of single-gender classrooms, programs, and schools within districts as a way to meet the educational needs of its students. Currently, there are over 200 schools within South Carolina that offer some form of single-gender program. Single-gender programs exist in elementary, middle and high schools.
