(Limited rights - will not air again until February 2012, no duplication) *Available in StreamineSC This NEW series recommended for grades 5–12 contains three programs that address an important topic for today's youth: texting, Internet safety and bullying situations. **B Careful when U Txt** gives students a primer on the Do's and Don'ts of text messaging. **Think Before You Click** provides smart online strategies to stay safe and **Bully Bystanders** sets the tone for refusing to accept hostile behavior, offering effective ways to deal with bullying. Each program is between 20 to 25 minutes in duration.

• (NEW) Wise Owl Bully Stopper

(Limited rights - will not air again until February 2012, no duplication) *Available in StreamineSC

This NEW series recommended for grades K–3 consists of three lessons, which are hosted by a likeable cartoon character! "Wise Owl" encourages young viewers to learn more about what bullying is and how it can be stopped. Helpful vignettes play out common situations that appeal to young viewers and asks them to think about what they would do in each situation. Programs are about 15 minutes each in duration.

This series for grades 6–12 features kids talking to kids about at-risk issues they face and focuses on the causes of the behaviors. The peer-to-peer style has proven to change attitudes and behaviors.

• XPress: Safety for Students – Lesson 1, *Cyber Safety*

This program, recommended for grades 6–12, features teens who were part of the SC Department of Education's Office of Youth Services Youth Advisory Board. The middle and high school students joined Dr. Glen Walter to talk about the important issue of cyber safety. This program can serve as a good discussion "starter" on this important issue.

• Wexford Series

Repeat block feed Oct. 4, 8:00-9:59 a.m. IMC (Unlimited rights) SL

This series of five lessons, designed for students in grades 6–10, explores abuse in teenage relationships, bullying, peer pressure, anger and alternatives to aggression and violence, criticism, and striving for perfection. Problems are resolved in a positive manner, ultimately finding workable solutions that are realistic. Each lesson is approximately 23 minutes in duration.

Deskercise – Being Added to StreamlineSC

Designed for elementary students to use while standing at their desks! 185 interactive lessons - ten minutes each and built around 37 weekly themes.

- Five 10-minute lessons in each theme so educators can use one each day.
- Each interesting lesson includes a warm-up and cool-down segment along with the more robust theme-based activity segment and features animation combined with live action.
- The core activity segment is the same for the entire week of programs, but warm-up and health tips are varied.
- Host Slim Goodbody provides pertinent information, even a brief geography lesson, while encouraging physical activity appropriate for young students to do while standing by their desks.
- The series was developed in cooperation with the American Association for Health Education (AAHE).

Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips 2011–12 October 13 at 1:00 p.m. on ETV – A More Perfect Union

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies, making the subjects exciting and relevant to today's classrooms. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a dramatic and compelling learning experience for 4th and 5th grade students. Though schools may view the programs free and record them with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are definite advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate.

By paying the fee to participate, schools get the outstanding teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors and historians online and via a toll-free number. Schools pay approximately \$500 per school for all seven programs, but rights for individual programs can be purchased. - Oct. 13, 2011 **A More Perfect Union** Witness the conflict and compromises that accompanied the ratification of the U.S. Constitution as we join young 18th c. observers who travel from state to state to tally the vote to learn about the ratification process.
- Nov. 17, 2011 *Harsh World, This World* (premiere) What was slavery really like for enslaved people and their masters? Hear personal stories based on primary sources that show kindness, betrayal, trust, cruelty, and many other emotions that govern complex human relationships.
- Dec. 15, 2011 *Westward!* Explore the story of the early days of American westward expansion. Daniel Boone recounts the exciting experiences and unexpected consequences associated with moving west. Learn about the risks and grueling personal hardships of creating new settlements.
- Jan. 19, 2012 **The War of 1812 (premiere)** A generation after the Revolution, Americans once again plunged into war with Great Britain. Why? Join Henry Clay, Tecumseh, Andrew Jackson, James Madison, and others as they struggle to determine what course the United States will take.
- Feb. 16, 2012 When Freedom Came (premiere) Everyone knows Abraham Lincoln freed all the slaves or did he? Freedom came to enslaved people over the course of many months and years and it arrived in different ways in different places. Discover how enslaved Americans made everyday choices during the Civil War that helped bring about their freedom.
- Mar. 15, 2012 **Remember the Ladies** In 1776, Abigail Adams requested that her husband, future president John Adams, "remember the ladies" when establishing the government and the laws of the new nation. Examine the roles, responsibilities and daily activities of early American women.
- Apr. 19, 2012 **The Rights of Youth** Imprisonment, whipping, forced transportation, and even death were some of the punishments that courts sentenced children to in the 18th century. Witness how justice was administered at a time when criminal laws and sentencing guidelines made few or no exceptions for children.

*RIGHTS: SC schools may view with 10-day fair use rights. (Can record, but program must be used within ten days and erased/destroyed within 45 days.) ONLY schools that get a scholarship through eMedia OR pay CWEFT to participate can keep the copy of the program(s) for the life of the tape/DVD, receive the guides, get online access, and have phone interaction with the historians.

IMPORTANT: Block Feeds of Series with "Limited" Rights

These series are part of a group of eMedia resources that have "limited broadcast/off-air record rights and no duplication rights," which means that eMedia is limited to the number of times we can broadcast them each year and schools may not duplicate. We cannot repeat these series again until February 2012.

• Forgotten Founder: The Story of Charles Pinckney

This program in the **Carolina Stories** series premiered on ETV September 17, 2010. **Carolina Stories: Forgotten Founder** is a historical visualization of the biography of Charles Pinckney, a South Carolinian whose contributions to the birth of our nation and state are largely unknown until now. His career of public service began in 1779 when at the age of 21 he became a member of the SC General Assembly. Then Pinckney was selected as a delegate to Congress four years later and became one of four representatives from SC at the Constitutional Convention. Throughout his active political career he served four terms as our Governor, in the U.S. House and the Senate, and appointed as the U.S. Ambassador to Spain.

Through the research of several historians, this documentary explores Pinckney's work as a public servant and his contributions to the United States Constitution while examining the reasons why his story is all but removed from American history. This program is a good one to keep for use next year for Constitution studies around September 17, the anniversary date of the signing in 1787.

This special program is directed by ETV's Sanford Adams with original artwork by James. H. Palmer, Jr., and was funded in part by the Friends of Historic Snee Farm and Humanities Council of SC. It was used as part of this year's celebration for Constitution Week at the National Park Services Charles Pinckney National Historic Site in Mt. Pleasant, SC. 

SC Chronicles Series I: Geography, Native Americans & Colonial Period

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses key issues in early SC History. Experience an archeological adventure at the Topper dig site in Allendale County, learn about the rise and fall of rice-growing in South Carolina and its impact on the state, and find out the true tales of treachery and villainy that occurred off the coast of South Carolina during the Golden Age of Piracy. You will also virtually visit sites around the Palmetto State and learn about their historic and special relevance to South Carolina today.

SC Chronicles Series II: The Winds of Discontent

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses three key issues in early SC History: The winds of discontent in SC, The American Revolution in the Low Country and The American Revolution in the Up Country. Learn about Francis Marion's partisan campaigns during the American Revolution in SC and the historical importance of the Battle of Camden. You will also view new programs about heroines in our state who have shaped South Carolina history and virtually visit sites around the Palmetto State and learn about their historic and special relevance to South Carolina today.

SC Chronicles Series III: Post Revolutionary

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses key issues in early SC History: Life and Culture in the New States 1786-1808, The Antebellum Period 1793-1822 and Southern Discontent 1830-1860. Participants learn about Charles Pinckney, the Forgotten Founder who contributed to the birth of our nation and the construction of the Santee Canal, considered the first "true" canal in this country. Participants will view a new program about the Grimke Sisters who spoke out at an early age against slavery and virtually visit sites around the Palmetto State and learn about their historic and special relevance to South Carolina today.

The **SC Chronicles Series** of one-hour courses will enhance the understanding of SC history and add a repertoire of material to use in the classroom. The video sessions focus on integrating SC history into the social studies curriculum. As participants gain a greater understanding of South Carolina history, they will be able to teach state curriculum standards with an updated historical knowledge of South Carolina history.
