Project Discovery Explores Cherokee County History

Repeats Dec. 2, 1:00–1:57 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights) *No phone interaction for repeat

Produced by ITV with ETV, **Project Discovery** in November 2006 featured many interesting historical highlights of Cherokee County, including a visit to two important Revolutionary War battle sites.

Kings Mountain National Military Park is the site where the Battle of Kings Mountain was won by a band of Patriot militia over British Major Patrick Ferguson's regiment made up of Loyalist troops. Cowpens National Battle Site is where Brigadier General Daniel Morgan's Continental regulars with Andrew Pickens' militia defeated British Lt. Colonel Banastre Tarleton.

The program also included highlights of other key places of historical importance in the area. We took a visit to see the restored log cabin of the founder of the town of Gaffney and met someone who knew all about its interesting history. This edition of **Project Discovery** is recommended for upper elementary through high school students who are studying our state's colorful and interesting past.

Deskercise – Veterans Day and Book Week Topics

Each 10-minute **Deskercise** program is built around a weekly theme. ITV will block feed the entire month's programs (usually 4 weeks or 20 programs) during the middle of each month PRIOR to when they are recommended for use according to the weekly themes. For example, all the programs designed with themes for December use will air November 12. ITV will repeat several November topics the first of this month so you can access them if you have not yet! (See list below)

November's theme for the third week is "Children's Book Week." The five programs, each 10 minutes, for this week all contain the same core exercise segment that relates information on the importance of reading. Each of the five programs with the "Children's Book Week" theme begins with a different warm-up segment about a place in a different state and ends with a different short health tip, but the core exercise-at-your-desk segment is the same the entire week.

The series was developed in cooperation with the American Association for Health Education (AAHE) and provided by the State Department of Education through ITV. The programs are designed to be used while students move right at their desks, but they can be used in other ways. Some schools are using them at the beginning of the school day, others use them during PE classes and others use them in after-school programs.

NEW Carolina Stories: Finding Clovis

Nov. 3, 1:00–1:27 p.m. Channel 1 Repeats Nov. 17, 9:00–9:27 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

ETV's **Carolina Stories** presents a NEW program that takes viewers on an archaeological adventure to the Topper dig site in Allendale County. The area is famous for the artifacts from the Clovis people, a prehistoric Native-American culture that may be 13,000 years old. World renowned scientists, including Dennis Stanford from The Smithsonian and Al Goodyear from the University of South Carolina, offer their opinions about these significant first Americans – where they came from, how they lived and what may have been their fate. This program aired on ETV September 18 for the first time.

Native American Heritage Month Programs

Native-American Folktales (SL)

Repeats Nov. 3, 1:30–1:53 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

Designed for grades 4–8, this program features four tales from different Native-American groups that are presented using music and animation. The stories assist students in understanding the culture and experiences of Native Americans. Stories presented are: *Storytelling Stone, Pelican Girl, The Boy Who Loved Bears,* and *The Turkey Girl.* This program was added to the ITV schedule in 2007.

Native America (SL)

Repeat block feed Nov. 3, 1:55–3:10 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

The series introduces the issues that Native Americans faced in our history. The five lessons, which are designed for grades 5–8, are each approximately 14 minutes and 30 seconds in duration. Lesson 3 is entitled *Culture Issues*. This series was added in 2005-06.

Native American Month Shorts (SL)

Repeat block feed Nov. 3:15–3:31 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

These 29 short program segments are each between 20 and 35 seconds in duration. They are good for schools to include in school news programs for elementary through high school. Dr. Will Moreau Goins, who is with the Eastern Cherokee, Southern Iroquois and United Tribes of South Carolina, Inc. worked with ETV to produce these segments several years ago.

U.S. History Field Trips - Native American Regional Cultures (Lesson 4)

Repeats Nov. 3, 3:35–3:58 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited broadcast/off-air record, but no duplication)

Lesson number 4 in the **U.S. History Field Trip** series, this program is recommended for grades 4-8 and makes history come to life by using real locations, graphics, animations, and maps. This series as added to the ITV schedule in 2007-08.

The Snowbird Cherokees – ETV Special Repeats

Repeats Nov. 5, 2:00–2:56 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

A 1995 production by ETV made possible through funding from the South Carolina Humanities Council, the North Carolina Humanities Council, the Georgia Humanities Council, and SECA (now NETA), repeats in the ITV schedule this month. **The Snowbird Cherokees** examines the past, present and future of these Native Americans who live inside the western border of North Carolina. The documentary focuses on the spiritual nature of the Snowbird Cherokees and their struggle to maintain this part of their cultural heritage.



Curriculum and Content Corner...highlighting the election,

citizenship and Veterans Day ... with Dianne L. Gregory

Election Day is coming...November 4! Good citizenship is such an important concept to get across to our students and communities. ITV offers a variety of programming available to accomplish this goal. *Primary Citizenship* for grades 1–3, told by a primary child, gives children the major ideas and experiences that they should acquire to be effective American citizens. Available through ITV broadcast and *StreamlineSC* for grades 7-12, *democracy it is!* explores the real-life application of core concepts in a democratic society. In each of the 4 lessons, the concepts are represented by stories of teens actively engaged in the democratic process. With politics constantly in the

news, *Citizen Brain Feeding on American Democracy* targeted for grades 4–6 is a high energy, content rich program, engaging elementary students to teach the qualities and facts about our representative democracy. Using music and the animated character, "Citizen Brain" encourages citizenship and participation in our government. *Guerrilla Guide to Politics* for grades 9–12 is a lesson designed to encourage high school students to exercise their power as citizens in our representative democracy. Both of these programs are available through the ITV block feed schedule and *StreamlineSC*. Detailing the history of the seventeen United States Presidents who served America during the turbulent 20th Century – Theodore Roosevelt through Bill Clinton, *20th Century Presidents* uses archival footage to make these years come to life. Available also through *StreamlineSC*, *A Conversation on the Constitution* targets high school students. The 3-lesson series features United States Supreme Court Justices discussing why we need an independent judiciary. What a great way to make politics and history come alive. Providing relevant up-to-date resources is our goal at ITV. We hope you will take advantage of our excellent programming.

The Almost Painless Guide Series encompasses five lessons that give an overview of the Election Process, the Executive Branch, the Judicial Branch, the Legislative Branch, and the US Constitution. Geared for upper elementary and middle/high school students, this series utilizes contemporary and archival video footage to offer a fresh approach to civics study. Other **ITV** resources to consider are **US Flag: Proper Use, The Constitution Through History**, both also available through **StreamlineSC**. Additional resources are available through the South Carolina State Election Commission at http://www.state.sc.us/scsec/.

Produced by **ETV** in conjunction with **ITV**, **South Carolina Elects Its Leaders** is designed to help students understand the election process and the role of political parties in our state. The duties of South Carolina's constitutional officers are highlighted without emphasizing the holders of these offices. From fifteen to seventeen minutes in length, the eight programs in the series are designed for upper elementary and middle/high school students. A teacher's guide accompanies the series.

Special commemorations are many during this time of year and can be located through **ITV** and **StreamlineSC**. Veterans Day, Pearl Harbor Day and Bill of Rights Day are recognized through our educational programs. Serving Their Country: SC's Greatest Generation and Tuskegee Airmen available through **ITV** and **StreamlineSC** provide an unusual opportunity to meet the heroes of this period in our history. Hear the stories of South Carolinians as they relate their experiences during World War II. *Holocaust Remembrance Specials - Paul Argiewicz: Holocaust Survivor* shares a personal history of courage. Complete with teacher's guide and correlated to the SC Standards, this program is a must for students to have an appreciation of how fortunate they are.

Through the calendar feature of *StreamlineSC*, the commemoration of Veterans Day is a learning experience worth remembering. **ITV** with *StreamlineSC* assists in bringing history to life in the classroom. Special Programs for Veterans Day

Veterans Day is an important school celebration as we honor those who have admirably served in the United States military. Originally known as "Armistice Day," November 11th is the anniversary of the armistice signed by the Allies and the Germans ending World War I. An act of Congress changed the name to "Veterans Day" on May 24, 1954 to pay tribute to all who have served our country.

NOTE: Please advise teachers as always to preview programs before use with students.

Air Group 16: We Came to Remember – Nov. 6, 9:00–9:26 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited until 11/05/09) Tells the story of the last reunion of Air Group 16 – the pilots, radiomen and gunners who served on the aircraft carrier USS Lexington in the Pacific in World War II.

The Big Picture: The Greatest Generation in SC (#128) - Nov. 5, 9:00–9:56 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited) Takes a look at those who served in WWII from SC and Europeans who were POW's in our state.

Canteen Spirit – Nov. 6, 9:30–10:26 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited) Tells the story of the North Platte Canteen in Nebraska during World War II. Six veterans return to share their memories.

Carolina Stories - The Vanishing Generation – Nov.5, 10:00–10:56 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited) A powerful visualization of the first-hand accounts of WWII by South Carolina veterans.

Carolina Stories - Always First: The SC National Guard – Nov. 5, 11:00–11:56 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited) This documentary tells the story of the SC Air National Guard and the men and women who are part of it. The Guard supported US efforts in the Korean War, the Berlin Crisis, Operation Desert Storm, Operation Enduring Freedom, and Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Carolina Stories – Over Here: The Homefront During Word War I – Nov. 5, 12:00–12:56 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited) Commemorates the 90th anniversary of the United State's entry into the Great War through exhibitions, lectures, a documentary, and living history performances. World War I activities on the homefront literally changed the South Carolina landscape. They also changed how women and African-Americans saw themselves as part of society.

ETV Forum: South Carolina and the War – Nov. 5, 1:00–1:56 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited) South Carolina Historians discuss World War II's impact on SC and South Carolina's impact on WWII with an audience of veterans, teachers and students.

Gathering of Heroes - Nov. 6, 12:00–12:26 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited until 11/05/09) Recounts the story of WWII veterans from Indiana who make the journey to visit the WWII Memorial in Washington, DC.

Government Girls of WWII - Nov. 6, 12:30–1:26 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited until 11/05/09) The story of young women who flocked to Washington, DC during the 1940s to help in the mobilization for WWII. It changed their lives. Noted humanities scholars discuss the role of women in the 20th century.

Honor Flight – Nov. 6, 1:30–1:56 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited) 32 Ohio WWII veterans travel from Columbus to visit the WWII Memorial in Washington, DC, sharing stories and thoughts.

On the Frontline: Troops in Iraq - Nov. 7, 11:30 a.m.–12:28 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited until 11/06/09) Tells the story of Nebraska Army National Guard soldiers from Troop A and how the Iraq war changed them.

Southern Lens – Warbirds: Diary of An Unknown Aviator (#12) – Nov. 5, 2:00–2:57 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited) Records the memories and horrors of World War I fighter pilots. When diary was first published in 1926, it was very controversial.

Tuskegee Airmen Educational Program - Nov. 7, 12:30–1:26 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited) Taped with members of this African-American distinguished WWII veterans visited Columbia. (In *StreamlineSC*)

USS Wisconsin: The Last Battleship - Nov. 7, 1:30–1:56 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited until 11/06/09) Defines this ships unique place in history and profiles the courageous men who went to war on its decks.

Perfect for "Patriotism Week" Around November 11th

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies, making the subjects exciting and relevant to today's classrooms. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a dramatic and compelling learning experience for 4th and 5th grade students. Though schools may view the programs free and record them with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are definite advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate.

By paying the fee to participate, schools get the outstanding teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors and historians online and via a toll-free number. Schools pay approximately \$500 per school for all seven programs, but rights for individual programs can be purchased. 

Student Access

Teachers have many ways to give their students access to StreamlineSC:.

1) Assignment Builder: The teacher creates an assignment through "Assignment Builder" located in "Teacher Center." They attach the videos they want students to have access to and are assigned a code that students use to access the assignment. The students will only have access to the videos the teacher has selected. They cannot search the site. We can come to your school and do workshops on this feature (Streamline Builders).

2) Single School Student Account for Research: We can create one student account per school. The account may be used by any number of students simultaneously. Students have access to all videos and images. They do not have access to lesson plans, quizzes or "My Content." Contact Debbie or Donna if you would like to have a student access account created for your school.

3) Teachers may download video segments and images and allow students to view them on computers in the classroom, in a lab or at home. Burn the downloaded video segments to CD or save to USB Flash drives to transport to all of the computers in the classroom or lab or to take home.

4) Teachers can save videos to a network drive that the students have access to and let the students pull the videos from that drive.

5) Save to a handheld video device (i-pod or mp3 player) for viewing individually with headphones. You may NOT put the videos or other items from *StreamlineSC* on an open Web site. It is permissible only if the Website is password protected. It is important that students understand that these videos and images are copyrighted for use in South Carolina K-12 schools only.


