Twenty-five years ago on April 26, 1986, the largest nuclear disaster in history took place in the Soviet Union. ITV, part of the SC Department of Education's Office of eLearning, has worked with the University of South Carolina and produced in partnership with SCETV three programs in a NEW series entitled **Nature Comes Back – 25 Years After Chernobyl**. This series will "pull back the curtain" with a special panel of experts to allow students to learn about the effects Chernobyl had on the nature, nuclear science, US-Soviet relations, and the people who worked there and called it home. Rare photos and video captured by SCETV in partnership with USC will take students to the area devastated by an accident of catastrophic proportions, but, over time nature has returned.

Hosted by ETV's **Mark Quinn**, the outstanding participants in **Nature Comes Back – 25 Years After Chernobyl** include: **Charles Bierbauer**, Dean of USC's College of Mass Communications and Information Studies; **Dr. Tim Mousseau**, USC Professor of Biological Sciences; **Dr. Gordon B. Smith**, USC Professor of Political Science and Director of the Walker Institute of International and Area Studies; **Dr. Eduardo B. Farfan**, Principal Engineer in Environmental Studies and Biotechnology at Savannah River National Laboratory; **Sherry Beasley**, Grants Director and Foundations Coordinator for the Clemson University Provost; **Allen Sharpe**, Director of Photography for ETV's **NatureScene**; and **Rudy Mancke**, Naturalist-in-Residence at USC and host of ETV's **NatureScene**, airing on PBS for 25 years.

Featured are footage and photos from when **NatureScene** visited the site of the reactor in 2003. "I think we had an incredible opportunity that most people couldn't have because we were able to take our camera to see what other people hadn't seen before," **Rudy Mancke** said. "I believe our program on Chernobyl is the only program on the Natural History – looking at the plants and animals - of the event that has been done." Chernobyl was evacuated and fenced in to keep people out. But since April 26, 1986, nature has shown its resiliency with the plants and animals returning to the deserted site. And, re-settlers have returned too. (For more information on guests, see page 13 in this ITV Update.)

NEW ITV Program: Kids in the Courtroom

Each year the **Lexington Police Department** of Lexington, SC pairs children and teens with actual court personnel to participate in a courtroom trial. Called **Kids in the Courtroom**, this event has become so popular that participants wanting to be involved are often put on a waiting list! Each trial has a fairy tale character accused of a crime. For our ITV production of **Kids in the Courtroom**, which allows ITV and ETV to share the components of a courtroom experience with students across the state, our main character “Cinderella” is accused of shoplifting slippers.

Kids in the Courtroom is designed for upper elementary, middle and high students. The program helps students learn about law and order as both the crime investigation, including an interrogation, and the courtroom proceedings are shown as if actually occurring. Real life police officers investigate and testify. Legal terms and job duties of courtroom personnel are explained throughout the courtroom trial.

So...did Cinderella’s Godmother provide her with the slippers or did Cinderella steal the slippers from the store? Sleeping Beauty, Goldilocks, Snow White, Prince Charming, and Little Red Riding Hood as well as Cinderella’s stepmother and stepsisters all take the stand providing testimony to help jurors, ranging in ages from 8 to 16, decide if Cinderella is guilty or not guilty of the crime. 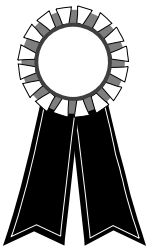

On January 31, 1961, ten black students from Friendship College walked into McCrory’s Five and Dime in downtown Rock Hill, SC. They sat down at the lunch counter to order burgers and drinks. They were denied service and told to leave. When they refused, they were arrested and charged with trespassing.

In previous sit-ins across the South, protestors were arrested, processed by the police, fined, and then released, creating a dubious revenue stream from which municipalities easily profited. But when the Friendship students went before the judge, they chose to serve their time behind bars. For the first time, not only did the city not collect money from the accused, but it actually had to pay to house and feed the men. Word of this action spread and received national attention. The “Jail, No Bail” strategy became the new tactic that helped galvanize the civil rights protest movement.

This NEW Carolina Stories program entitled **Jail, No Bail** dramatically moves through the 1961 peaceful protest and shares revelations from eight of the surviving members of the Friendship Nine as well as the tenth student who posted bail. The program offers never-before-told specifics of this historic demonstration. Actor Keith David narrates the documentary, produced by the staff at ETV Carolinas, which profiles the young men who helped break down barriers for generations to come. This program is a good one to add to your inventory for middle and high school students studying South Carolina History and our nation’s history as well as a valuable resource for Black History Month.

Healthy Hannah's Healthy Choice Heroes is a NEW, exciting ETV educational series of very short programs designed to assist students in making healthy living choices. Healthy Hannah is a superhero-like character that communicates with and guides two students through a variety of real-life everyday scenarios and missions that facilitate them learning how to make healthy choices and the concepts behind those choices. This fun and fast-paced series is designed to educate children in grades K-6 about nutrition and physical activity based on the Dietary Guidelines and MyPyramid.

The programs, approximately 2 to 2 ½ minutes each, are designed to be used in school morning news programs and incorporated into lesson plans or to be used with lesson plans that have been developed for each short program (posted online with programs). The programs combined with their respective lesson plans meet the South Carolina Academic Standards for Health and Safety Education for grades K–6 and have been produced by ETV, working with the SC Department of Education and DHEC.

Produced from Congaree National Park in April 2010, this program features naturalist Rudy Mancke and a Park Ranger who take students on a field trip to learn the history, experience champion trees and biodiversity, and talk about conservation of the largest remnant of old-growth floodplain forest remaining on our continent. Recommended for grades 3-12, this program is great science content about our midlands National Park!

- **Project Discovery – Earth Day 2009 from Banks of the Congaree River**

Repeats April 22, 9:00–9:57 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights) *SL*

Produced from the banks of one of our scenic South Carolina rivers in April 2009, this program features Rudy Mancke and special guests as we talk about conservation of our river waters and explore activities that we can enjoy on and around them while experiencing their serenity and beauty. We even meet a river keeper whose job it is to care for this important resource so it will be here for future generations.

- **Eco-Jeopardy (Earth Day 2008)**

This program, produced in 2008 by DHEC, focuses on the environment in a fun and educational format! Host Alex Youbet moderates the “Jeopardy”-style game that involves students in the content and showcases DHEC’s commitment to environmental education for our South Carolina students. Designed for grades 3–8, this program is a great resource to use with students in celebration of Earth Day. If you missed it, be sure to access now!

- **Earth Day Today (2003) Program**

This program was produced in a “Today” show format and features short segments with student hosts. It received several awards because of its neat, fast-paced format that conveyed key information. This program, as well as the 2008 program, was produced by DHEC for South Carolina students!

- **Holiday Facts and Fun – Lesson 11 *Earth Day***

This series is part of the ITV Schedule and *StreamlineSC*. The 12 programs are designed for grades K–4 and are a perfect way to help young children understand the way certain holidays are celebrated. Lesson 11 is entitled *Earth Day* and is about 12 minutes in duration.

Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trip on April 7

In this electronic field trip from Colonial Williamsburg, students can find out what makes history come alive! Go behind the scenes as we look at how historical African American character portrayals are created or Colonial Williamsburg's Historic Area. From research through performance, experienced museum interpreters share their techniques or bringing the past to life.

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a compelling learning experience for grades 4–8, using re-enactors to play historical figures.

Now is the time to plan for the 2011–12 Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips!

Talk to your PTO about sponsoring the programs for next year. SC schools can receive all seven programs for around \$500. Though schools may view FREE and record programs with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate. By paying the fee, schools get the teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors/historians online and via a toll-free number. ONLY schools that get a scholarship through ITV for one program OR pay CWEFT to participate can keep the copy of the program(s) for the life of the tape, receive the guides, get online access, and have phone interaction with the historians.

Detective Bonz and the SC History Mystery

Repeat block feed April 5 and 12, 9:00–11:33 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights) Also in *StreamlineSC*

When teaching your third grade students about SC history use **Detective Bonz and the SC History Mystery** to review! These ITV programs produced with ETV are some of the most-used resources in *StreamlineSC*. Be sure to check out the great “Regions” song featured in Episode 5. The music for the original song can be found in the online teacher’s guide along with recommended supporting activities.

The six episodes are each approximately twenty minutes in duration.

Episode 1 - Spends time setting up the story that unfolds in remaining episodes & talks about ancient SC.

Episode 2 - Focuses on early settlers, Spanish explorers, Lords, Proprietors, Charleston, and pirates.

Episode 3 - Covers the Revolution, Columbia as the new capital, the upcountry, and low country.

Episode 4 - Looks at the Civil War era, including the Underground Railroad, John C. Calhoun, and Abe Lincoln.

Episode 5 - Showcases farming, textiles and tourism, including a great song about SC regions.

Episode 6 - Students compete in an ETV game show where they learn more about recent history.

ITV Programs about the American Civil War

These ITV programs highlight the depth and magnitude of the Civil War from all vantage points. Most of the programs are accessible online in *StreamlineSC* – see indication. Please access these resources to use with students during the next year as we look at this part of our SC History with the 150th anniversary. (All have unlimited rights except **Great Campaigns of the Civil War**, which cannot be duplicated and is not in *StreamlineSC*.)

- **The American Civil War** (SL) Repeats April 5, 11:40 a.m.–2:05 p.m. Channel 2

Recommended for grades 5–12, these four programs allow students to evaluate both sides, look at military strategies and experience the turmoil during this period to understand why the war occurred.

- **America’s Iliad: The Siege of Charleston** (SL) Repeats April 6, 9:00–10:55 a.m. Channel 2

Recommended for grades 8–12, this documentary depicts political events, personalities, military campaigns, participation of African Americans, and the upheaval of this period in Charleston, SC.

- **Charleston Forts** (SL) Repeats April 6, 11:00–11:57 a.m. Channel 2

Recommended for grades 3–8, this **Project Discovery** program features forts of the Charleston area – Fort Moultrie, Fort Johnson and Fort Sumter. History between the Revolution and Civil War is discussed.

- **Gettysburg National Military Park** (SL) Repeats April 7, 9:00 a.m.–1:24 p.m. Channel 2

Recommended for grades 4–12, this series of four hour-long programs brings the history to life as we visit this historic site to look at the battles, the soldiers and their stories of courage and the area now.

- **Ironclads in the Harbor** (SL) Repeats April 7, 1:30–1:40 p.m. Channel 2

Recommended for grades 4–12, this program tells the history of the Naval Battle for Charleston as it relates to the story of J.M. Emanuel who was assigned to the experimental ironclad, *The Keokuk*.

- **Great Campaigns of the Civil War** Repeats April 7, 1:50–3:48 p.m. Channel 2 (NOT in SL)

The Choking Game – Special Repeat ITV Program

ITV received permission to rebroadcast one more time this year – also posted in *StreamlineSC*
April 11, 10:30-10:50 a.m. Channel 1 (Limited broadcast; no duplication)

Lesson 10 in **Becoming Successful in Middle** is entitled **The Choking Game**. Designed for grades 5-9, this popular series addresses important issues and concerns that young teens are grappling with every day. This program exposes “the choking game” . . . a shockingly foolish and deadly activity among 9-14 year olds that has resulted in the tragic deaths of children across the country. Through interviews with children who have participated in the “game,” siblings and parents of children who have died, and experts and physicians, young viewers get the straight and alarming facts about just how dangerous this “game” is. Dr. Thomas Andrew, a medical examiner, describes what actually happens to the brain when blood flow gets cut off causing brain damage and possible death. A parent describes and details the tragic death of her son in an attempt to prevent others from the same fate. The program gives young viewers information explaining the difference between healthy and dangerous risk taking.

April is Poetry Month – ITV Suggestions!

- For students in grades 4–6, teachers can look at **Club Write** lesson 4 *Poetry*. It repeats April 4, 8:00–8:15 a.m., on channel 1. This series serves as a comprehensive support for developing writing skills in preparation for high school. (Unlimited rights)
- For middle and high school students, teachers can look at some of the poets that are part of the **Writer’s Circle** series that was produced by WRJA-TV in Sumter. Specials Repeat for Holocaust Remembrance Month

April is National Holocaust Remembrance Month. ITV will repeat the following programs, which are all recommended for students in grades 5–12 and can also be found in *StreamlineSC*.

- **Paul Argiewicz: Holocaust Survivor** – Repeats April 6, 1:15–1:48 p.m. Channel 2
(Unlimited rights) *SL*

In 2004, Paul Argiewicz, a Holocaust survivor from Salem, Wisconsin, visited friends in Newberry and allowed his story to be taped to share with students. His personal history is remarkable and his love for our country is truly an inspiration to us all. This program does not contain any graphics or historical photographs. Mr. Argiewicz is just on camera. His words are powerful and his message is one that should be shared with middle and high school students. Since he does deal with sensitive material, please advise teachers to preview this program before using it in the classroom.

- **Dum Spiro, Spero – While I Breathe, I Hope** – Repeats April 6, 1:55–2:22 p.m. Channel 2
(Unlimited rights) *SL*

This half-hour program was produced by ETV with the SC Governor’s School for the Arts and Humanities and uses the arts to pay tribute to the victims of the Holocaust. The program includes music, dance and the spoken word performed by 115 residential students from the school.

- **Seared Souls: Voices of the Holocaust** – Repeat block feed April 6, 2:28–3:55 p.m. Channel 2
(Unlimited rights)

Nine lessons, each between 5 and 16 minutes, feature interviews with South Carolinians who experienced the horrors of the Holocaust. The victims and liberators tell their stories to help us better understand this tragic period in history. (Teachers are advised to preview before use.)

ETV's The Big Picture

Produced by ETV, this weekly series provides an in-depth look at the issues and topics of interest to South Carolinians. Mark Quinn hosts this excellent series that tackles important topics. ITV repeats these two programs for SC schools.

* **Gullah Geechee Culture Heritage Corridor** April 19, 9:00–9:27 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

In 2006, the Gullah Geechee Culture Heritage Corridor was designated by Congress and it runs along the coast from Florida to North Carolina. The Big Picture takes a tour along the South Carolina coast to take a look at one of the most unique cultures in America. (This program aired on ETV in February 2011.)

* **Sprawl/Transit** April 19, 9:32–9:59 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

As gas prices continue to rise and the population continues to grow, citizens will begin to feel the pressure of sitting in gridlock on the roads. This program continues The Big Picture's energy-related topics as they take a look at transit oriented development. (This program aired on ETV in March 2011.)

Theatrical productions in Myrtle Beach are a big draw for tourists that visit the areas, but goes into providing entertainment for the masses? How did Myrtle Beach turn into home for all these diverse and talented performers? ETV goes behind the scenes of some of the biggest shows at the beach, giving a glimpse into the theatrical production process. Produced and directed by ETV's Lynn Cornfoot and Steve Folks, this program visits Legends in Concert, The Carolina Opry, The Palace Theatre, Alabama Theatre, and Medieval Times.

* **Incident at Mars Bluff** April 19, 11:07–11:34 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

This program explores how the world's most technologically advanced air power came to drop a three-ton nuclear device on a small town in South Carolina. Interviews with surviving members of the Gregg family reveal how the incident affected them then and to this day. Additional interviews with surviving crew members, Air Force personnel, Mars Bluff residents, and Cold War historians shed light on the incident and provide local, national and international perspectives on the world's first nuclear blunder that occurred in March of 1958 in Mars Bluff, SC. Produced and directed by ETV's Matt Burrows.

* **Baseball in the Upstate** April 19, 11:39 a.m.–12:06 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

From the late 1800's to present day, the game of baseball has played an important role in the history and culture surrounding the Upstate of South Carolina. Many baseball greats started their careers in either the Textile Mill Leagues or the segregated Negro Leagues. **Baseball in the Upstate** explores the fascination of baseball, and why it remains one of the favorite pastimes in the area. Produced and directed by Mitzi Adams.

Pathways to Graduation, a NEW SCDE Professional Development series, aired for the first time in the ITV schedule March 29. This first program about *Graduation in SC* repeats April 4, 3:00-4:00 p.m. on channel 2. See page 17.

(Unlimited rights) One 55-minute program produced by ETV in partnership with the SC Department of Public Safety and the SC Commission on Prosecution Coordination. It educates teens on the harsh realities of risk-taking behavior such as not wearing seatbelts, violence, drug abuse, speeding, and drinking and driving by following teens through Project READY at a level one trauma center. Not intended for audiences under 14. (Program 1 in ITV **Teen Survival Programs** series.)
- **MCTFT: Kids, Drugs, Crime, and Consequences** – Repeats April 15, 1:30–2:00 p.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights) One program with three parts that can be used with grades 4–8 also. Aired for the first time in April 2005. (Program 4 in the ITV **Teen Survival Programs** series.)

- **Dr. Tim Mousseau**, USC Professor of Biological Sciences, who has made numerous trips to Chernobyl to study the impact of radioactive contaminants on the area and is a leading authority on the impact of radioactivity on birds and insects in the area surrounding Chernobyl.
- **Dr. Gordon B. Smith**, USC Professor of Political Science and Director of the Walker Institute of International and Area Studies, who is a noted authority on Russian politics and author of numerous books including "Soviet Politics: Struggling with Change" and "State-Building in Russia."
- **Dr. Eduardo B. Farfan**, Principal Engineer in Environmental Studies and Biotechnology at Savannah River National Laboratory, who worked with the Chernobyl Center's International Radioecology Laboratory and lived in nearby Belarus for five years.
- **Sherry Beasley**, Grants Director and Foundations Coordinator for the Clemson University Provost, who made four trips to Chernobyl to chronicle and report on the activities in the area and wrote feature articles for *The State* and other media.
- **Allen Sharpe**, Director of Photography for ETV's **NatureScene**, whose photographs from his visit as part of the ETV crew that produced programs in Chernobyl and Kiev are used in the programs.
- **Rudy Mancke**, Naturalist-in-Residence at USC, who was the naturalist on ETV's **NatureScene** that aired nationally on PBS for twenty-five years and who made four trips to Chernobyl to document the natural history.

SC Chronicles Series I: Geography, Native Americans & Colonial Period

This one-hour recertification course showcases ITV and ETV produced resources about South Carolina to assist educators in learning about our state's history, geography, people, and culture. Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses key issues in early SC History. Experience an archeological adventure at the Topper dig site in Allendale County, learn about the rise and fall of rice-growing in South Carolina and its impact on the state, and find out the true tales of treachery and villainy that occurred off the coast of South Carolina during the Golden Age of Piracy. You will also virtually visit sites around the Palmetto State and learn about their historic and special relevance to South Carolina today.

SC Chronicles Series II: The Winds of Discontent

This one-hour recertification course showcases ITV and ETV produced resources about South Carolina to assist educators in learning about our state's history. Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar will discuss three key issues in early SC History: The Winds of Discontent in SC, The American Revolution in the Low Country and The American Revolution in the Up Country. Learn about Francis Marion's partisan campaigns during the American Revolution in SC and the historical importance of the Battle of Camden. You will also view new programs about heroines in our state who have shaped South Carolina history and politics and virtually visit sites around the Palmetto State and learn about their historic and special relevance to South Carolina today.

The *SC Chronicles Series* of one-hour courses will enhance the understanding of SC history and add a repertoire of material to use in the classroom. The video sessions will focus on integrating SC history into the social studies curriculum. As participants gain a greater understanding of South Carolina history, they will be able to teach state curriculum standards with an updated historical knowledge of South Carolina history.
