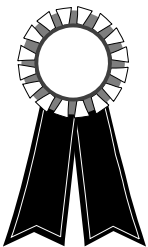

NEW School Health Success Stories – ITV PD Series

The **School Health Success Stories** series features seven NEW programs showcasing the efforts of South Carolina districts, schools and their community partners to implement best practices, programs, and policies that support student health. This series is supported by SC Healthy Schools at the South Carolina Department of Education through a cooperative agreement with and funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Division of Adolescent and School Health. This NEW Professional Development series is produced by ITV and ETV.

SC Healthy Schools, a partnership between the South Carolina Department of Education and South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control to improve students health and academic outcomes by increasing physical activity, improving nutrition, and preventing tobacco use and HIV among elementary, middle and high school students.

This resource is designed for district and school administrators, teachers, school nurses, guidance counselors, school health/wellness committee members, parents, community partners, and others interested in improving student health and academic achievement.

Charleston Progressive Academy, Charleston County School District (duration 7:16)

To increase physical activity among students, Charleston Progressive Academy in Charleston, SC began opening the gym for a morning physical activity period for students. As a result, the school has seen a dramatic reduction in discipline referrals and suspensions, as well as improved student concentration and focus in the classroom.

Mitchell Elementary School, Charleston County School District (duration 13:50)

Mitchell Elementary School in Charleston, SC has implemented a coordinated school health approach to address student health and wellness. In this video, district and school staff discuss ways to improve academics by incorporating physical activity into academic classes, utilizing a Fitness Room and Action Based Learning Lab, and providing students convenient access to health services.

Burke Middle/High School, Charleston County School District (duration 8:45)

Community partnerships have proven to be valuable to Burke Middle/High School in their efforts to improve student health and academics. Learn about health-promoting activities made possible by partnerships with the school's Culinary Arts Program, The Lean Team, SCDHEC, MUSC, and the Charleston Junior League.

R.B. Stall High School (Special Ed), Charleston County School District (duration 14:37)

R.B. Stall High School in North Charleston, SC recognizes the importance of physical activity for all students. After adding a daily physical activity period for special education students, teachers and staff have seen improvement in student engagement, interaction and cognitive skills.

Simpsonville Elementary School, Greenville County School District (duration 8:49)

Greenville County Schools recently began implementing the Coordinated Approach to Child Health (CATCH) program in many of its elementary schools. Learn how teachers and food service staff at Simpsonville Elementary School in Simpsonville, SC have coordinated their efforts to improve nutrition and increase physical activity among their students.

Easterling Primary School, Marion School District Seven (duration 10:35)

Coach Pete Ellis, administrators and staff at Easterling Primary Schools in Marion, SC discuss programs and activities they have implemented to create a health-promoting environment at their school. Learn about the implementation of the Coordinated Approach to Child Health (CATCH) program, a staff wellness program and how these activities have benefited their students and staff.

Richland County School District One (duration 8:42)

Richland School District One in Columbia, SC adopted a 100% tobacco free policy on all school property. Their policy also requires using proven effective tobacco prevention curricula - in this case, Botvin *LifeSkills Training*. School Board Chairman Vince Ford and district staff discuss the reasoning behind the decision to adopt the policy and how it benefits the students, staff and visitors and creates a healthy school environment.

ETV's NatureScene – Programs on Chernobyl and Kiev

April 14, 9:00–9:57 a.m. Channel 2

Repeats April 26, 9:00–9:57 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

The 25th anniversary of the Reactor #4 melt down will be April 26, 2011. **NatureScene** visited the site of the reactor in 2002 to see first hand how nature had bounced back from this disaster and then traveled to the nearby capital city of Kiev to look at human and natural history.

"I think we had an incredible opportunity that most people couldn't have because we were able to take our camera to see what other people hadn't seen before," **Rudy Mancke**, naturalist and host of **NatureScene**, said. "We had the support of the Ukrainian government, and, I believe, our program on Chernobyl is the only thirty-minute program on the Natural History – looking at the plants and animals - of the event that has been done."

Chernobyl was evacuated and fenced in to keep people out. But since April 26, 1986, nature has shown its resiliency with the plants and animals returning to the deserted site. In Kiev about 60 miles away, the ETV crew got to see how plants with American "roots" were thriving while they looked at the history of the capital city and how it was also impacted by the reactor disaster. Plan to access these two programs for your high school world history teachers, but they can also be valuable for science curriculum.

Carolina Stories – ETV Series about SC Culture and History

Produced by ETV, this series features excellent programs that highlight the rich cultural and historical landscape that is South Carolina. These three programs were broadcast on ETV in 2009 and 2010. **For more information** about Carolina Stories, go to www.myetv.org/carolinastories.

* **Backstage Pass!** April 19, 9:00–9:27 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

Theatrical productions in Myrtle Beach are a big draw for tourists that visit the areas, but goes into providing entertainment for the masses? How did Myrtle Beach turn into home for all these diverse and talented performers? ETV goes behind the scenes of some of the biggest shows at the beach, giving a glimpse into the theatrical productions process. Produced and directed by ETV's Lynn Cornfoot and Steve Folks, this program visits Legends in Concert, The Carolina Opry, The Palace Theatre, Alabama Theatre, and Medieval Times.

* **Incident at Mars Bluff** April 19, 9:30–9:57 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

This program explores how the world's most technologically advanced air power came to drop a three-ton nuclear device on a small town in South Carolina. Interviews with surviving members of the Gregg family reveal how the incident affected them then and to this day. Additional interviews with surviving crew members, Air Force personnel, Mars Bluff residents, and Cold War historians shed light on the incident and provide local, national and international perspectives on the world's first nuclear blunder that occurred in March of 1958 in Mars Bluff, SC. Produced and directed by ETV's Matt Burrows.

* **Baseball in the Upstate** April 19, 10:00–10:27 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

From the late 1800's to present day, the game of baseball has played an important role in the history and culture surrounding the Upstate of South Carolina. Many baseball greats started their careers in either the Textile Mill Leagues or the segregated Negro Leagues. **Baseball in the Upstate** explores the fascination of baseball, and why it remains one of the favorite pastimes in the area. Produced and directed by Mitzi Adams.

In this electronic field trip from Colonial Williamsburg, students can experience what museum conservators really do. Learn how conservators prevent or slow the damage caused by “agents of destruction” and explore how and why preserving history is important for future generations.

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a compelling learning experience for grades 4–8, using re-enactors to play historical figures.

Now is the time to plan for the 2010–11 Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips! Talk to your PTO about sponsoring the programs for next year. SC schools can receive all seven programs for around \$500. Though schools may view FREE and record programs with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate. By paying the fee, schools get the teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors/historians online and via a toll-free number. Curriculum and Content Corner...searching for ITV content and highlighting National Library Week... with Dianne L. Gregory

Have you ever had difficulty finding **ITV** resources that you know are on *StreamlineSC*? While attending a recent conference, it was called to my attention that searching for **ITV** resources on *StreamlineSC* can be a challenge if you are not familiar with the search engine. Let me share a couple of ways to make the search a little easier.

Presently, available **SCETV/ITV** resources on *StreamlineSC* include 4,079 assets correlating to 895 results for K–2; 2,649 results for 3–5; 2,953 results for 6–8 and 2,539 results for 9–12. There are 1,621 full videos on *StreamlineSC* of which 1,281 are editable videos with 337 teacher guides with frequent additional uploads.

How can I best access our **ITV** programming? The simplest way to search for access to the most resources continues to be the key word search. For example, by typing in South Carolina in the key word search box and searching, 953 results are available. To locate our **ITV** and **ETV** resources, scroll down the page to view “By Source” on the left of the page; select “Local Content” which will then give you 777 results for our **ITV** and **ETV** resources providing a quick way of getting to familiar content. Another search route for **ITV** resources is available through the “advanced search” tab located directly below the key word search block. Navigate to the “advanced search” and you will be sent to another page, under “Publisher” locate **SCETV/ITV** in the drop down tab. By searching the specific publisher, **SCETV/ITV**, 4,079 results are accessible. From this page location, resources can be selected by content and grade. Contact our office for assistance if you continue to have difficulty finding the valuable resources of **ITV**.

National Library Week and *School Library Media Month* are celebrated across our country to encourage people to read. Begun in the 1950's, the first promotional campaign theme was called Wake Up and Read! Celebrated to promote the use of all types of libraries, its foundation is to encourage reading. A **Literary Tour of South Carolina** series produced by **ITV** and **ETV** introduces students to nationally recognized authors who call South Carolina home. As they learn about the writing process, students will hear what the authors have to say about making characters come alive on the page, learn how to create the plot for their stories and keep track of the action, and find out how important research is to any story, both fiction and non-fiction. Available through **ITV** and *StreamlineSC* this series is a wonderful means of introducing students to authors such as Dorothea Benton Frank, Idella Bodie, Mary Alice Monroe, Mignon Ballard, Tamar Myers, and many more. **Writers' Circle**, also available through **ITV** and *StreamlineSC*, features local writers discussing their personal style from idea to manuscript to finished work. **Inside Writing** highlights prominent authors who have visited our state. These authors, who write for children and/or young adults, discuss their works with students the age of the author's intended audience. They read excerpts from their books, explain how they write, discuss how they get their ideas and develop their storylines, and review the writing skills needed by an author. Programs for Teens Address Important Choices

ITV repeats special programming to address safe choices by teens to help inform them about the choices they make in driving recklessly and in other unsafe behaviors such as drinking, gang activities, using drugs, and eating disorders. Please alert your high school guidance counselors to these resources.

- **Street Skills** - Repeats April 13, 9:00–10:57 a.m. on channel 2. (Unlimited broadcast/off-air record use, but no tape duplication) Four 26-minute programs, which use contemporary music, fast edits and MTV-style videography to get to the mechanics, physics and psychology of driving.
- **Think Twice** – Repeats April 13, 11:00–11:23 a.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights) One 22-minute lesson, which was produced by ETV with DJJ. Three teens who found themselves behind bars talk to fellow teens about the choices they made and what they would have done differently.
- **Private Victories** – Repeats April 13, 11:30 a.m.–1:26 p.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights) Four 29-minute programs present message of caring enough about yourself to resist drugs by following the lives of teenage students to see what effect drug use had on them and people who love them.
- **Grave Decisions** – Repeats April 13, 1:32–2:27 p.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights) One 55-minute program produced by ETV in partnership with the SC Department of Public Safety and the SC Commission on Prosecution Coordination. This provocative program explores three separate cases in the state where teenagers were drinking and driving. Aired for the first time on ETV in April 2001. Please preview before use with students. (Program 2 in ITV **Teen Survival Programs** series.)
- **Keep It Real** – Repeats April 13, 2:32–2:57 p.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights) One 25-minute program produced by ETV in cooperation with Project READY (Realistic Education About Dying Young). It educates teens on the harsh realities of risk-taking behavior such as not wearing seatbelts, violence, drug abuse, speeding, and drinking and driving by following teens through Project READY at a level one trauma center. Not intended for audiences under 14. (Program 1 in ITV **Teen Survival Programs** series.)
- **MCTFT: Kids, Drugs, Crime, and Consequences** – Repeats April 14, 11:00–11:30 a.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights) One program with three parts that can be used with grades 4–8 also. Aired for the first time in April 2005. (Program 4 in the ITV **Teen Survival Programs** series.)
- **Gangs: It's Your Life** – Repeats April 14, 11:35 a.m.–1:03 p.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights) Three 22–28 minute programs provided in the ITV schedule and in *StreamlineSC*. These programs examine why youths join gangs and the unfortunate consequences of gang life.
- **DLNET: Peer Influence Peers – XI, XII, XIV** – Repeats April 15, 9:00 a.m.–12:10 p.m. on channel 2. (Unlimited rights) These three programs have teens talking to teens about drugs and recovery.

Repeats April 16, 9:47–10:47 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights) In this program, teen panelists discuss their addiction and recovery process, including signs of addiction and how to help those afraid or ashamed to seek help with alcohol and other drug abuse.

(Unlimited rights) *SL*

This half-hour program was produced by ETV with the SC Governor’s School for the Arts and Humanities and uses the arts to pay tribute to the victims of the Holocaust. The program includes music, dance and the spoken word performed by 115 residential students from the school.

This new three-hour recertification course will assist educators in integrating Natural History into the curriculum. Learn about nature with Naturalist Rudy Mancke and see how you can take your students right out the door of your school to learn about the world around them! The course is structured around four components: *A Teacher Workshop* that explains what natural history is, why we should study it, and how to integrate it into the classroom; *A Field Study* that shows teachers how the school yard can be used as an outdoor classroom; *Show and Tell Nature Lessons* that provide an in-depth look at mountains to the sea, geology, skulls and bones, beach combing, fossils, insects, and snakes; and *NatureScene* programs which will be used as virtual fieldtrips to learn more about natural history.

Course requirements

1. Attend required final class meeting in Columbia at the ETV Telecommunications Center, 1041 George Rogers Blvd. on **Monday, August 9, 10:00 a.m.–12:00 noon** (Sharing of knowledge gained from the course).
2. View the video lessons. Participants are expected to view all of the course video sessions. The video lessons will be accessed online in *StreamlineSC* <http://www.scetv.org/education/streamlinesc/>. Log in using your personal user ID and password. If you do not yet have a *StreamlineSC* account, please contact your media specialist for your school's *StreamlineSC* pass code. You may also login to www.oneplacesc.org to request an account. If you are not presently teaching in a school district, contact Bonnie McMurray at mcmurray@scetv.org for your pass code. Once you have logged in to *StreamlineSC*, enter Rudy Mancke in the search box. Then view the course videos in the following sequence: *An Overview of the Course*, *A Teacher Workshop*, *A Field Study*, *Show and Tell Nature Lessons*, and *NatureScene Programs*.
3. Choose a well known naturalist and write a 5–7 page report on him or her. Please email your report to mancke@scetv.org by **July 23**.
4. Write a brief response for each of the *Show and Tell Nature Lessons*. Email responses to mancke@scetv.org by **August 2**.
5. Based on what you have learned through the four components of this course (*A Teacher Workshop*, *A Field Study*, *Show and Tell Nature Lessons*, and *NatureScene Programs*), create four detailed lesson plans that would be useful in your classroom and that you would be willing to share with other teachers. Be sure to include a lesson plan from each of the components of the course. Email lesson plans to mancke@scetv.org. All lesson plans must be received by **August 6**.

6. View 5 *NatureScene* programs. Make a list of the plants and animals mentioned in each program. Email flora/fauna list to mancke@scetv.org by **August 6**.
7. Come to the final meeting prepared to present a lesson plan that you created from one of the components of the course.
8. Complete Course Evaluation Form at the final meeting.
