In Riverbanks Roundup - Eco Adventure with Philippe Cousteau students are invited to join in as we journey through Riverbanks Zoo and Garden searching for ways to support a healthy Earth and all its creatures! Conservationist Philippe Cousteau is the 30 year-old son of Jan and Philippe Cousteau, Sr. and the grandson of Captain Jacques-Yves Cousteau. In March 2010, Philippe, Discovery Education's Chief Spokesperson for Environmental Education, came to South Carolina ETV to host a special event to celebrate the success of *StreamlineSC* and present the SCETV and Discovery Education "Lifetime Utilization Awards."

While in our state, Philippe visited Riverbanks to explore the aquarium, feed African Tortoises and help clean up the Saluda River with **Riverbanks Roundup** host Katie Mixon and a great group of Zoo Teens. In this special program, Cousteau shares his passion for conservation and passes on the power to make a positive difference to Zoo Teens and South Carolina kids.

As a member of the legendary family, Philippe is continuing the work of his father and grandfather through **EarthEcho International** (www.earthecho.org). Philippe's travels have taken him diving, rock climbing, trekking, and snowboarding around the world. From expeditions in the highlands of New Guinea to war-torn Sarajevo, where he provided humanitarian aid, he has learned that exploring the connections between humans and the environment are as important as exploring nature itself.

In addition to this special May program with Philippe Cousteau, the April edition of **Riverbanks Roundup** – **African Safari** repeats May 4 at 10:00 a.m. on channel 1. *Jambo...*that's "hello" in Swahili, the language spoken in East Africa! Grab your hat and join **Riverbanks Roundup** for this NEW edition entitled *African Safari*. We'll explore the zoo on an African Safari where students can meet African mammals and plants close up and learn about how they survive in the wild.

Riverbanks Roundup will continue on ETV during the summer. It airs on ETV the last Friday in every month at 5:00 p.m. and repeats on the SC channel (SCC) the following day at 11:00 a.m. ITV will repeat the programs that air on ETV during the summer when the ITV schedule returns in August.

OnePlaceSC – ETV's K–12 Educational Portal

Grades 5–12 4 lessons/27 minutes

Health/Physical Activity

Dr. Gariane Gunter, psychiatry fellow and Mrs. United States 2008, talks with teens about eating smart and moving more. Student-produced videos introduce topics for discussion and a health expert provides facts about health, nutrition and physical activity as teens share with their peers. Program four addresses eating disorders.

Almost Invisible: Black Patriots in the American Revolution

Grades 3–8 5 lessons/5 minutes

Social Studies

South Carolina Illustrator/Author Kate Salley Palmer's artwork and historical stories come to life in these short video programs about famous and little-known Black Patriots in the American Revolution. With a narrator, character voices and sound effects, ITV dramatized the stories using Palmer's original artwork from her book.

Career Clusters

Grades 6–12 2 lessons/35-47 minutes

Career Guidance

These two programs are presented by Dave Walker, Director of the Regional Career Specialists. *Career Clusters: What it takes...What it makes...and Guess who has done it?* provides information on what it takes to get and do a job, what a person makes in certain jobs as well as who does this job. *Career Clusters: Show Me the Money* talks about salary levels of jobs within each career cluster.

Celebrate Freedom/Doolittle Raiders

Grades 3-12

2 lessons/27 minutes

Social Studies

Celebrate Freedom Education Day 2009 highlights the April 2009 reunion of the Doolittle Raiders in Columbia, focusing on their heroic mission and the future. **Honoring Heroes-The 67th Doolittle Raiders Reunion**, produced by ETV's Mark Adams and his daughter Morgan who is a student at Crayton Middle School, documents their experience of meeting the remaining Doolittle Raiders in 2009.

Congaree National Park

Grades 3–12 2 lessons/57 minutes

Science/Environmental Ed.

In **Project Discovery-Congaree National Park** naturalist Rudy Mancke takes students on a field trip to learn the history and experience the champion trees and astonishing biodiversity as we explore the largest remnant of old-growth floodplain forest remaining on our continent and talk about its conservation. ETV's **Roots in the River—The Story of the Congaree National Park** chronicles the history of our state's national landmark from the 1890s through struggles to preserve it in the 1970s and classification as a National Park in 2003.

Creating a Career with the Arts in Mind

Grades 6–12 6 lessons/19–21 minutes

Career Guidance/Arts

This series with SCDE's Ray Davis and Scot Hockman features eight SC artists – forensic artist, arts administration, interior design, printing, art therapy, painter, landscape art, graphic art – in a discussion about how the arts can be embedded in the 16 Career Clusters. They talk about career preparation, what they do in their jobs, and developing 21st century skills, including innovation, problem solving, creativity, and critical thinking.

Environmental Ed

Grades 2–5 11 lessons/5 minutes

Science/Environmental Ed.

These fast-paced programs challenge students with facts, stories, investigations, questions, and Eco-quests to "leave no friend inside and carefully walk upon the earth." "Environmental Ed," an energetic and friendly nature-wise guy, welcomes students to his jam-packed Nature Shack. From there students explore the world around them, learning about food chains, plant and animal survival, bio-diversity, pollution, conservation, recycling, green energy and technology, environmental health, and so much more!

New ITV Series for 2010-11 (continued)

Gettysburg National Military Park

Grades 4–12 4 lessons/60 minutes

Social Studies

This series is provided by the Gettysburg National Military Park to bring history to life. In one program students will find out whether a business executive succeeds in securing key Gettysburg properties for her firm or leaves Gettysburg understanding that historic value sometimes trumps property value. The program follows her journey with her teenage son as she rediscovers a battle and a speech that shaped a nation.

Gilbert Middle School Gives Flight to Veterans

Grades 3–12 1 lesson/30 minutes

Social Studies

This program tells the story of Gilbert Middle School students honoring local veterans and sponsoring them to participate in an Honor Flight to see the memorial in Washington, DC. ETV cameras visit the school, follow the WWII veterans on the flight and join in the celebration at the school upon return.

Hurricane Hugo

Grades 3–12 3 lessons/27–60 minutes

Science

The "storm of the century" had a big impact on the animal and plant life in SC. Through these programs, including **Project Discovery-Lessons Learned from Hurricane Hugo** where Naturalist Rudy Mancke helps students learn what a hurricane is, students can see Hugo's path through SC, learn about the science of storms and hear about the physical/economic impact as we focus on the importance of being prepared.

Ice Age Discoveries

Grades 8–12 2 lessons/30 minutes

Science

Prince William Network (PWN) is providing two programs on recent archaeological discoveries and the science of archaeology in relation to these digs. These new discoveries in Virginia provide compelling evidence that humans inhabited the area at least 18,000 years ago and well before Clovis culture.

Palmetto Leaders - SCANS Skills

Grades 6–12 13 lessons/4–12 minutes

Career Guidance

Development of SCANS Skills is critical to students as they go into the workplace. These programs focus on the SCANS Skills that SC leaders identify as being instrumental in their career growth and success. Hear about problem solving with Chief Justice Jean Toal, creativity with artist Jim Harrison, writing with Dr. Walter Edgar, teamwork with Coach Buddy Pough, and responsibility with Riverbanks Director Satch Krantz, plus others!

Reading, Safety & Internet Safety Minutes

Grades 6-12 6 lessons/6 minutes

Language Arts/Safety

Two of these short programs provide a fun, unique way to encourage middle and high school students to read for fun as well as for information. The other four attention-getting vignettes are designed to help students understand how to be safe at school, at home and online. School Resource Officers talk about what is the safe behavior in each situation.

SC Aviation Association: Hall of Fame

Grades 8–12 5 lessons/8–11 minutes

Social Studies

Provided by the South Carolina Aviation Association, this series includes programs about aviation in our Carolina skies, pioneering women aviators, aces of World War II, stories of South Carolinians in space, and the history of aviation in our state.

Searching for Life in Great Smokey Mountain National Park

Grades 3–8 1 lesson/60 minutes

Science

Provided by the National Park Service, this program allows students to explore the mountain ecosystem and discover the reasons for the variety and abundance of life found there while learning about the interrelationships with the dynamic forest communities and the human-caused impacts that are affecting the web of life in these southern Appalachian Mountains.

New ITV Series for 2010–11 (continued)

Show and Tell Nature with Rudy Mancke

Grades 6–12 12 lessons/22–62 minutes Science/Natural History

These programs about natural history give Naturalist Rudy Mancke the opportunity to share his in-depth knowledge on a variety of topics, including fossils, geology, skulls/bones, mountains to the sea, snakes, and insects. These interesting lessons can be used with students in upper elementary through high school.

Take on the South

Grades 8–12 2 lessons/60 minutes Social Studies

Take on the South is a series of one-hour debates produced by ETV for USC's Institute for Southern Studies (ISS). Hosted by Dr. Walter Edgar, each program features a debate between distinguished guest experts on a historical or current issues related to the South.

Tune Up to Literacy

Grades Pre-K-3 5 lessons/2-3 minutes Literacy

This series encourages literacy using original songs by composer/lyricist and educator Dr. Al Balkin, former Western Michigan Professor and composer who wrote the music for America's first production of *The Hobbit* as well as several off-Broadway children's musicals. The fast-paced, short programs musically introduce and reinforce crucial literacy concepts such as using the period, punctuation and sentence construction with Dr. Balkin's original songs like "Get the Point" and "Call on a Verb!"

Tyrone Geter Unveiled: A SC Artist and His Work

Grades 6–12 2 lessons/27 minutes Career Guidance/The Arts

In these programs, students meet renowned artist and Benedict College Art Professor Tyrone Geter to learn about his career as we visit his studio and listen in as Scot Hockman, SCDE Visual and Performing Arts, talks with him about his mural on contemporary slavery entitled *Look Beneath the Surface*.

Series Deleted from ITV Schedule - Important

Schools and districts MUST ERASE OR DESTROY tapes/DVDs for the deleted/removed series unless retention rights are arranged with distributor. (See RETENTION RIGHTS info below.)

Series that will be removed from the ITV schedule for 2010–11 are announced on page 6. Look for more details in the 2010–11 *ITV Link*, the online *ITV Resources* book and in the ITV New School Year Packet.

*For a list of all series deleted over the last 17 years, check the ITV Web site under Program Information as "Previously Deleted ITV Programs."

Several series were no longer available for distribution. Others are being removed because they are older resources. And, some have been deleted this year due to increased costs to access.

RETENTION RIGHTS: If your school or district is interested in retaining the tapes or DVDs you have made, you will need to contact the distributor at the number that will be provided to find out the availability of retention rights (keeping your tapes for the life of the tape and paying a yearly fee to the distributor). Usually retention rights cost about \$1.00 per minute paid on a yearly basis.

To reach our academic goals, schools, families, and communities must address the needs of the whole child. Using a coordinated school health approach, schools provide opportunities for students to learn and practice positive health behaviors so they can be fit, healthy and ready to learn! This NEW program discusses the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's coordinated school health model and how collaboration among the eight components - Health Education; Physical Education; Health Services; Nutrition Services; Counseling, Psychological, and Social Services; Health Promoting Environment; Health Promotion for Staff; and Family and Community Involvement - can help students establish healthful behaviors and attitudes.

Produced by ITV and ETV with SC Healthy Schools, this program was funded by SC Healthy Schools. Funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, South Carolina Healthy Schools is a partnership between the South Carolina Department of Education and the Department of Health and Environmental Control to improve health and academic outcomes of the state's school-aged youth.

EdAware is a NEW educational series produced by ITV and ETV! The first group of **EdAware** programs is designed **to increase understanding of the problem of childhood obesity** and related health, nutrition and physical activity issues and to make viewers aware that they are part of the solution. The programs are designed for adults - educators, parents and your school community.

SC Department of Education's ITV team, South Carolina ETV, SC Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC), SC Institute for Childhood Obesity and Related Disorders, and the "Eat Smart Move More SC" Coalition have partnered to provide these important programs.

The first three programs have aired on ETV, the SC Channel and in the ITV schedule. This is the first broadcast of programs 4–6, which continue on the theme of understanding childhood obesity.

ITV will block feed the new programs in May and they will air on the SC Channel one each week beginning June 3 and continue June 10 and 17, all at 5:30 p.m. See schedule above.

Program 4 - EdAware: Eat More Family Meals at Home & Tame the Tube

Program 5 - EdAware: Right Size Your Portions & Re-Think Your Drink

Program 6 - EdAware: Getting an Early Start on Eating Smart and Being Healthy

Each of the programs begins with an expert such as Dr. James Stallworth, Associate Professor of Pediatrics at USC School of Medicine and Director of SCICORD, or Dr. Gariane P. Gunter, Psychiatry Fellow at Palmetto Richland Memorial Hospital, giving a brief description of the problem. Then Susan Collier, MS, RD, LD with SC DHEC Region 3 hosts discussions with experts in pediatrics, public health, health education, and nutrition and also other health and nutrition resources are shared.


These NEW ITV programs have been coordinated and hosted by Kimberly Smith, SCDE Safe and Drug-Free Schools. The first program is designed for educators and parents and the other important program is targeted towards teens. Please access for your school and community.

- New Fads in Teen Alcohol Use with Kristy A. Stoneburner, MPH, CHES, CPP. Ms. Stoneburner is Program Coordinator for Lexington One Community Coalition (LOCC). PEEL it! Spark it! Spyke it! This interactive workshop will explore new trends in underage alcohol use. Current information on teen alcohol use will be presented, along with a review of emerging products. Participants will analyze a variety of products and examine advertisers' role in marketing alcoholic beverages to youth to enable understanding of the scope of underage drinking both locally and nationally, examine the role of the environment on underage alcohol use and identify new trends in underage alcohol use. (*9:00–10:30 a.m.)
- Prom/Graduation Safety Tips, Underage Drinking and the Consequences with Lance Corporal Robinson who is the Community Relations Officer with SC Highway Patrol. This presentation is targeted to teens to provide safety tips around this time of prom and graduation celebrations and to discuss underage drinking and the consequences. (*10:35–11:35 a.m.)

Specials for National Safety Month

- Reading, Safety and Internet Safety Minutes May 10, (High School) 11:00–11:04 a.m. and (Middle School) 11:06–11:12 a.m. on channel 1. These NEW segments were part of the LMS Special that aired April 15. Produced with Dutch Fork High School and Gilbert Middle School students by Martha Alweine with ETV, these short segments are provided for high school and middle school students to help them think about their own safety and realize the importance of cyber bullying. (Unlimited rights)
- XPress: Safety for Students Repeats May 10, 11:15 a.m.–12:14 p.m., on channel 1. Designed for middle and high school students, these two programs feature teens that are part of the SC Department of Education's Office of Youth Services Youth Advisory Board. Students join Dr. Glen Walter to talk about important issues that teens deal with every day. These programs focus on cyber safety and mental health issues. (Unlimited rights)
- I'm Safe Repeats May 10, 12:20–12:31 p.m., on channel 1. Designed for grades 1–3, I'm Safe on Wheels is an animated lesson created by Slim Goodbody that helps young children know how to stay safe. (Unlimited broadcast/off-air record use, but no tape duplication)
- Life Skills 101 Repeats May 10, 12:35–1:32 p.m. on channel 1. Designed for grades 2–3, the five lessons, each between 9–11 minutes in duration, emphasize National Health and Education Standards. The lessons help children explore health-supporting life skills such as decision making, goal setting, self management, passing on health information to others, and assessing the health values of products in the media. (Unlimited broadcast/off-air record use, but no tape duplication)
- Safe Student School Scenarios Repeats May 10, 1:40–3:31 p.m. on channel 1. Designed for middle and high school students. Produced by ETV, these short dramatizations are part of the Partnership Training for Law Enforcement and Education recertification course and can be used with students to initiate discussion on various topics, which include whether to tell or not to tell, dealing with prejudice, rumors, and conflict resolution. The month of May is a busy time to plan ahead for college, summer jobs and summer vacation. **ITV** resources can assist in preparing your students for the excitement of this time of year. College preparation...the program and information guide for **Finding Money for College** is available to parents and students through **Career Aisle** on knowitall.org as well as our **ITV** web site http://www.itv.scetv.org/. Guidance counselors and teachers can also locate the program on **StreamlineSC**. Aid categories,

College Experience: Strategies for Success is a series designed for use with students that are looking ahead to college. Keys to success, time management, learning styles, listening and learning in the classroom, making the grade, major and career planning are just a few topics covered in this "ITV By Request" program. Information for this program can be found in the ITV Resource Book page 100. In conjunction with college preparation and career goals, Tools for Financial Success introduces a number of simple tools that anyone can use to improve his or her financial position in preparing for the future. Participants will see the importance of having financial goals and keeping good records. Basic financial tools such as checking accounts, bank accounts and credit are addressed. For upper elementary and middle school students, the Pygg E. Bank Economics series about economic empowerment of youth teaches financial literacy in a fun format. Produced by ITV with ETV working with the Educational Arts Programs of America, Pygg E. Bank Economics encourages the piggy bank theory of saving and managing money.

Preparations for employment can be a daunting task for students. Careers for the 21st Century explores a variety of careers and skills required for the task. The World of Work Series also available on *StreamlineSC* helps students and entry-level employees understand the attitudes and work habits needed for success on the job. Viewers learn the importance of being a team player on the job, see why every job is important, and discover why it is important to ask questions and follow company rules and procedures. Understanding the importance of getting along with co-workers and employers is another aspect of this series. The program examines safety on the job and diversity in the workplace. Other key factors of this series emphasize the importance of behaving responsibly on the job and the possibility of serious legal problems related to substance abuse. This new three-hour recertification course will assist educators in integrating Natural History into the curriculum. Learn about nature with Naturalist Rudy Mancke and see how you can take your students right out the door of your school to learn about the world around them! - 7. Come to the final meeting prepared to present a lesson plan that you created from one of the components of the course.
- 8. Complete Course Evaluation Form at the final meeting.
