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Enhancing Clinical Judgment in Nursing Students

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


Background

- Nurses need to be able to use clinical judgment in the clinical environment
- National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) created the Clinical Judgment Measurement Model (CJMM) to assess clinical judgment in nursing students

Purpose

The project utilized the CJMM to redesign clinical paperwork to help evaluate clinical judgment in real-life experiences and to improve the student experience




Enhancing Clinical Judgment in **Nursing Students**

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Methods

Senior level students completing their third adult health clinical completed the redesigned paperwork Students were asked to complete a brief electronic survey to ask them about their clinical experience with the redesigned paperwork Results





Conclusions/Reflective Critique Students do feel that the redesigned paperwork improved their critical thinking and helped to prepare them for entry to practice Faculty perception should be measured for a more broad review of the paperwork There needs to be standardization of faculty grading/expectations
