Konrad of Brundelsheim († 11 Nov 1321?)

1. Name variants: –

2. Places: Heilsbronn, Prosselsheim

3. Biography: K. was presumably born in Prosselsheim (Lower Franconia). He served as abbot of Heilsbronn (Middle Franconia) between 1303 and 1306 and again from 1317 until 1321. The reason for the interruption remains unknown. His last written trace is dated in a document dated 11 Nov 1321; presumably he died shortly thereafter. Earlier scholarship wrongly identified him as Soccus, the author of several sermons, and/or as the 'Monk of Heilsbronn', an unidentified Franconian author, probably from the monastery Heilsbronn. instruction for novices (*De modo proficiendi in religione*).
