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Lonsdale R.I.

April 24, 1866.

Friend Cameron,

I think it is about time that you wrote to a fellow, what are you doing all this time? why don't you come down and see me - body, if I had been working as long as you have I would not mind coming to see a "feller" once in a while.

I have forgotten whether I wrote to you that I am working at this place; I have been here six weeks, I have charge of 16 thousand Spindles finer rate place to work.

Colorado some time ago
and I have ^{not} seen anybody

there.

I saw a lady at Bassett-
ton just before I came
home, that wore a dress
which was very short
in front, you may draw
