It continues to the present day as a premier open-access, peer-refereed, double-blind journal. It is indexed on ESCI and will appear on SCOPUS later this year.

Applicants should have a doctorate in Second or Foreign Language Learning, Applied Linguistics, or related fields, and research and publications in second and foreign language reading. Applicants should be comfortable with multiple research traditions and working within multiple stages of the publication process, including blind review, reviewer assignment, editing for content, copy editing, and working with Microsoft Word, Adobe Acrobat, and APA Format. The journal currently utilizes an online editorial management system (Open Journal Systems).
