## Specifications for rebuilding Avenue, Court-Yard and Walks from Mc Cusker Bros. to Ogden Goelet

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## SPECIFICATIONS

For re-building present Front Avenue, Court-yard, Back Avenue, and Walks at the sides of avenues, on the estate of Mr. Ogden Goelet, at Newport, R. I., under the Superintendence of Ernest W. Bowditch, Engineer:

Avenue, Court-Yard, and Walks.

From the present Avenue, Court-Yard, and Walks, take off the present inferior material to the necessary depths, to be decided by the Engineer-in-charge, and cart it to the Kitchen Garden; then replace this material with a proper amount of the best Broken Stone of assorted sizes, to bring the avenues &c. to their proper grade, the stone being no larger than can pass through a one (1) inch ring; the top to be finished with not more than one (1) inch of Crusher Dust:

The entire avenues and Walks are to be thoroughly wetted down and rolled with a two ton (4000 lbs.) roller, or a Clay Puddle Roller of similar weight, until perfectly hard and of perfect shape.

The Contractor is to give his personal attention and direction to the work; he is to furnish all materials, labor, teams, tools, and utensils necessary for completing the work. The contractor is not to sub-let the work or any portion of it under any consideration without written permission from the Engineer:

Upon its completion, the entire work will be measured up by the Engineer-in-charge, upon the
