The UMass CTSA Grant

- UMass CCTS Community Engagement & Research Section Pilot/Feasibility Grants Program:
 - ➤ These awards focus on community engaged research, defined as "the process of working collaboratively with and through groups of people affiliated by geographic proximity, special interest, or similar situations to address issues affecting well-being of those people (CDC, 1997).
 - Awards can be proposed by faculty from any UMass campus working in partnership with any community organization in the area of translational research related to the improvement of health in real world communities.
 - Intent is for these initiatives to provide a basis for the development of applications to NIH and other funding agencies to carry out larger, more comprehensive studies.

- UMass CCTS Community Engagement & Research Section Pilot/Feasibility Grants Program:
 - > The Research can include:
 - Assessment of new methodologies
 - Observational studies
 - Needs assessments
 - Pilot/feasibility studies that use qualitative and/ or quantitative data or
 - Initiatives that are spin-offs of existing larger research initiatives if the additional funding addresses unique study aims
