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The MHARN

The Mental Health Agency Research Network (MHARN) is a developing network for sharing knowledge and research collaboration between the UMMS Dept. of Psychiatry and other academics, DMH personnel, community providers, consumers and family members. Its mission is to close the gap between science and service in mental health services in Massachusetts by improving implementation of evidence based practices to benefit consumers.

The MHARN provides a structure and mechanism for the Center for Mental Health Services Research (CMHSR) to better engage with DMH staff and community agencies around the state. As experience and research on science-to-service has demonstrated that dissemination of information about research findings is not sufficient to bring about changes in practice and benefits to consumers, the MHARN will incorporate principles and practices of the emerging science of implementation research.

MHARN Goals

- Increase awareness about evidence based practices and programs
- Improve translation of knowledge about evidence based practices into changes in practitioner behavior and benefits to consumers
- Improve the relevance of research to DMH, providers, consumers and families by conducting research in DMH/ community settings

MHARN Objectives

- Disseminate information about evidence based practices and DMH system priorities
- Engage academics, DMH and agency providers, and consumers in a dialogue about research & evaluation
- Use technical assistance and organizational change strategies to assist with implementing evidence based practices
- Increase collaboration, communication, and training Partner with DMH and community agencies in grant writing and conducting research in practice settings


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

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The agency indicates an interest in serving as a research site and/ or participating in developing a particular research project but

does not have the infrastructure to implement a complex study. Agencies in this tier may participate in surveys and other noninterventional research. Staff members may begin to train as participants in the planning and implementation of the research so as to move to third tier participation.

A broad, statewide representation of providers. Individual providers and/or provider agencies may express interest in receiving general research information or information on a particular topic. As the providers and provider agencies learn more about CMHSR's work, they may choose to participate in a problem solving session hosted by the MHARN.
