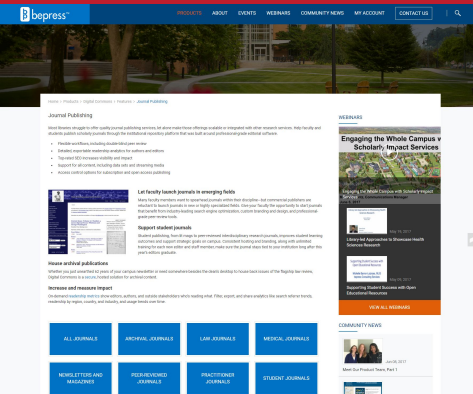
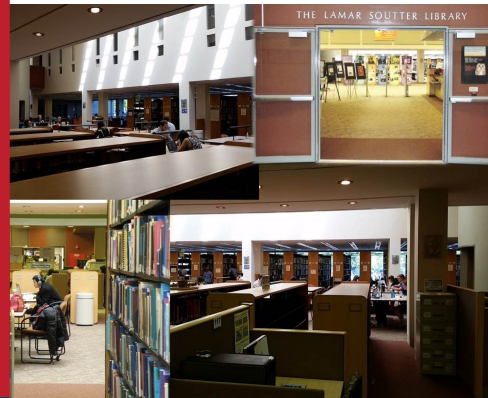

- ◉ **“e-Science”** What in the world does this mean?

 - Data/data sets then captured, transported, stored, organized, accessed, mined, visualized, and interpreted

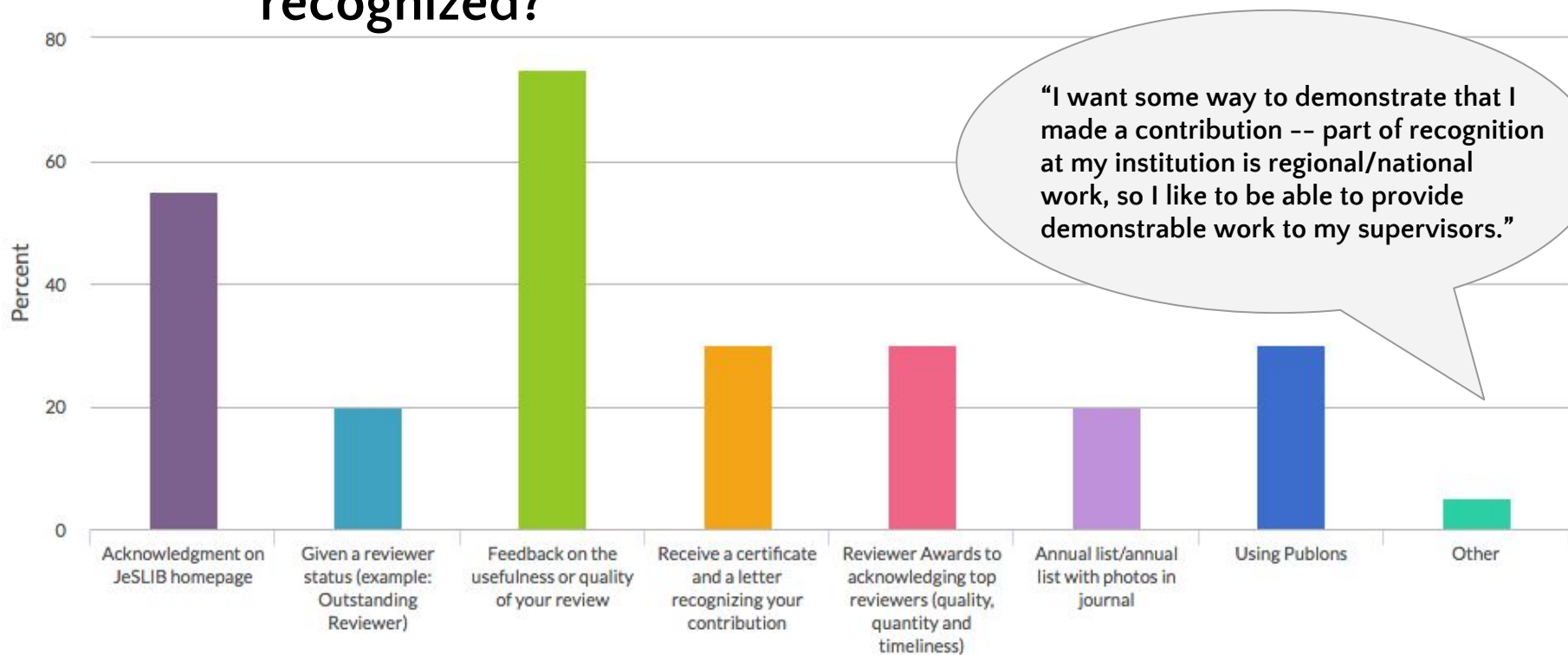
